Be a Family Child Care Provider

Army Policy: If you provide more than ten hours of on-post childcare a week and have not been certified as a Family Child Care Provider, you may be in violation of your Housing Lease Agreement and could be jeopardizing the safety and well-being of children.

Contact Child and Youth Services to start the certification process to become a Family Child Care Provider.







Weapons Safety & Storage of Privately Owned Firearms:

Policy Memorandum USAG-HI 16, Possession of Privately Owned Firearms on U.S. Army Garrison, Hawaii

- All carried or transported Privately Owned Firearms will be <u>unloaded</u> with the <u>magazine or clip removed</u>, <u>breech opened</u>, and <u>placed in its own case or enclosed container</u>.
- Occupants of Island Palm Communities quarters will secure all firearms in locked containers, cabinets, on racks, or with a locked metal bar or lock that passes through the breech or in a manner that blocks or immobilizes the trigger.
- Firearms <u>must be unloaded at all times inside quarters</u>. Occupants will <u>maintain the keys to the locking devices in the custody of an adult</u> or ensure storage in a secured location out of the reach of children. Occupants will <u>lock all ammunition in a separate secured container</u>.

Ocean Swimming Safety

- If in doubt, don't go out
 - If you aren't sure of the conditions, don't go out into the water
- Don't swim in isolated areas
- Check for posted safety signs:
- Do not over-estimate your swimming capability. Doubt on safe side!
- Swim at beaches with Lifeguards:
 - Of the 33 beaches on Oahu, 29 Lifeguards
- Avoid swimming at night, dawn and dusk:
 - When sharks tend to be more active and aggressive
 - Do not swim when consuming alcohol.
- Box Jelly Fish arrive near Oahu shores approximately 7-11 days after a full moon

















Summer Safety

It's always summer in Hawaii!

- The sun is more intense here
 - Use sunscreen of at least SPF 15
 - Reapply frequently, remembering the ears, scalp and back of neck





UV Index Number	Exposure Level	Actions to Take
3, 4, 5 (<45 mins skin damage)	Moderate	Apply SPF 15 sunscreen; wear a hat
6, 7 (<30 mins)	High	Apply SPF 15 sunscreen; wear a hat
8, 9, 10 (<15 mins)	Very High	Apply SPF 15 to 30 sunscreen; wear a hat and sunglasses
11 or higher (<10 mins)	Extreme	Apply SPF 30 sunscreen; wear a hat, sunglasses, and protective clothing

- Hydrate, hydrate, hydrate!
 - Don't mistake soda, coffee or tea (or alcohol) for proper hydration






