


ABOUT U.S. ARMY GARRISON HAWAII


Transition Assistance Program

(formerly SFL-TAP)

- **Required by law** for all separating and retiring Soldiers
- Start 12-18 months before separation
- Retirees should start 24 months before retirement
- Un-programmed losses need to begin ASAP
- Spouses eligible
- All appointments and workshops being conducted via in-person, telephone, and virtually
 - ✓ Mandatory and voluntary workshops to prepare individuals and families for success after the Army
 - ✓ Internships and apprenticeships available if qualified

- Involuntary – 3-5 business days

- Proof of Command Sponsorship (if applicable)

Medical Separation Orders

- Approved DA31 (3 business days)
- Proof of Command Sponsorship (if applicable)

Involuntary Separation Orders

- Separation Packet (“I Direct Memo”)
- Approved DA31 (if applicable)
- Separation date will be 14 business days from receipt of packet or end of approved transition leave





- You must bring the following items to the Schofield Barracks Auto Skills Center (Bldg. 910) located on Duck Road to obtain a Resale Lot Permit:
 - Valid government ID card
 - Valid state registration and license plate sticker
 - Valid state safety inspection papers and stickers
 - Valid proof of insurance Hawaii "No Fault" insurance card
 - Post vehicle registration form

Note: Power of attorney is required if you are not the registered owner.







Unauthorized Child Care Homes put Children at Risk

Help keep children Safe.

Parents: Register your children through Parent Central Services, to ensure your provider is certified. If in doubt, call your local CYS office. Report violations to CYS immediately.

Army CYS Policy: If you provide more than ten hours of on-post childcare a week and have not been certified as a Family Child Care Provider, you may be in violation of your Housing Lease Agreement and could be jeopardizing the safety and well-being of children. Contact CYS to start the certification process to become a Family Child Care Provider.

Supporting the Army Fee Assistance Process

Army Fee Assistance = Financial Subsidy for Off Installation Care

Army Families can receive fee assistance to offset the cost of care in their communities.

Who is eligible:

Army Families with a spouse who is working a minimum of 16 hours a week or who is enrolled in school.

When CYS cannot provide care within 45 days of the date care is required, a statement of non-availability is provided so families can apply for fee assistance.

1. Always register at:

2. Visit Parent Central Services to validate your request for care. CYS will expedite your statement of non-availability if there are no projected available spaces.





What To Do Right Away

Transitioning service members need to maintain vigilance when applying for jobs. There are many false websites posing as job recruiters that scammers use to acquire personal information.

- + Step 1: Call the companies where you know fraud occurred.
- + Step 2: Place a fraud alert and get your credit reports.
- + Step 3: Report identity theft to the FTC.
- + You may choose to file a report with your local police department.

What To Do Next

- + Close new accounts opened in your name.
- + Remove bogus charges from your accounts
- + Correct your credit report.
- + Consider adding an extended fraud alert or credit freeze.
- + Review your credit reports often.

Security TTPs

- Leave home address off of your resume.
- Safeguard your Social Security Number.
- Use privacy settings on job sites.
- Avoid sending links to personal social media accounts.
- Use caution if applying to a job that sounds too good to be true.

Automated Installation Entry (AIE)

- AIE is the Army's enterprise installation access control system- critical for the identification and denial of terrorists, criminals and potential insider threats attempting to access Army installations
- Enhances installation security
- AIE will provide continuous vetting against various criminal information databases of all affiliated personnel (ID Card holders) as well as contractors and all visitors
- AIE is expected to be implemented within the first two weeks of October. Once implemented, all affiliated personnel must be registered in to the system.
- Registration is a one time event, and is accomplished the **FIRST TIME** someone's ID card is scanned at the Gate. Registration will cause a short delay (1-3 seconds) which could result in slower entry over the course of the first 90 days of implementation.
- We ask for everyone's patience and ask that everyone plan their commute accordingly.







ARMY FAP SAFE SLEEP CAMPAIGN

The ABC's of Safe Sleep

A **Alone** in Their Sleeping Space

Alone means removing all items from baby's crib:

- Stuffed animals
- Loose blankets (swaddling is ok until your baby can roll over)
- Crib bumpers
- Anything that could increase risk of strangulation

Alone doesn't mean away.
The risk of SIDS reduces by 50% for babies who sleep in the same room as their parent. Share your room with baby for at least their first six months.

Placed on **Back**

B

Always place baby on their back on a firm surface to sleep.

C **Asleep in Crib**

Use a crib, bassinet, or portable crib that meets safety standards (See <https://www.cpsc.gov/SafeSleep>).

Never let baby sleep on a couch or sofa.

If baby falls asleep in their car seat, move them to their safe sleep spot at your destination.

In-Home Child Care Fee Assistance Pilot Program

The Department of Defense is committed to ensuring service members and their families have access to the child care they need to be mission ready. To help with expanding child care needs, the DOD is starting a small pilot program to explore providing fee assistance for full-time, in-home child care services.

In-home providers must successfully complete requirements for background checks and complete 32 hours of training covering topics including CPR and first aid, child abuse prevention, safe sleep and care for children with special needs, if needed. Space in the pilot program is limited. To learn more, please visit:

Families may use the expanded child care service available through Military OneSource to search for in-home providers.

Reach out to Military OneSource tax consultants if you have questions about tax implications for parents who employ care providers in their home.

The fee assistance pilot program will cover full-time care for a minimum of 30 hours to a maximum of 60 hours of child care weekly. Care is not limited to Monday through Friday or time of day.

In its first year, the pilot program will be open in five regions that have high demand and the longest waitlists for child care. These locations are the National Capital Region; Hawaii; San Diego, CA; Norfolk, VA; and San Antonio, TX. Military Families currently on the MilitaryChildCare.com waitlist or requesting child care via MilitaryChildCare.com in the five selected regions are eligible to participate in the pilot program.

Eligibility requirements include:

- Single or dual Active Duty members
- Single or dual Guard or Reserve members on active duty
- Active Duty members with a full-time working spouse
- Guard or Reserve members on active duty with a full-time working spouse
- Active Duty members with a spouse enrolled in a postsecondary institution on a full-time basis
- Guard or Reserve members on active duty with a spouse enrolled in a postsecondary institution on a full-time basis

Families will be responsible for finding their own in-home child care providers. Providers must be U.S. citizens and:

- Be at least 18 years of age
- Hold a high school diploma or equivalent
- Read, speak and write English



PARENT CENTRAL SERVICES Registration Requirements for CYS Services

- ❖ Official shot record with a Negative TB test result (12 months and older) or TB Document F: State of Hawaii TB Clearance Form, signed & stamped by a Licensed Practitioner.
- ❖ Flu shot is required for children enrolled in FULL DAY CARE. The deadline for the Flu Shot will be December 31st of each year. Children who are 6 months or older, or have never had the flu shot will receive the first half of the shot and the second half 30 days later.
- ❖ CYS Services Health Assessment (due within 30 days of registration).
- ❖ If your child has special needs (i.e. asthma, diet restrictions/intolerances, seizures, ADHD, Diabetes, Autism, Eczema, Behavioral concerns, etc.) additional forms will need to be submitted. Contact one of our offices for details.
- ❖ Two local emergency contacts (adults other than parents or legal guardian).
- ❖ Proof of Total Family Income (most recent end of month LES and/or pay stubs).
- ❖ Family Care Plan for Single/Dual Military Families (due within 30 days of registration).








DHR - Total Army Sponsorship Program

- Sponsorship is **required** in order to process permanent change of station (PCS) orders to Hawaii and other regions.
- **Soldiers (E1-O6)**
 - ✓ Soldiers must log onto the Army Career Trackers Total Army Sponsorship Program to initiate DA Form 5434 and request a sponsor.
 - ✓ Units are required to assign a sponsor 120 days prior to report date.
- **Department of Army Civilians**
 - ✓ DA Civilians can fill out the PDF version of the DA Form 5434 and email it to their gaining organization.
- **ACS Sponsorship Classes**
 - Classes held every Thursday at 1200 hrs via MS TEAMS.
 - Required for all assigned sponsors and volunteers.




DHR - Transition Assistance Program (TAP)



DHR - Reassignment Office

- Process & Publish the Following:
 - ✓ PCS Orders
 - ✓ IPCOT/COT Travel Orders
 - ✓ Excess Leave Orders
 - ✓ Confinement Transfer Orders
 - ✓ Deletion or Deferment of Assignments- Non PSDR units
- Levy Notifications are sent within 5 days of MPD receiving notification of assignment via CAP Cycle. MPD notifies via email to the Soldier, S1, and SGM/CSM. Soldiers are to complete the Levy Packet NLT 30 days from notification.
- Orders are published up to 6 Months from departure date, if all required documents are submitted to include the PCS ETP. S1 submits completed Levy Packets to:
usarmy.schofield.id-pacific.list.reassignments-hi@mail.mil
- Reassignments Office provides S1's and SGM/CSMs a Missing Documents log weekly.
- It is Army policy that if an individual has a government travel card, it will be used for all relocation expenses up to the limit of their entitlements. A centrally billed account is only available for Soldiers who do not have a government travel card. Account type must be indicated to Reassignments Office prior to orders being cut.

DHR - Family Travel Office

Due to the COVID travel restrictions, the process to request orders for all Government Funded Travel now requires additional steps. (Early Return of Dependent, Dependent Travel, Space A Travel and Student Travel.)

All Government Funded Travel requests are processed as follows:

1. Service Member submits the packet to their Chain of Command (packet checklists provided on the Garrison Webpage)
2. Chain of Command submits the packet to Schofield Family Travel Section Military-Personnel Division (SFTS-MPD)
3. After tentatively approving the request for travel, the SFTS-MPD provides the S-1 a Memorandum to be used as a justification to request a Travel Exception to Policy (ETP) signed by the first General Officer in the Chain of Command.
4. Chain of Command submits the signed ETP to SFTS-MPD
5. SFTS-MPD then provides the final order to S-1 and Service Member

Transportation and Carlson Wagon-lit (SATO) will require a copy of the final orders and signed Travel ETP to book HHG shipments and flights




