

The primary responsibility for conducting Community Information Exchange meetings rests with the garrison commander and staff to develop the agenda of installation-wide and community-wide topics of interest and concern.

The garrison commander and/or the U.S. Army Hawaii senior commander attends and supports the meetings, along with garrison subject-matter experts and directors.

Family Child Care Certification Requirement

The requirement for Family Child Care homes and providers to be certified is not just a Department of Defense or Department of Army requirement!

Family child care homes in Hawaii (off of military installations) are regulated under

Hawaii Administrative Rules, Title 17

If your childcare provider is located off the installation you should still ensure that they are a certified child care home! <u>https://humanservices.hawaii.gov/bessd/child-care-program/child-care-licensing/finding-a-child-care-provider-or-program/</u>



The ten child care hour limit identified in Army Regulation 608-10 is a baseline for regulatory oversight frequently used by state, county, and other comparable licensing agencies.

The Department of Army only oversees child care on Army installations.

You can ensure that your child is in a certified Army home by always:

Registering on militarychildcare.com

- > Getting your child care referral from Parent Central Services
- > Looking for the U.S. Army Family Child Care decal at your care provider's home



Ten Hour Rule – You Can Still Be Neighborly

It's okay to be neighborly and the "ten hour rule" does not eliminate "good neighbor" favors!

Examples of <u>occasional</u> care that does <u>not</u> occur on a <u>regular basis</u>. Regular basis means <u>routinely</u> for an <u>extended period of time</u>.

- You can host a sleepover in your home with your children's friends.
- You can care for your neighbors children in your home overnight as a favor while they enjoy a weekend get-away.
- You can care your friend's children while they attend an appointment.
- You can be on a Family Care Plan for a friend or family member and provide care for their children when they are called away for weekend training or temporary duty.

Unauthorized child care settings do not apply to care being provided to your children in your own home.

- With school back in session, increased patrol activity has led to an increased number of speeding violations (47–Jun / 93–Aug).





Alert Mass Notification System Migration Update

- The AtHoc Mass Warning Notification System (MWNS) was replaced with a new MNWS called Alert! effective 13 Sep 2019.
- Alert! is a centrally funded by HQDA DCS, G-3/5/7, Installation Preparedness Program. TACOM is the proponent to operate the system. TACOM provides training and gives access to the system.
- Clients with EDIPI/CAC registered in AtHoc have migrated over into Alert! as long as they had a complete
 registration in AtHoc.
 - Personnel without a proper registration will be prompted to self-register. Instructions will automatically be provided for the self-registration by the system..
- Alert! operator training was conducted onsite during the migration week. Additional operator training is conducted weekly online by TACOM.
 - An operator account requires a DD Form 2875 (SAAR), submitted through the USAG-Hawaii Emergency Manager





Alert Mass Notification System Migration Update

- Alert system will notify registered personnel in several ways: Pop-up message on their workstation computer; voicemail on their work, home/cell phone; email and text message.
 - Phone notifications will be sent from: 703-454-0563/703-805-0000
 - You will receive 3 phone calls if you do not respond to the message by choosing one of the options provided.
 - Text notifications will be sent from: 246-39.
 - Pop up window for registration reminder & update registration reminders will be on the bottom right of screen.
 - After 72 hours, a slightly bigger registration reminder will appear and remain on the screen until proper registration is complete.
- DoDi 6055.17, DoD Emergency Management Program, February 13, 2017, states that All DoD military and civilian personnel and contract support personnel whose normal place of duty is on a DoD installation or within a DoD facility must ensure that their personal contact information, (including afterduty hours contact information, personal cellular phone numbers, landline phone numbers, e-mail addresses, home address, etc...,) is entered into the system and regularly updated or verified every 90 days to remain current and accurate.
- The Installation Operations Center (IOC) will continue to push notifications as necessary. For any questions, contact the 24/7 help desk at **866-515-0551**.
