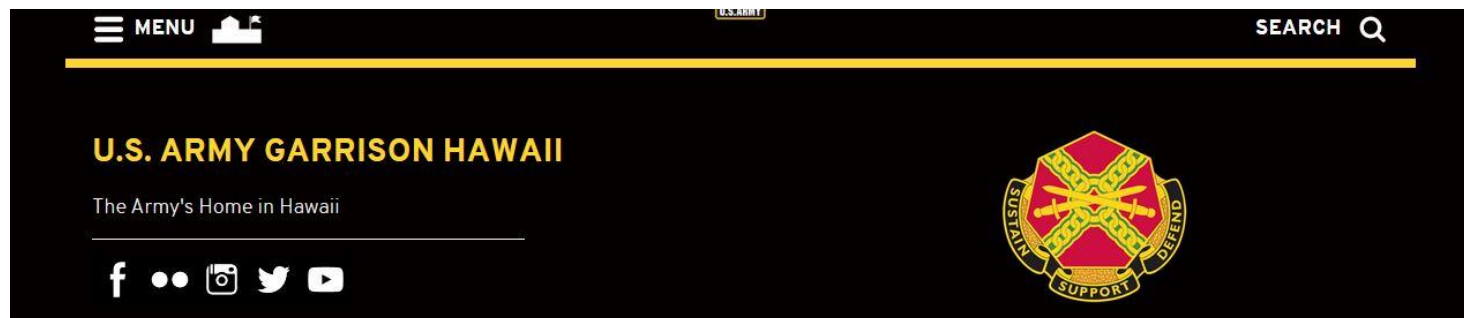

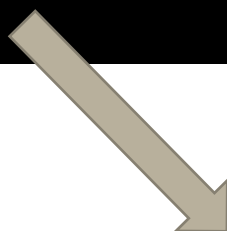

2021 Program Impacts

When HPCON Levels Change and COVID-19 Restrictions Lessen
please expect the following program impacts to continue in 2021

- ✓ NAF Hiring Freeze (except for CYS)
- ✓ Hours of operation in MWR programs may not resume to pre-pandemic hours
- ✓ Seasonal Pools will not reopen until after October 2021

Effective 15 Jan. 2021 SY 20-21 Army Child and Youth Fee Policy Changes

Key changes: Regardless of their Total Family Income category, all patrons will be required to have their Total Family Income (TFI) verified. Patrons will no longer be permitted to enroll in the highest fee category in lieu of providing proof of income. Failure to provide the required TFI documentation will result in denial of child care services.

Patrons who did not provide income documentation must provide financial documentation no later than 27 Jan. 2021. Patrons who fail to provide their financial documentation will receive a 15 day termination notice. Patrons failing to provide income documentation with days of registration/enrollment/re-registration will be terminated from care.

Unauthorized Child Care

If you provide more than 10 hours of on-post child care a week and have not been certified as a Family Child Care Provider, your sponsor (military member) and you can be penalized.



- Military members who knowingly allow unauthorized child care in their quarters may be **subject to discipline** under the UCMJ or adverse administrative action under U.S. Army Hawaii Regulation 1.
- Offenses could result in **debarment** (losing installation access and privileges) from U.S. Army Hawaii military installations.
- **Major Violations** of the Resident Occupancy Agreement or the “Island Palm Communities Resident Guide & Community Standards Handbook” of a serious nature **may result in immediate eviction.**

Ten Hour Rule – You Can Still Be Neighborly

It's okay to be neighborly and the "ten hour rule" does not eliminate "good neighbor" favors!

Examples of occasional care that does not occur on a regular basis.

Regular basis means routinely for an extended period of time.

- You can host a sleepover in your home with your children's friends.
- You can care for your neighbor's children in your home overnight as a favor while they enjoy a weekend get-away.
- You can care your friend's children while they attend an appointment.
- You can be on a Family Care Plan for a friend or family member and provide care for their children when they are called away for weekend training or temporary duty.

Unauthorized child care settings do not apply to care being provided to your children in your own home.

Volunteer Management Information System (VMIS) provides tools to manage volunteerism in your military community. What is VMIS? Volunteers play an integral role in the life of Soldiers and their Families and are found throughout the military community. The Volunteer Management Information System (VMIS) assists the Army Volunteer Corps and Organization Point of Contact (OPOC) in managing these dedicated volunteers and allows volunteers a way track their hours, awards, trainings and certificates. What can volunteers do in VMIS? Volunteers can apply for volunteer opportunities, record and track volunteer hours, and manage their volunteer service record. What can administrators do in VMIS? Administrators can engage in online volunteer recruitment, manage military community volunteerism (hours, positions, awards, and trainings), and produce simple reports on program statistics.

WHAT: VMIS will migrate from Army OneSource (AOS) to the new Army Family Web Portal (AFWP) on 11 Jan. 2021. The volunteer information previously housed on Army OneSource will be available on the new AFWP Volunteer Management Information System.

WHEN: Army OneSource will sunset on 31 Dec. 2020. The Army Family Web Portal will launch on 11 Jan. 2021.

WHERE: In order to prepare for and transition your AOS VMIS account to the new AFWP VMIS, please read the VMIS Volunteer Quick User Transition Guide for information on the AFWP Resource Center Training link below.

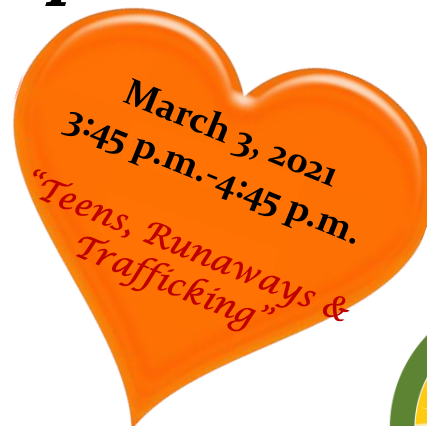

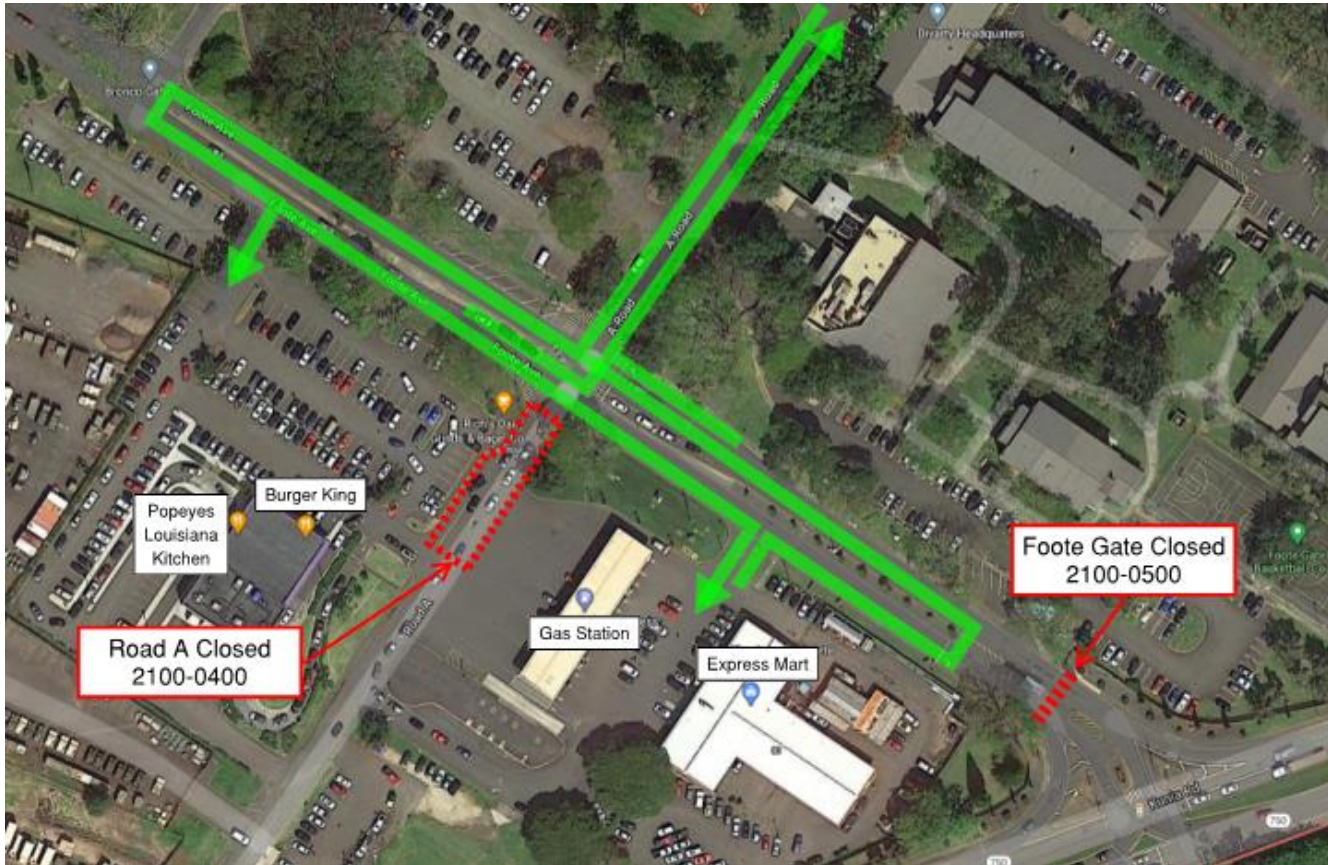

Barracks Quality of Life Improvements

- ❑ Proper care of your facility and furnishings improves QoL, primary concerns:
 - Most lockouts can be prevented: when your keycard is inserted and the lights flash red and green your locking system batteries will last 2 to 4 weeks, contact your barracks manager for replacement
 - Clogged drains: placing wipes (other than TP) in toilet causes main line clogs
 - Mold: open windows hot/cold air meet, add dust and mold grows. Less than 10 sq ft is the Soldiers responsibility, if more that 10 sq feet contact your barracks manager
 - AC units in windows: detract from the normal operation of the bldg.'s AC system, please address through ArMA (below)
- ❑ Army Maintenance Application (ArMA)
 - Soldiers living in the barracks are now submitting Demand Maintenance Orders (DMOs) for repairs in their barracks on their computer or device
 - Communicate with DPW Work Management thru ArMA
 - Priority 1 DMOs, Furnishings and appliances are still reported to your CQ or Barracks Manager
 - See your barracks manager for training, the following have not attended: 500MI, 516 SIG (north), 25 DSB, USARPAC, 8 TSC

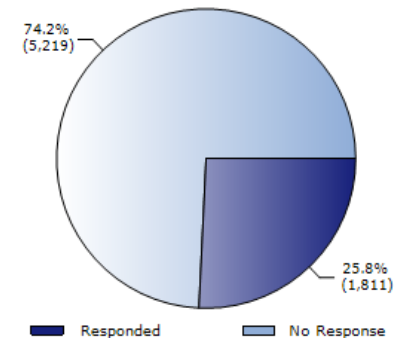

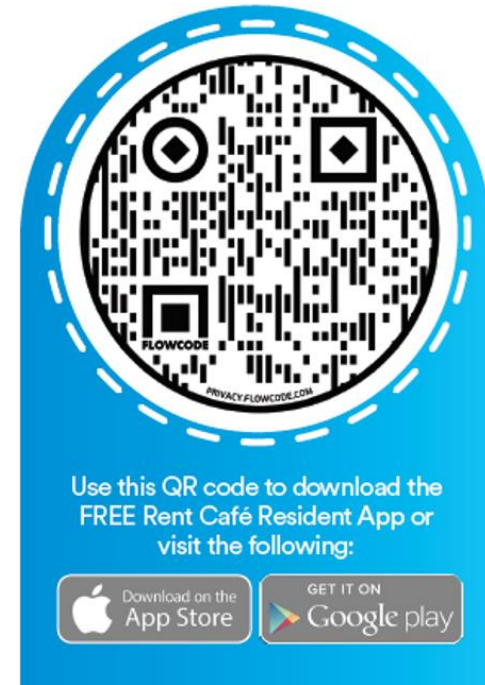

Update on Vehicle Registration

- Purpose of Vehicle Registration:
 - Required by Army Regulation
 - Reduces abandoned vehicles on the installation by holding owners accountable
 - Ensures proper vehicle disposition during installation out-processing
- Registration at the VCC begins 25 Jan.; Unit-level registration begins 8 Feb.

Soldiers

- Soldiers in USARHAW units will register their vehicles with their unit S1. This is the primary method of registration for Soldiers and their families.
- Soldiers or other military members who are not in USARHAW units will register their vehicles at the Visitor Control Center or at a DES hosted “Vehicle Registration Drive-Thru” event starting in February / March 2021.

Family Members

- Family member vehicles will be registered under the Sponsor’s name.
- If the Sponsor is unable to register the vehicle (due to deployment or extended TDY), vehicles can be registered at the Visitor Control Center (VCC) at Leilehua Golf Course.

DA Civilians and Contractors

- DA Civilians and Contractors can register their vehicles at the Visitor Control Center.
- Contractors may register work vehicles at the Vehicle Processing Centers (VPC) when coming onto the installation for a work order.
- DES will be hosting “Vehicle Registration Drive-Thru” events starting in February / March 2021.

Visitors

- Visitors will continue to register their vehicles at the Vehicle Processing Centers (VPC) and Visitor Control Center (VCC).
- As of December 01, all visitor vehicles are registered into a database with a printed visitor pass.

Temporary Pass

Access: Pass valid for 24 hours or for a specific purpose (example: delivery driver)

Where to Apply: Vehicle Processing Center (VPC)

- DoD Sponsor OR work order

Short-Term Pass

Access: Pass valid for 2 – 30 days, issued based on need. Allows pass holder to come and go on the installation through any gate without an escort.

Where to Apply: Vehicle Processing Center (VPC) or Visitor Control Center (VCC)

Requirements:

- Valid State/Federal ID
- Social Security Number
- Background Check
- DoD Sponsor (NOTE: House guests staying in on-post family housing for more than six days also need to be registered at the resident's community center)

Controlled Access Pass

Access: Pass valid for 30 – 365 days, issued for house guests, caregivers, or visitors.

Where to Apply: Visitor Control Center (VCC)

Requirements:

- Valid State/Federal ID
- Controlled Access Pass Application
- Social Security Number
- Background Check
- DoD Sponsor (NOTE: House guests need to be registered at the resident's community center. In addition, E-6 and below need a commander's signature on the Controlled Access Pass application form.)

Who Gets a COVID-19 Vaccination FIRST?

PHASE 1A

- Sub-tier 1**  **Emergency room, urgent care centers, and first responders** (i.e., police, search and rescue, and fire personnel), and Armed Forces Retirement Home residents
- Sub-tier 2**  **Health care and support personnel at military hospitals and clinics**, along with other non-clinical staff authorized to receive vaccine from DoD, who support patient care with a high risk of exposure or potential to interface with COVID-19 positive cases
- Sub-tier 3**  Outpatient health care and support personnel, including National Guard and Reserve personnel as well as active duty service members **deploying or supporting COVID-19 response operations in Title 10 or Title 32 duty status**

PHASE 1B

-  **National critical capabilities** (strategic and nuclear deterrence forces, homeland defense)
-  Personnel preparing to **deploy to locations outside of the continental U.S. (OCONUS)**
-  **Personnel preparing to deploy within the next three months**, including military civilian and contractors authorized to receive immunization from the DoD
-  **New! Beneficiaries age 75 or older**
-  **New! Front Line Essential Workers:** Education and youth and child services staff sector, eligible defense manufacturing, DoD corrections staff, DoD postal service staff, DoD public transit workers, Commissary and other installation food service or agricultural workers

Phase 1C

- Eligible beneficiaries age 65-74 years
- Eligible beneficiaries age 16-64 with increased risk for severe illness as defined by the CDC
- OSD, Agencies, field activities, Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Space Force, U.S. Coast Guard, and Reserve Component designated as key, essential, or mission-essential
- DoD Prisoners

Executive Order on Protecting the Federal Workforce and Requiring Mask-Wearing (signed 20 JAN 2021)

Section 1. "...on-duty or on-site Federal employees, on-site Federal contractors, and other individuals in Federal buildings and on Federal lands should all wear masks, maintain physical distance, and adhere to other public health measures, as provided in CDC guidelines."

Section 2. "...The heads of executive departments and agencies shall immediately take action...to require [Federal] compliance with CDC guidelines..."

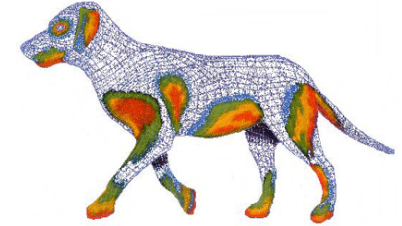

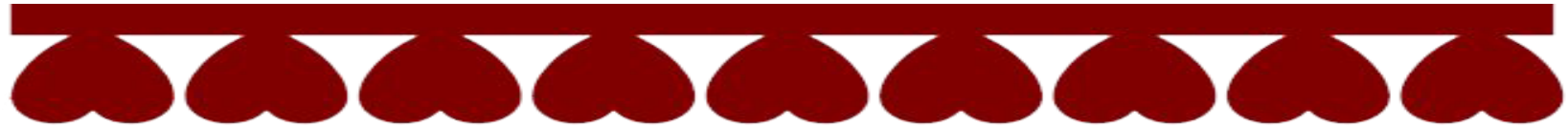

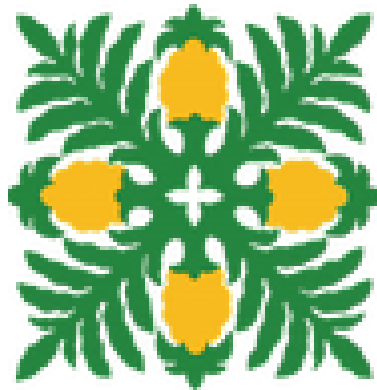

Child Supervision & Babysitting:

Home Alone

Birth to age 9: No

Age 10-11: Yes, up to 4 hrs. in a 24-hr period (not overnight) w/access to adult

Age 12-13: Yes, up to 6 hrs. in a 24-hr period (not overnight) w/access to adult

Age 14-15: Yes, but not overnight. No longer than 9 hours with ready access to adult supervision

Age 16-17: Yes, no more than two consecutive overnight periods with access to adult supervision



Unattended Outside

Birth to age 5: No

Age 6-9: Yes, if in a playground/yard w/ immediate access to adult supervision (to include being within sight and hearing distance). Children 6 years old and older are exempt from the "outside unattended" rule when walking to and from school, school bus stop, or CYS activity. Walk cannot be longer than 1 mile or cross a busy street.

Age 10-11: Yes, with ready access to adult supervision. Sponsors checks on child or child checks in hourly. Adult must respond within 30 minutes or less to a child in crisis.

Age 12-13: Yes, with ready access to adult supervision. Sponsors checks on child or child checks in via phone or in person every 2 hrs., must know child's location/activity, and respond within 1hr .

Age 14-15: Yes, with access to adult supervision via phone within 2 hrs. Contact made every 3 hrs. Follow curfew.

Age 16-17: Yes, follow curfew guidance.

Babysitting Siblings & Other Children

Birth to 10: No

Age 11: Yes, may only care for siblings age 6 and older. Not to exceed 3 hrs.

Age 12-13: Up to 6 hrs. with access to adult.

Children must be age 2 and older.

Age 14-15: Up to 9 hrs. (not overnight) with access to adult. Non-siblings must be age 2 and older

Age 16-17: Yes

Unattended In Car

Birth to age 6): No

Age 7-9: Yes, up to 10 minutes if the keys have been removed and hand brake applied

Age 10-11: Yes, up to 20 minutes, keys removed and handbrake applied

Age 12-17: Yes

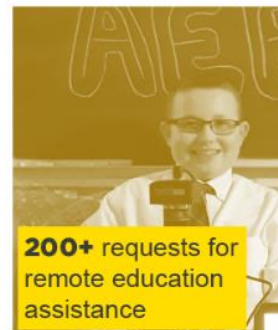

Social Security Payroll Tax Deferral Collection Extension

UPDATE: The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 was passed and extended the period for collection of deferred 2020 Social Security taxes is now **Jan. 1 through Dec. 31, 2021** (instead of Jan. 1 to April 30, 2021).

Active Duty Military 2020 deferred Social Security taxes will be collected in 24 installments, from mid-month and end-of-month pay between Jan. 1 and Dec. 30, 2021.

Reservists / Guardsmen performing intermittent duty in 2021, the amount collected may not be the same every pay period. DFAS will collect 2% of net available from each weekly, mid-month and end-of-month pay, and will continue until the deferred taxes have been repaid in full.

Civilian Employees: 2020 deferred Social Security taxes will be collected in 24 installments between pay-periods ending Jan. 16 and Dec. 4, 2021.
