

Authorized Child Care

Parents: Register your children through Parent Central Services, to ensure your provider is certified. If in doubt, call your local Child and Youth Services office. Report violations to Child and Youth Services immediately.

Call or Visit CYS Parent Central Services to Get More Information on Your Eligibility for Fee Assistance When Installation Child Care Services are not Available.



Unauthorized Child Care



If you provide more than 10 hours of on-post child care a week and have not been certified as a Family Child Care Provider, your sponsor (military member) and you can be penalized.

- Military members who knowingly allow unauthorized child care in their quarters may be subject to discipline under the UCMJ or adverse administrative action under U.S. Army Hawaii Regulation 1.
- Offenses could result in debarment (losing installation access and privileges) from U.S. Army Hawaii military installations.
- Major Violations of the Resident Occupancy Agreement or the "Island Palm Communities Resident Guide & Community Standards Handbook" of a serious nature may result in immediate eviction.

Garrison Policy Memo 13 - Animal Control

Purpose. To establish local policy and procedures governing possession and control of domestic animals and to provide for the safety-and welfare of all individuals on USAG-HI installations.

- Prohibits aggressive dogs and aggressive breeds.
- Cats and dogs must be microchipped.
- Exotic, wild, or farm species, including ferrets, snakes, pot-bellied pigs, goats, sheep, chickens, and ducks are not authorized.
- Prohibits providing food, water or shelter to stray or feral animals.
- Individuals will not tamper with, damage, or otherwise destroy any traps set out for stray, feral, or wild animal control, nor release any stray, feral, or wild animal that has been captured.
- The policy applies throughout USAG-HI installations including Housing







<u>Safety</u>

- Helmets are required at all times when riding a bicycle, scooter, skateboard or in-line skates on USAG-HI installations. Helmets should be sized properly and buckled while using bikes, scooters, skateboards and skates.
- The use of headphones is prohibited while walking, jogging, skating, skateboarding, scootering, bicycling or while riding a motorcycle while on USAG-HI installations, regardless of uniform or Military/Dependent status.
- Skateboards, scooters, roller and in-line skates are prohibited as follows:
 - On any road with a speed limit of 20 MPH or greater.
 - Inside public buildings or under lanais and walkways of public buildings.
 - In or on drainage ditches.
 - Upon any roadway portion or other place designated as a "No Skateboarding" zone.
 - On roadways between sunset and sunrise.
 - In PX and Commissary parking lots during business hours.
 - In the parking garage, sidewalk and all roadways at Fort DeRussy.

New Trimble Traffic Pattern

- Due to the new traffic pattern, Soldiers conducting PT, as well as parents and children walking to school, should follow the direction of MPs at the intersection of Trimble and Cadet Sheridan roads. Failure to follow direction could lead to injury and/or delays in commute times.

Get A Kit

- Water: 1 gallon/person/day for 14 days
- Food: Non-perishable, readyto-eat items for 14 days
- Blankets and change of clothes
- □ Flashlight, batteries, and first aid kit
- Personal hygiene items
- Reusable plastic plates, cups, and eating utensils

- Make sure your emergency kit also includes items specific to your special needs, for example:
 - Eyeglasses
 - Medications
 - □Infant formula/diapers
 - Food and extra water for pets/service animals
- Additional Items to consider:
 Important family documents in a waterproof container
 Cash, change or traveler's checks
 - Local maps



Make A Plan

Making a plan is simple... just think of the 5 Ws!

- <u>Who</u>: Gather input from all family members
- <u>What</u>: Plan for all hazards that could effect your family
- <u>Where</u>: Establish plans for evacuation and meeting places
- <u>When</u>: Review plan annually or as major changes occur
- <u>Why</u>: Having a plan will enable your family to respond to an emergency more quickly

Making an emergency plan is just the first step; you must practice and adjust it to meet your current needs.



Be Informed

The following are the methods used to warn of an impending danger due to an emergency:

- □ Mass Notification/Giant Voice Warning System
- AtHoc Telephonic Alerts
- □ Hawaii State Siren and Emergency Alert System
- TV/Radio Broadcasts
- □ Island Palm Communities Call Max System



Chapel History

The Queen Liliuokalani Chapel, as it was affectionately known, was constructed in 1913, and it was a gift to the Army from the last reigning monarch, Queen Liliuokalani. The chapel is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is part of the historic district at Schofield Barracks.

Soldiers Chapel was originally located in Castner Village in the "Upper Post" area of Schofield Barracks, near the Waianae Mountains.

In 1920, another chapel was merged with the entrance of the original Soldiers Chapel to create a larger church that could accommodate more congregants. It was moved to its current location, near D Quad, in 1925.





Membership FEES: \$100 per month for a two stall barn with tack/feed room.




