

Housing Inspections, warm calls and follow up

✓ Home Inspections – Since March of 2019 the Housing Office conducted 2,874 Between Occupancy Maintenance Inspections to ensure Families move into clean, safe and habitable homes.

✓ Conduct warm calls:

- 100% of emergency work orders
- 5% for other work orders to garner resident feedback and ensure satisfaction.

✓ Follow up:

- Army Housing Office Responds to 100% of calls received at our office until resolved.
- ICE Comments Monitor ICE comments and engage when resolution appears to be unsatisfactory or Command directed.
- Ask the Commander Action all as directed by the Commander
- Command Hotline Contact each resident and follow through to resolution/completion of the issue.
- Displaced Families Contact each Family and monitor daily until the Family returns home.

Alternate Ways to Dispose of Unwanted Vehicles

- Donate your vehicle (charitable, tax-deduction, most charities will pick up the vehicle)
- Use the USAG-HI Privately Owned Vehicle (POV) Resale Lot



Proper Procedures to Sell Your Vehicle

- In the State of Hawaii, vehicle owners must complete and submit a Notice of Transfer form when selling to a Private Party within 10 days of the transfer or sale.
- If you sell your car but do not file a completed **Notice of Transfer** with the Motor Vehicle, Licensing & Permits Division, you may be held financially responsible for fees, fines, and even accidents that occur after the sale.

Access Control Procedures

 All vehicles and pedestrians are subject to search upon entering USAG-HI Installations based on the current Force Protection Condition (FPCON) and security measures



- All personnel entering Army installations are required to have Identification Cards scanned by handheld scanner
- Applies to Personally Owned Vehicles (POV) as well as Government Owned Vehicles (GOV)
- Guards scan school bus driver's identification card and perform cursory walk through of the bus

Catalytic Converters

Recently, there has been an uptick in larceny of private property cases in the community. Catalytic Converters are being removed from vehicles in the Schofield Barracks and Wheeler Army Airfield Communities. The Schofield Barracks Military Police are working diligently to prevent future occurrences. Additionally, there are steps you can take to prevent this from happening to your vehicle.

- When going on leave or vacation, relocate your vehicle to a high visibility area. Most cases have occurred in low-lit areas with low foot traffic.
- Have a friend or family member occasionally check your vehicle when you are not able to.
- Residents are encouraged to report this crime to the Military Police if you become a victim.
- Report any signs of suspicious activity to the Schofield Barracks Military Police at (808) 655-5555.



Crimes of Opportunity

- Catalytic Converters can be removed from almost any vehicle in less than 1 minute using a saw or power tool.
- Vehicles that have a higher ground clearance, such as an SUV or Truck, are at higher risk.
- Catalytic Converters are stolen for the precious metals located inside of the part. The stolen converters are sold to local scrapyards.

SPOUSE REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

State Licensure and Certification Costs for the Spouse of a Soldier Arising From a Permanent Change of Station. Effective Date: The policy found in Army Dir 2019-18 is effective retroactively to the date of the NDAA 2018 (12 Dec. 2017)

- Eligibility
 - U.S. Regular Army, Army National Guard and Army Reserve Soldiers whose spouse require a State relicensing or recertification to continue their profession in a new place of residence pursuant to the PCS or permanent change of assignment of a sponsor from one State to another State
 - The Soldier is reassigned, either as a PCS or Permanent Change of Assignment, from a duty station in one state to a duty station in another state
 - The movement of the Soldier's dependents is authorized at the expense of the United States as part of reassignment
 - Qualified Relicensing Cost Term "Qualified relicensing cost" means cost, including examination and registration fees, that are imposed by the state of the new duty station to secure a license or certification to engage in same profession the Soldier's spouse engaged in while in the state of the original duty station and are paid or incurred by the Soldier or spouse to secure the license or certification from the state of the new duty station after the date on which the orders directing the reassignment are issued.





SPOUSE REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

- How do Soldiers apply for reimbursement? By visiting their unit S-1 and providing at a minimum, the following support documents
 - Standard Form (SF) 1034
 - Copy of previous and current Permanent Change of Station orders
 - Copy of Spouse's previous state license and/or certification (<u>MUST BE FROM</u> <u>SOLDIER'S PREVIOUS PERMANENT DUTY STATIONS</u>)
 - Copy of New State license and/or certification
 - Proof of fees paid for relicensing and/or recertification from current PDS
 - Copy of marriage certificate

Reimbursement

- The lesser amount between fee paid and the maximum reimbursement amount of \$500. This is a one time reimbursement in connection with each reassignment.
- This is taxable income. DFAS will issue a separate W-2 during tax season and will be available on the Soldier's MyPay account

Army Emergency Relief: Spouse Re-Licensing & Re-Certification Program

- ✓ Intent: To relieve distress, promote resiliency and overall financial readiness/well-being of Army Families by providing assistance to spouses
- Eligibility: Spouses of Regular Army and Army National Guard / U.S. Army Reserve Soldiers on Title 10 Active Guard Reserve (AGR) tours who are enrolled in DEERS as a dependent
- ✓ The Spouse must already be licensed or certified in a career field from the Soldier's previous duty station to be eligible for assistance under this category
- ✓ Forms of Assistance: Loan, Grant, or combination of both
- ✓ AER assistance may be provided for re-licensing or re-certification fees that <u>exceed the \$500</u> <u>Army reimbursement cap</u> up to a maximum of \$2500. The request for assistance WILL BE submitted prior to submission of the SF Form (SF) 1034, Public Voucher for Purchases and Services Other Than Personal and/or prior to paying the re-licensing or re-certification fees.
- ✓ Spouse has up to 180 days after arrival at the new duty station to apply for AER assistance
- ✓ AER assistance under this category of assistance is "needs based" and WILL NOT be provided after the re-licensing or re-certification fees have already been paid. AER WILL NOT reimburse for these fees

Army Emergency Relief: CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE Program

Effective 1 Feb. 2020

- ✓ Intent: To provide assistance and relieve distress on Soldiers and Families for "out-of-pocket" child care expenses that exceed the Army Fee Assistance cap up to \$500 per family for 90 days (3 consecutive months) after a Permanent Change of Station (PCS)
- ✓ Eligibility: Active Duty Army and Active Guard Reserve (AGR) Soldiers with Permanent Change of Station (PCS). Army National Guard and U.S. Army Reserve Soldiers on Title 10 orders for activation or CO-ADOS orders ARE NOT eligible for this program. Activation and CO-ADOS orders ARE NOT considered PCS orders
- ✓ The first AER assistance request MUST BE submitted within the first 120 days after the Family with dependent children have arrived at the new duty station
- ✓ Assistance will ONLY be considered for a "valid financial need" for up to \$500 per month, per Family, regardless of the number of children enrolled
- ✓ Soldiers will return to the AER Section every 30 days for three consecutive months to validate that the need still exists. Lump sum assistance for 90 days WILL NOT be considered
- ✓ Forms of Assistance: Loan, Grant, or combination of both
- ✓ Program available 1 Feb. 2020

Public Health Advisory: Coronavirus

CDC Recommendations

CDC issued a <u>Health Alert Network (HAN) update</u> with the following recommendations for healthcare providers:

- Obtain a detailed travel history for patients being evaluated for fever and acute respiratory illness.
- Identify patients under investigation (PUIs), including those with 1) fever, 2) symptoms of lower respiratory illness, and 3) travel history to Wuhan City, China, within the 14 days prior to symptom onset.
- Ask PUIs to wear a surgical mask as soon as they are identified and finish the evaluation in a private room with the door closed, ideally in an airborne infection isolation room if available.
- Use standard precautions, contact precautions, airborne precautions, and eye protection.
- Immediately notify your healthcare facility's infection control personnel in the event of a PUI for 2019nCoV (in military treatment facilities (MTFs), also notify the installation's preventive medicine or public health department which will, in turn, notify the state or local health department for inclusion in CDC's <u>National Notifiable Disease Surveillance System</u>).
- All MTF-level PUIs are to be reported by the local public health authority via the Disease Reporting System internet (DRSi) coordinating with the Service-specific Public Health Center or equivalent.
- At this time, diagnostic testing for 2019-nCoV can be conducted only at CDC. State and local health departments can facilitate specimen processing and testing at CDC.
- The HAN update includes additional information on diagnostic testing, specimen collection, and criteria for PUIs.





CSEC refers to a range of crimes of a sexual nature committed against children and adolescents, including:

- Exploiting a minor through prostitution / escort services;
- exploiting a minor through survival sex (exchanging sex/sexual acts for money or something of value [e.g., shelter, food, drugs]);
- using a minor in pornography;
- exploiting a minor through sex tourism, mail order bride trade, and early marriage; and
- exploiting a minor by having her/him perform in sexual venues (e.g. strip clubs).

Portraits of Victims: Hawaii



1 in 3 young people are approached or recruited

By a pimp within 48 hours of being on the streets


According to one study, 70% of street youth eventually become victims of some form of CSEC.

- More than 175 children identified as potential CSEC victims in Hawaii during 2018
- ✓ 125 "high risk" sex-trafficking establishments exist in our state
- There are no socio-economic barriers or boundaries
- An estimated 2,780 Hawai'i youth may be at risk for commercial sexual exploitation. This number is based on an average of 3,976 runaway reports per year in the state of Hawai'i (Attorney General's Uniform Crime Report Statistics, 2003 to 2012).
 - In Hawai'i there were reportedly 1,368 adolescents in foster care in 2012, with 611 females being confirmed victims of sexual abuse, physical abuse, or neglect.

Why Don't Victims Leave?

The Pimp/Trafficker:

- Manipulates
- Preys on desire for love and affection
- Provides basic needs
- Brainwashes/psychologically controls
- Restricts freedom of movement
- Threatens and invokes fear

The Victim:

- Feels shame and blame
- Distrusts adults/authority
- Often lacks resources/safe place
- Fears for their family
- Experiences isolation
- Forms emotional attachment
- Feels obligated
- Loss of value and self-worth
