





OLD AGE, SURVIVORS, AND DISABILITY INSURANCE (OASDI)

SOCIAL SECURITY Payroll Tax Withholding Deferral

Effective September 2020, DoD will temporarily defer your 6.2% OASDI tax withholding if your wages, subject to OASDI', are less than \$4,000 in any given pay period.

BACKGROUND

In order to provide relief during the COVID-19 pandemic, a Presidential Memorandum was issued on August 8, 2020 and guidance followed by Internal Revenue Service on August 28, 2020, to temporarily defer employees? 6.2% Social Security (Old Age, Survivors, and Disability Insurance) or "OASDI" tax withholdings.

KEY FACTS

- This change is effective September through the end of the 2020 calendar year and only applies to your OASDI tax withholding.
- You are not eligible to opt-out of the deferral if your OASDI wages fall within
 the stated limits. The deferral will happen automatically.
- Per current IRS guidance, collection of the deferred taxes will be taken from your wages between January 1 and April 30, 2021.
- The OASDI deduction is found on your LES under the deductions tab/section.
- If you separate in 2020 before the Social Security tax can be collected in 2021, you are still responsible for the Social Security tax repayment.

Fire Safety

According the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA):

- Approximately 30 percent of all reported fires occur in the home; even worse, four of every five fire deaths and fire injuries are caused by home fires.
- Most home fires and fire casualties result from five causes: (1) cooking, (2) heating, (3) electrical, (4) intentional fire setting, and (5) smoking materials.
- Develop a Home Fire Escape Plan and have two ways out of your home stay low and go, and periodically check your smoke detectors!
- Know how to use a portable fire extinguisher, Pull, Aim,
 Squeeze, and Sweep (PASS)
- When cooking Do not get distracted by your Information Technology (i.e., smart phones, computers, video streaming)!

Army Family Housing - Fire Safety

On 23 Sep 20, there was a major fire in a six-plex townhome at Helemano Military Reservation, affecting seven Soldiers and Families. No one was hurt. Cause of fire is currently unknown.

Last year there were 28 residential fires on-post. Average cost of repairs for 24 of 28 fires was \$5K. Cost of repairs for the other fires was \$16K, \$36K, \$61K and \$3 Million (for the six-plex townhome).

Fire Safety (from RedCross.org):

- 1. 7 people die every day from a home fire. Children and the elderly are mostly affected.
- 2. 36 people suffer injuries every day from a home fire.
- 3. Over \$7 Billion in property damage occurs every year from home fires.
 - Keep items that can catch on fire at least three feet away from anything that gets hot.
 - Smoking materials are the leading cause of residential fire deaths in the U.S. If you smoke, take precautions: smoke outside, choose fire-safe cigarettes, never smoke in bed when drowsy or medicated or if anyone in the home is using oxygen.
 - Use deep, sturdy ashtrays and douse cigarette and cigar butts with water before disposal.
 - Talk to children regularly about the dangers of fire, matches and lighters. Keep them out of reach.
 - Never leave a stove or burning candle unattended.

Renter's Insurance:

Cost (actual quote) for 4BR Home in Mililani is \$10.71/month with \$500 deductible. Coverage includes personal belongings / liability up to \$10K / \$100K respectively.







Army Family Housing – Guidelines for Pet Owners

Owners must register pets with their Island Palms Communities (IPC) community center and the Installation Veterinary Services as outlined by the post and Army regulations. A maximum of two pets in any combination will be allowed.

- Residents may not board any dog of a breed (including a mixed breed) that is deemed
 "aggressive or potentially aggressive" unless the dog is a certified military working dog that is
 being boarded by its handler/trainer. Pit bull Terriers, Staffordshire Terriers, Rottweilers,
 Doberman Pinschers, Chows, Wolf hybrids or dogs with any of these breeding combinations
 are strictly forbidden on Hawaii Army installations and in IPC.
- This prohibition also extends to other dogs that demonstrate a propensity for dominant or aggressive behavior as indicated by any of the following types of conduct:
 - Unprovoked barking, growling, or snarling at people approaching the animal
 - Aggressively running along fence lines when people are present
 - Biting or scratching people
 - Escaping confinement or restriction to chase people
 - All dogs and cats must wear pet collars; pet collars must have a current rabies immunization tag attached
 - All dogs and cats must have appropriate microchip identification as required by Hawaii State Law
 - Pet owners must have proof of immunization by a certified veterinarian that is valid for at least 12 months
- Pet owners are responsible for the behavior of their pets at all times.

USARHAW Halloween Recommendations

Under current conditions, Halloween activities are anticipated to be authorized implementing the following COVID-19 safety and prevention protocols. Guidance may change as the local situation changes.

- Groups no greater than five people, unless in the same household
- All those participating in Halloween activities, must wear masks and maintain six feet distance between other groups. Any individual over the age of two is required to wear a mask---ie parents/guardians escorting "trick-ortreaters". A costume mask is not a substitute for a cloth mask unless it is made of two or more layers of fabric that covers your mouth and nose. "Trick-or-treaters" should highly consider using a Halloween themed cloth mask for Halloween activities.
- "One-way trick-or-treating" is highly recommend for Halloween activities in order to limit interaction. This includes having candy readily available outdoors for children to grab-and-go, either in the driveway or the edge of the yard while wearing a mask. "Trick-or-Treaters" should not come to the front door of any house for candy.
- Use of hand sanitizer/hand washing is highly recommended after visiting each house and/or passing out candy to groups.
- Families are encouraged to "Trick-or-Treat" in their own neighborhood (within their block)
- If you choose not to participate in Halloween activities, turn off your porch lights.
- Post is still closed to visitors for Halloween.
- "Trunk-or-treat" activities are at high risk for spreading the COVID 19 virus. Units are encouraged to develop
 creative and innovative lower risk activities for Halloween (such as a drive thru event where candy is distributed).
 For any Halloween event, BN Command teams will ensure that the proper COVID mitigation
 - measures are develop and strictly enforced. At a minimum, activities will incorporate social
- distancing measures, group activity size restrictions, and hygiene protocols as part of their
- plans (not all-inclusive list of considerations)





Army Family Housing - Tenant Bill of Rights

The Military Housing Privatization Initiative *Tenant Bill of Rights* requires the Garrison Housing Office provide a *Plain Language Brief* to all Tenants prior to lease signing for on-post housing.

- 1. All PCSing inbound personnel desiring on-post housing will receive a Plain Language Brief following their Temporary Lodging and Allowance (TLA) Brief given by the Housing Service Office (HSO). The briefing is intended to cover Tenant Bill of Rights and review Tenant Responsibilities. Additionally, prospective Tenants will be asked if they require a Housing Official to attend the pre-assessment walkthrough on their behalf. The Plain Language Brief is not required should a Tenant decide to reside off-post
- 2. At 15 days after signing for quarters, the Tenant will receive an email from the HSO soliciting feedback regarding their satisfaction with on-post housing.
- 3. At 30 days after signing for quarters, the Tenant will receive and invite from the HSO to attend the second required Plain Language Brief. The HSO gives the brief every 1st & 3rd Wednesday of the month, beginning at 2 p.m., at https://conference.apps.mil/webconf/PlainLanguageBrief or via phone bridge at (410) 874-6300, Pin 846132141.
- 4. At 60 days after signing for quarters, the Tenant will receive a final email from the HSO soliciting feedback regarding their overall satisfaction with on-post housing and the services rendered by Island Palms Communities.
