
Cleaning of the library will be broken into 3 phases.





Before Signing a Lease

- What are the Resident Responsibilities to include maintenance and lawn care?
- What is the landlord area of responsibility for maintaining the rental property?
- What is the maintenance turn around time?
- How do I report a maintenance issue?
- Where and how must the rent be paid?
- Is there a rent grace period?
- What are the move in costs?
- When and how can the landlord enter the property?
- Is there a time limit for guest visitation?
- Is this a smoke free home?
- Is there a pet fee, pet weight limitation or limited number of pets?
- How much notice is required to terminate the lease? Can I give notice any day of the month?
- Is the military clause included in the lease?
- Is my application and deposit refundable should I decide not to rent the property?





On-Post Dress Code

-Clean, properly fitted and well maintained clothing should be worn for a neat and orderly appearance. -Shirts should provide conservative, complete coverage.

-Shorts and skirts should be of conservative length.

-Headgear should be worn appropriately, with bill to the front of the head and removed indoors. -Recreation Areas: Athletic clothing and swimwear are only allowed in recreation areas.





-Wear no clothing that is excessively brief, short, revealing or tight, or excessively baggy or loose; -Torn, ragged or dirty items;

- -Contains obscene, discriminating, offensive or suggestive images or words;
- -ls nightwear or sleepwear;
- -Presents a paramilitary appearance or looks like a weapon;
- -Is not specifically designed as headgear (such as bandannas, do-rags); and
- -Is underwear as outerwear or is clearly visible, but should not be (like sports bra, boxers).





Failure to meet USAG Hawaii Policy 31, "Standards of Dress and Prohibited Attire for Army Installations in Hawaii," will result in denied access to that service, area, activity or event.






