
Solomon Elementary School Student Drop Off / Pick Up Procedures 211 Carpenter Street

Subj: TEMPORARY LODGING ALLOWANCE IN HAWAII

Ref: (a) Joint Federal Travel Regulations, Chapter 9, Part C

1. Purpose. To provide guidance and assign responsibility for support, control and administration of Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA) for military Service members in Hawaii.

2. Supersedes USPACOMINST 0614.5, 8 Apr 09.

3. Applicability. This instruction applies to Headquarters U.S. Pacific Command (USPACOM), Pacific Air Forces (PACAF), U.S. Pacific Fleet (PACFLT), U.S. Army Pacific (USARPAC), U.S. Marine Corps Forces Pacific (MARFORPAC), Special Operations Command Pacific (SOCFAC), Joint Interagency Task Force West (JIATF-West), Joint Intelligence Operations Center (JIOC), Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command (JPAC), Asia Pacific Center for Security Studies (APCSS), and Center for Excellence (CFE).

4. Background. Reference (a) authorizes TLA to partially pay members for more than normal expenses incurred by a member/dependent while occupying temporary lodging outside the continental U.S. (OCONUS). Service members usually receive TLA:

a. Upon initial arrival at (reporting to) permanent duty station (PDS) in Hawaii, pending assignment of Government quarters or while completing arrangements for other private sector housing, including Government privatized housing, when Government quarters are not available.

b. Immediately after vacating Government quarters or other permanent living accommodations to execute Permanent Change of Station (PCS).

c. When members must vacate permanent quarters for reasons beyond their control, either permanently or temporarily.

SUBJECT: Policy Memorandum USAG-HI-19, Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA)

1. References.

a. Joint Travel Regulations (JTR), Par. 0903, Temporary Lodging Allowance 1 Sep 17.

b. Army Regulation 420-1, Facilities Engineering, Army Facilities Management, 12 Feb 08, with Rapid Action Revision (RAR) issued 24 Aug 12.

c. USPACOM Instruction 0614.5, J102, subj: Temporary Lodging Allowance in Hawaii, 08 Nov 13.

d. Hotel and Motel Fire Safety Act of 1990, (Public Law No. 101-391, 25 Sep 90, as amended by PL No. 105-85, 18 Nov 97).

2. Applicability. This policy applies to all permanent party Army personnel assigned to duty in Hawaii who are eligible for TLA in accordance with references 1a and b.

3. Policy. The purpose of TLA is to partially reimburse an individual for more than normal expenses incurred during occupancy of temporary lodging. TLA may be authorized when the TLA authority determines it is mandatory that a Soldier and/or dependents occupy temporary lodging at personal expense. (NOTE: The Soldier is still receiving Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) in conjunction with TLA).

4. Definitions.

a. Arrival TLA – Authorized for up to 30 days from the date of the Soldier's sign-in to Permanent Duty Station (PDS) and not to exceed 60 days. (See Encl 1. for details.)

b. Departure TLA – Authorized up to 10 days prior to the leave date on the Department of Army Form 31 and commences no sooner than pick-up date of household goods. If the Soldier is not taking leave, the AVAL date will be used.

c. Interim TLA – Authorized during pre-deployment (10 days) and redeployment (30 days) with orders.



Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA)

- TLA Rates increased effective 1 July 2019. Per diem rates for Oahu increased which effects TLA
 - Lodging remained \$177.00 (Married Rate)
 - Meals and incidental expense (M&IE) increased to \$149.00 (Married Rate)
 - Number of dependents determines authorizations
- TLA approved hotels
 - JTR – Required to maintain an up-to-date list of approved, regularly inspected temporary lodging.
 - INDO-PACOM – Ensure Temporary Lodging reimbursements are limited to only TLA approved hotels in Oahu, or are properly registered by the State of Hawaii to operate as Hotel/Transient Accommodations.



Drug Awareness

- In a recent survey, Hawaii ranked fourth in the nation for high school students who were offered, sold, or given an illegal drug by someone on school property (31.7% of students).
- Almost half (49%) of the students aged 13 and under who spend over 30 minutes a day on social networking sites saw pictures of other kids on the social networking site drunk, passed out, or using drugs.
- Juveniles and young adults make up the majority of CID Drug Investigations.


Back-to-School Safety

- **Bike Safety.** Helmets are required at all times when riding a bicycle in USAG-HI. Additionally, bikes must be equipped with reflective equipment on wheels or tires and use a front lamp in hours of low visibility. Riders are reminded to follow all traffic laws.
- **Military Police Bike Patrol** is also a part of the school orientation days which allows children to meet and ask questions of the Police Officers that will be working the school zones.
- **Child Supervision.** Children under the age of 10 cannot be left unsupervised at bus stops, public facilities, residences, in vehicles or recreational areas, and cannot walk to and from school or bus stops alone.

School Safety

The safety of children throughout our communities is our top priority. Schofield Barracks and Fort Shafter Provost Marshal Offices have started initiatives to ensure the safety of children by increasing patrols at key school bus stops during peak times. Presence patrols also monitor child well being and supervision.






