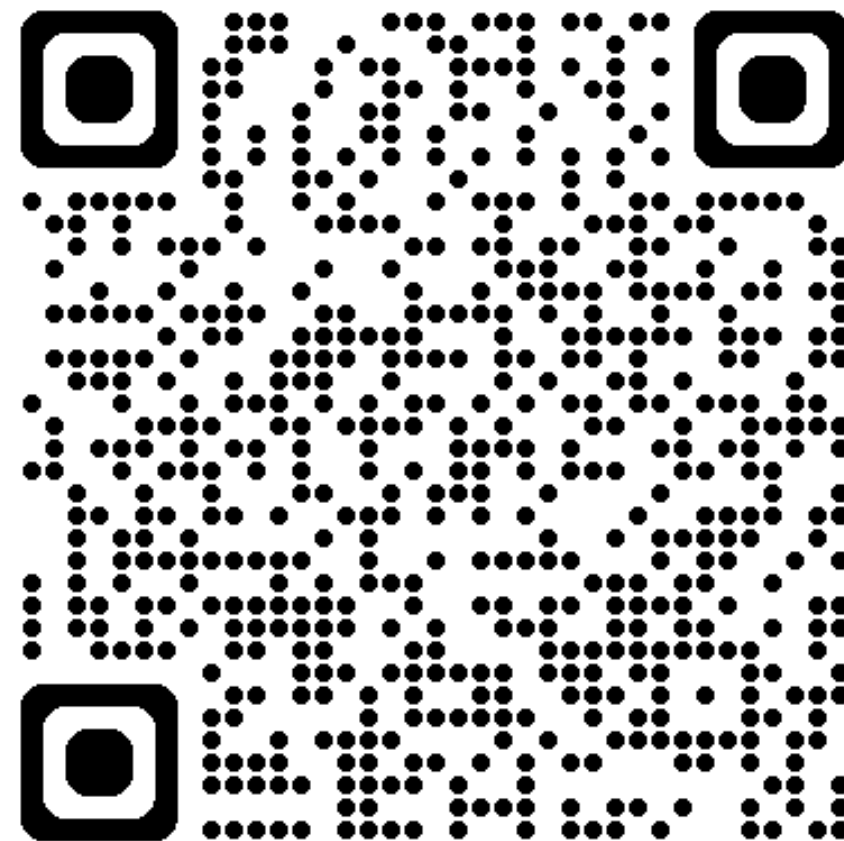

Directorate of Public Works (DPW) Feral Animals on Installations

- USAG Hawaii **Policy Memo #13** governs Animal Control on installations
- **Providing food, water, or shelter to stray, feral, or wild animals is prohibited** (unless part of a USAG Hawaii authorized mission)
- Tampering with/damaging exclusion measures designed to keep cats and other pests from entering buildings and structures is prohibited
- DPW or an appropriately licensed Federal, State, or private contractor is responsible to capture and trap stray, feral, and wild animals

Holiday Weekend Safety Tips

❖ Beach day

- Wear sunscreen
- Check with lifeguards on ocean conditions
- Child supervision
- Keep hydrated

❖ Barbeques (BBQ)

- Keep children and pets away from barbeque and prep areas
- Keep BBQs away from combustibles
- Fire extinguisher should be within 10 feet

❖ Driving Under Influence (DUI)

- Legal Limit .08% in the State of Hawaii. However, a person can still get a DUI if a police officer observes any signs of impairment
- Required to complete the SR-22 program
- Use a designated driver, taxi, UBER or plan to stay the night

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

U.S. Department of Defense ID (**Common Access Card (CAC)**), Family member CAC, Retiree CAC, Reserve CAC, National Guard CAC, Gold Star Family Member, etc.), Foreign Visitor Request (FVR) approved by the Garrison Commander and/or approved Automated Installation Entry pass.

Visitors accompanied by a CAC card holder are required to present one of the following as acceptable identification:

Real ID Driver's License.

Real ID possesses 1 of any 3 distinctive markings:

☐ A star and/or star in a circle



☐ A US Flag



☐ Text reading “Enhanced” or “Enhanced Driver’s License”

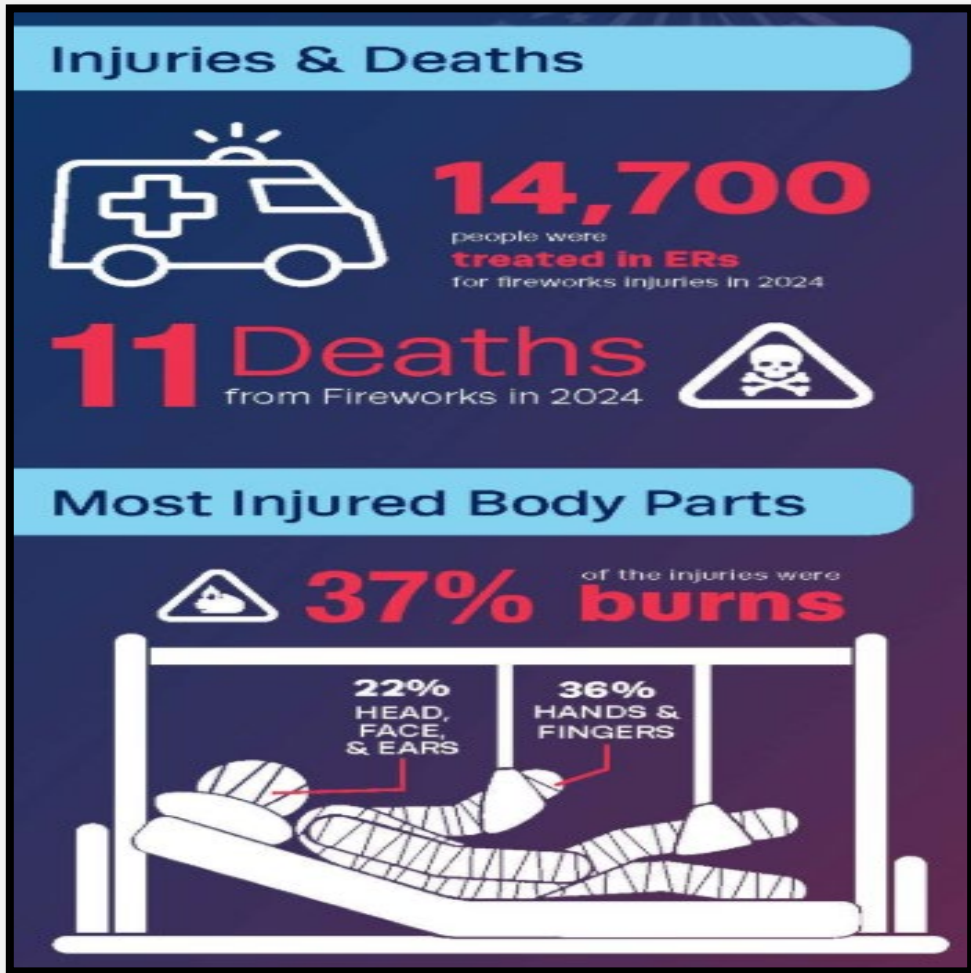

June 2025

The Schofield Barracks Ground Wildland Firefighters along with Navy FedFire, Honolulu Fire Department and the Department of Forestry, in concert with Oahu's Air-1 bird and 25th Combat Aviation's own UH60 and CH47 birds, battled a 600-acre range fire for more than two weeks.

- ☐ Approximately 1.8 million gallons

Army Recycling Center does not accept Bulk Waste (furniture, mattresses, trash)

Illegal dumping issues (furniture, mattresses)?

Contact DPW Services Contract Branch, Leonard Webster, 808-864-0932 for non-recurring (temporary) dumpster rental (*GPC card required/rental fee charged*)

DOD Furniture and equipment must be turned in through Supply (SSA)

Island Palm Communities (Residents):

- Curbside bulk pick-up service
- Place bulk items curbside, not earlier than 5 p.m. the evening prior to scheduled trash pick-up day.

Dumping of bulk waste at unauthorized locations is a punishable offense (UCMJ Articles 92).

- Violators are subject to citations by MPs

- Service members should have PCS Orders on hand IOT be assisted
- Service members Retiring, ETS, or first time moving. Encourage in person brief.
- Pet Travel ETP for third party pet moving services.
- Patriot Express schedule release time.

❑ What will be the average customer wait-time for HHG movement?

- FY24, longest wait times was 7 ½ weeks for HHG pack up/pick up
- FY25, current wait times is 4 ½ weeks for HHG pack up/pick up.

❑ SATO Office

- Priority given to PCS, ETS & Emergency leave for servicemembers and their families.
- TDY processing should be done in DTS as much as possible or calling the helpdesk @ [888-435-7146](tel:888-435-7146).

❑ ITO Ask

- Customer patience.
- Treat PPPO staff with dignity and respect.
- HHG pickup is scheduled by the Joint Personnel Property Shipping Office (JPPSO) not PPPO staff.
