





Mask Guidance



- ✓U.S. Army Hawaii released new mask guidance Oct. 20
- √ Vaccinated individuals no longer have to wear a mask indoors while on Army installations in Hawaii

 - eye-care centers
 - Hawai'i Public Schools
 - health clinics
 - tailors

Halloween Guidance

- √ Halloween activities will be authorized. implementing the following COVID-19 safety and prevention protocols.
 - Guidance may change as the local situation changes.
- √ Trick-or-treating hours will be on Sunday, Oct. 31 from 5-8 p.m. in all U.S. Army Hawaii family housing areas
- ✓ Groups no greater than five people, unless in the same household
- √ "One-way" trick-or-treating is highly recommended in all U.S. Army Hawaii communities.
 - Consider having candy readily available outdoors as grab-and-go, either in the driveway or the edge of the yard.
 - Trick-or-treaters should avoid coming to the front door of any house for candy.
- √ Health protection measures, such as hand sanitizer and face coverings are highly encouraged throughout the evening.
- ✓ If you choose not to participate in Halloween activities, please consider turning off your porch lights.

Automated Installation Entry (AIE)

- AIE is the Army's enterprise installation access control system- critical for the identification and denial of terrorists, criminals and potential insider threats attempting to access Army installations
- Enhances installation security



- Registration is a one time event, and is accomplished the <u>FIRST TIME</u> someone's ID card is scanned at the gate. Registration will cause a short delay (1-3 seconds) which could result in slower entry over the course of the first 90 days of implementation.
- Long-term visitors, such as family care providers, au pairs, or unaffiliated family members visiting to assist with families of deployed soldiers can get a long term AIE Pass at a Visitor Control Center after passing a background check.

Abandoned Vehicles

- ➤ 190 abandoned vehicles have been impounded over the last month
- ➤ 468 vehicles total in impound yards pending final Disposal
- ➤ Priority for removal are those vehicles presenting safety concerns
- > Report suspected abandoned vehicles to MP station



Vehicle Registration

Vehicle Registration is still on going; enforcement has been pushed back until a date to be determined in 2022

Vehicle registration currently applies to:

- All U.S. Army Soldiers and family members assigned to USARHAW
- Anyone who lives in an U.S. Army Housing area (regardless of branch of service/status)

Registration can be accomplished at the following locations:

Leilehua Visitor Control Center Monday-Friday, 7:30 a.m.-3 p.m.

Fort Shafter Military Police Station Monday-Friday, 10 a.m.-6 p.m.

**Bring state registration, insurance, driver's license, inspection (if registration is in Hawaii), ID card

Police Crime Prevention Messaging and Tips



Automobile Theft Prevention

- LOCK your vehicles
- Remove key fobs
- Lock all doors, windows and any sunroof before leaving your car.
- Carry or secure car keys while exercising (hiding keys in gas tank or by rear tire is a technique known to thieves)
- Park in well-lit areas
- Never leave your vehicle running, even if you will be gone for only a minute.
- Completely close all windows of parked vehicles.
- Call police or 911 to report any suspicious activity around parked vehicles.
- Criminals may have military affiliation and may live near you
- Crime prevention and security is a community effort

Deployment Support

✓ Power of Attorney

- Legal document in which one person (the *principle*) gives legal authority to another person (the *agent*) to stand in their shoes and act on their behalf.
- The agent can have:
 - General POA broad authority
 - Special POA limited authority

✓ Estate Planning

- Not required, but provides peace of mind.
- Includes wills, healthcare POA, living will

✓ Child Custody

- Review court ordered custody agreements
- Family care plans
- Power of attorney

✓ Service members' Civil Relief Act (SCRA)

- Temporary custody orders
- Early termination of residential/vehicle lease or cell phone contracts
- Stay of civil proceedings (not criminal!) and reopening default judgments

Supporting Our Military Families



- ➤ Issue/renew Active, Retiree and dependent ID Cards.
- Requirements for receiving ID cards
 - ✓ Age 18 and over > 2 forms of non-expired identification (one being photo ID)
 - ✓ If sponsor is unavailable; dependent will need to provide either 1172 or POA.
 - ➤ 1172 electronically signed by the sponsor (wet signature must be notarized)
 - > POA (Special POA must state ID transactions)
- The extension of expired ID cards for Active duty dependents ends October 31, 2021. (Currently NO plans for further extension)
- The minimum age of initial ID issuance increased from 10 to 14 (Child)
- ➤ Ensure dependent address is updated in DEERS (self-service website)
- Walk-ins for ID card on space available basis
- Issue CAC for Military and Civilian personnel
- ➤ CAC transactions limited to initial issuance, lost/stolen or expiring within 30 days; reissuance of CAC due to information changes (e.g., promotion and name changes) in NOT authorized






Schofield Barracks Agent Card

The Agent Card authorizes patrons to purchase items at the Schofield Barracks Main Exchange, Schofield Commissary and MWR facilities as the agent for the Sponsor. This Agent Card (U.S. Army Garrison Hawaii) is only acceptable for usage at the main exchange, commissary and MWR facilities located on Schofield Barracks.

 The Air Force, Navy and Marine Corps Exchanges, and Commissaries does not have to honor our U.S. Army Hawaii Agent Card.



- Single or Dual Military parents Deployment or TDY orders (for Dual Military, both parents must be offisland simultaneously)
- Minor Child reside with a Non-Military Parent Divorce decree or court document showing custody.
- Active Duty Member Signed physician's letter stating the Patron is incapable of shopping for themselves.




Out-Processing Center

Family Member Out-Processing for an Absent Service Member

- Family members require a Special Power of Attorney (SPOA) stating the Soldier authorizes the Family member to clear the Installation (DA 137-2).
- Unit Commanders must designate a Service Member to clear the Unit (DA 137-1) in the absence of a Service Member.
- Family member should have multiple copies of orders, any amendments, and DA-31.

Housing Deployment Support

- ✓ Upon notice that you are **DEPLOYING** the Housing Services Office (**HSO**) is able to:
 - Assist with giving a 30 day ON-POST or OFF-POST 'Notice to Vacate'
 - Assist with OFF-POST Landlord/Tenant Disputes
 - The Residential Communities Initiative (RCI) Office advocates for Spouses regarding ON-POST Landlord/Tenant Disputes while Service Member is DEPLOYED. Unit Leadership (Rear-Detachment CoC) involvement is encouraged at any point.

NOTE: Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA) is not authorized before you DEPLOY

HOUSING REDEPLOYMENT SUPPORT

- ✓ Upon your **REDEPLOYMENT** the Housing Services Office (**HSO**) is able to:
 - Provide an overview of OFF-POST communities
 - Provide Utility Deposit waiver forms

Electric - Gas - Water

- Provide a Lease agreement overview
- Assist with finding an OFF-POST LONG TERM or SHORT TERM rental

Deployment Support

Community Centers Offer:

- -Free Lawncare Service. Backyards can be added to the mow list during deployments that are in excess of 90 days. TDY orders for training are not included. You are required to submit the service members orders along with tentative return date to your community center.
- -You may request to authorize the community center teams to check on your home periodically if you're off island. You are required to complete a notice of absence form and submit it to your community center.



-A service member who returns to Hawaii with an ERD (Early Return Date) is considered a priority 3 for our waitlist.

Are Guests Allowed to Stay Overnight in My Home:

- -Guests are allowed.
- 7 to 29 days residents must submit an Extended Stay Request form to their community center for approval.
- 30 days or more residents must apply for USAG-Hawaii's Gold Installation Access Pass.



Child & Youth Services Deployment Support Services



√ What is Child and Youth Services Deployment Support Services?

➤ It is a commitment from the Army to enhance family readiness by providing additional support to families, especially during deployments.



√ What are the benefits for Army qualified services members?

- ➤ Fee Reduction: 20% reduction to fees for regularly scheduled full-day or part-day care. Valid for 30 day prior to deployment and 90 days after returning from deployment. This level of support is also provided to Soldiers while assigned to a Warrior Transition Unit.
- ➤ Respite Care: 16 Hours of Respite Care in Family Child Care Homes dependent on deployment length. Space is limited. Hourly Care reservations can be made up to 30 days in advance.

3. Supporting the Army Fee Assistance Process

Army Fee Assistance = Financial Subsidy for Off Installation Care

Army Families can receive fee assistance to offset the cost of care in their communities.

Who is eligible:

Army Families with a spouse who is working a minimum of 16 hours a week or who is enrolled in school.

When CYS cannot provide care within 45 days of the date care is required a statement of non-availability is provided so that families can apply for fee assistance.





PARENT CENTRAL SERVICES Registration Requirements for CYS Services

- Official shot record with a Negative TB test result (12 months and older) or TB Document F: State of Hawaii TB Clearance Form, signed & stamped by a Licensed Practitioner.
- Flu shot is required for children enrolled in FULL DAY CARE. The deadline for the Flu Shot will be December 31st of each year. Children who are 6 months or older, or have never had the flu shot will receive the first half of the shot and the second half 30 days later.
- * CYS Services Health Assessment (due within 30 days of registration).
- If your child has special needs (i.e. asthma, diet restrictions/intolerances, seizures, ADHD, Diabetes, Autism, Eczema, Behavioral concerns, etc.) additional forms will need to be submitted. Contact one of our offices for details.
- Two local emergency contacts (adults other than parents or legal guardian).
- Proof of Total Family Income (most recent end of month LES and/or pay stubs).
- Family Care Plan for Single/Dual Military Families (due within 30 days of registration).

Unauthorized Child Care Ten Hour Rule – You Can Still Be Neighborly

It's okay to be neighborly and the "ten hour rule" does not eliminate "good neighbor" favors!

Examples of <u>occasional</u> care that does <u>not</u> occur on a <u>regular basis</u>. Regular basis means <u>routinely</u> for an <u>extended period of time</u>.

- You can host a sleepover in your home with your children's friends.
- You can care for your neighbors children in your home overnight as a favor while they enjoy a weekend get-away.
- You can care your friend's children while they attend an appointment.
- You can be on a Family Care Plan for a friend or family member and provide care for their children when they are called away for weekend training or temporary duty.

Unauthorized child care settings do not apply to care being provided to <u>your</u> children in <u>your own home</u>.

Child & Youth Services (CYS) - Supervision and Babysitting

Home Alone

Birth to age 9: No

Age 10-11: Yes, up to 4 hrs. in a 24-hr period (not overnight) w/access to adult

Age 12-13: Yes, up to 6 hrs. in a 24-hr period (not overnight) w/access to adult

Age 14-15: Yes, but not overnight. No longer than 9 hours with ready access to adult supervision

Age 16-17: Yes, no more than two consecutive overnight periods with access to adult supervision



Unattended Outside

Birth to age 5: No

Age 6-9: Yes, if in a playground/yard w/ immediate access to adult supervision (to include being within sight and hearing distance). Children 6 years old and older are exempt from the "outside unattended" rule when walking to and from school, school bus stop, or CYS activity. Walk cannot be longer than 1 mile or cross a busy street.

Age 10-11: Yes, with ready access to adult supervision. Sponsors checks on child or child checks in hourly. Adult must respond within 30 minutes or less to a child in crisis.

Age 12-13: Yes, with ready access to adult supervision. Sponsors checks on child or child checks in via phone or in person every 2 hrs., must know child's location/activity, and respond within 1hr.

Age 14-15: Yes, with access to adult supervision via phone within 2 hrs. Contact made every 3 hrs. Follow curfew.

Age 16-17: Yes, follow curfew guidance.

Babysitting Siblings & Other Children

Birth to 10: No

Age 11: Yes, may only care for siblings age 6 and older. Not to exceed 3 hrs.

Age 12-13: Up to 6 hrs. with access to adult.

Children must be age 2 and older.

Age 14-15: Up to 9 hrs. (not overnight) with access

to adult. Non-siblings must be age 2 and older

Age 16-17: Yes

Unattended In Car

Birth to age 6): No

Age 7-9: Yes, up to 10 minutes if the keys have been removed and hand brake applied

Age 10-11: Yes, up to 20 minutes, keys

removed and handbrake applied

Age 12-17: Yes







Military OneSource



The Department of Defense is committed to ensuring service members and their families have access to the child care they need to be mission ready. To help with expanding child care needs, the DOD is starting a small pilot program to explore providing fee assistance for full-time, in-home child care services.

In-home providers must successfully complete requirements for background checks and complete 32 hours of training covering topics including CPR and first aid, child abuse prevention, safe sleep and care for children with special needs, if needed. Space in the pilot program is limited. To learn more, please visit:

Families may use the expanded child care service available through Military OneSource to search for in-home providers.

Reach out to Military OneSource tax consultants if you have questions about tax implications for parents who employ care providers in their home.

The fee assistance pilot program will cover full-time care for a minimum of 30 hours to a maximum of 60 hours of child care weekly. Care is not limited to Monday through Friday or time of day.

In its first year, the pilot program will be open in five regions that have high demand and the longest waitlists for child care. These locations are the National Capital Region; Hawaii; San Diego, CA; Norfolk, VA; and San Antonio, TX. Military Families currently on the MilitaryChildCare.com waitlist or requesting child care via MilitaryChildCare.com in the five selected regions are eligible to participate in the pilot program.

Eligibility requirements include:

- Single or dual Active Duty members
- Single or dual Guard or Reserve members on active duty
- > Active Duty members with a full-time working spouse
- Guard or Reserve members on active duty with a full-time working spouse
- Active Duty members with a spouse enrolled in a postsecondary institution on a full-time basis
- Guard or Reserve members on active duty with a spouse enrolled in a postsecondary institution on a full-time basis

Families will be responsible for finding their own in-home child care providers. Providers must be U.S. citizens and:

- > Be at least 18 years of age
- > Hold a high school diploma or equivalent
- > Read, speak and write English





DHR - Total Army Sponsorship Program

 Sponsorship is <u>required</u> in order to process permanent change of station (PCS) orders to Hawaii and other regions.

Soldiers (E1-O6)

- ✓ Soldiers must log onto the Army Career Trackers Total Army Sponsorship Program to initiate DA Form 5434 and request a sponsor.
- ✓ Units are required to assign a sponsor 120 days prior to report date.

Department of Army Civilians

✓ DA Civilians can fill out the PDF version of the DA Form 5434 and email it to their gaining organization.




DHR - Transition Assistance Program (TAP)

DHR - Reassignment Office

- Process & Publish the Following:
 - ✓ PCS Orders
 - ✓ IPCOT/COT Travel Orders
 - ✓ Excess Leave Orders
 - ✓ Confinement Transfer Orders
 - ✓ Deletion or Deferment of Assignments- Non PSDR units



- Levy Notifications are sent within 5 days of MPD receiving notification of assignment via CAP Cycle. MPD
 notifies via email to the Soldier, S1, and SGM/CSM. Soldiers are to complete the Levy Packet NLT 30 days
 from notification.
- Orders are published up to <u>6 Months</u> from departure date, if all required documents are submitted to include the PCS ETP. S1 submits completed Levy Packets to: <u>usarmy.schofield.id-pacific.list.reassignments-hi@mail.mil</u>
- Reassignments Office provides S1's and SGM/CSMs a Missing Documents log weekly.
- It is Army policy that if an individual has a government travel card, it will be used for all relocation expenses up to the limit of their entitlements. A centrally billed account is only available for Soldiers who do not have a government travel card. Account type must be indicated to Reassignments Office prior to orders being cut.

DHR - Family Travel Office

Due to the COVID travel restrictions, the process to request orders for all Government Funded Travel now requires additional steps. (Early Return of Dependent, Dependent Travel, Space A Travel and Student Travel.)

All Government Funded Travel requests are processed as follows:

- 1. Service Member submits the packet to their Chain of Command (packet checklists provided on the Garrison Webpage)
- 2. Chain of Command submits the packet to Schofield Family Travel Section Military-Personnel Division (SFTS-MPD)
- 3. After tentatively approving the request for travel, the SFTS-MPD provides the S-1 a Memorandum to be used as a justification to request a Travel Exception to Policy (ETP) signed by the first General Officer in the Chain of Command.
- 4. Chain of Command submits the signed ETP to SFTS-MPD
- 5. SFTS-MPD then provides the final order to S-1 and Service Member

Transportation and Carlson Wagon-lit (SATO) will require a copy of the final orders and signed Travel ETP to book HHG shipments and flights

Early Return of Dependents

•Only used for unusual/emergency circumstances like marital difficulties, financial difficulties, divorce, hardship, etc.

Dependent Travel

 The Soldier acquired a Family member (married) before the effective date of the PCS order & is entitled to transportation of the Family member at Government expense.

Space Available Travel

•Soldier acquired a Family member (married) after the effective date of the PCS order and is not entitled to transpiration of Family members at Government expense but may be authorized space-available transportation once command sponsorship is approved by the overseas command.

Command Sponsorship

- Must meet eligibility requirements to qualify 36-month tour or 12 months remaining after approval
- Dependent(s) must be on island to qualify
- Exceptions given for bona fide local residents

Student Travel

- An entitlement for Command Sponsored children of Active-Duty Soldiers stationed overseas (Hawaii) who are full time students attending an accredited college/university.
- One fully-funded round trip per fiscal year for dependent student between the student's school and the sponsor's duty station.
- Application should be submitted no later than 60 days
