

Soldier Movements

Reassignments

Permanent Change of Station (PCS)

- Soldiers with orders issued prior to 1 October 2025 are authorized to depart.
- Soldiers with orders issued on or after 1 October 2025 may depart only if assigned to an excepted activity.

Excepted Activities that allow Soldiers to PCS

- Initial Entry Training, Transition/Reclassification Training, language courses aligned with IET training paths, future Soldier prep courses, etc. as well as movement to first duty station following these courses are excepted.
- AMEDD, JAG, CYBER, HPSP, and Chaplain Direct Commission Courses
- Officer Candidate School
- Basic Officer Leader Courses as well as movement to first duty station
- Warrant Officer Candidate School, Fort Rucker, AL
- Warrant Officer Basic Courses
- Initial Entry Rotary Wing, Initial Entry Flight Wing, Instructor Pilot, and Maintenance Test Pilot Courses
- ARSOF Series 18, 37, and 38 training pathways; including assessment programs
- Advance Skill Training that is mandatory prior to assuming certain duty positions or assignments
- Drill Sergeant and Recruiter Training

Soldier Movements

Separations

- Voluntary / Involuntary Separations (Expiration Term of Service (ETS), Retirements, Chapters, and Medical)
 - If your separation orders are dated prior to 1 October 2025, you are authorized to continue outprocessing
 - Soldiers with separation or retirement orders issued before 1 October 2025 may proceed with outprocessing and departure without restriction

Separation date that has passed

- Soldiers without published separation orders prior to 30 September 2025 or earlier that will or have exceeded their ETS date, will be extended for 45 days to ensure access to benefits during the lapse in appropriations
- Separation orders cannot be issued during the shutdown; separation order with FY26 funding is not permitted until funding is restored

AER Government Shutdown Relief Loan: Currently offline for system improvements; expected return end of October.

Military Pay Issues: Active-Duty and National Guard (Title 10) and Army Reserve Soldiers who did not receive 15 Oct pay due to local pay processing issues should submit under Basic Needs – Housing & Family Support application.

- Must provide all required supporting documentation.

PCS-Related Financial Issues: Soldiers currently PCS'ing or with PCS-related hardships should submit under PCS Move (Active Duty & AGR Only) application.

Civilian Inquiries: Multiple GS and civilian calls requesting assistance; AER cannot support civilians (resource email distributed for external support options)

Career Skills Program (CSP): Application now available online for Soldiers preparing to transition.

AER Key Issues:

New Arrivals Without GOVCC: Unable to cover lodging/travel costs during PCS transitions to/from Hawaii.

Housing / Finance Processing Delays:

- CNAs and PCS Soldiers experiencing delays in BAH processing.
- Limited finance and housing operations impacting TLA disbursements.

High Food & Rent Requests: Soldiers requesting up to \$2,000 for food despite receiving pay; indicates *misunderstanding of AER intent*.

Dual Military / Civilian Households: Soldiers married to GS civilians requesting financial assistance to offset spouses missing pay.



Directorate of Public Works (DPW) Feral Animals on Installations

- USAG Hawaii Policy Memo #13 governs Animal Control on installations.
- Providing food, water, or shelter to stray, feral, or wild animals is prohibited (unless part of a USAG Hawaii authorized mission).
- Tampering with/damaging exclusion measures designed to keep feral animals and other pests from entering buildings and structures is prohibited.
- Community members have complained about pigs in the housing areas.
 Feeding these pigs makes their removal extremely difficult. Don't feed the pigs!
- Request removal of pigs via ArMA.
- DPW or an appropriately licensed Federal, State, or private contractor is responsible to capture and trap stray, feral, and wild animals.









Key Information

- Massive waves (30-50 ft) during winter months
- High risks for inexperienced surfers and swimmers
- Strong rip currents and rogue waves endanger beachgoers
- Annual deaths due to drowning and accidents
- Lifeguards and local authorities issue warnings during high surf

Trick or Treat Hours & Safety Tips

Safety Tips:

- 1. Always trick or treat in groups or with a trusted adult.
- 2. Stick to well-lit areas and use sidewalks whenever possible.
- 3. Make sure your costume doesn't obstruct your vision or cause tripping hazards.
- 4. Check all treats for any signs of tampering before eating.
- 5. Use reflective tape on costumes or carry a flashlight to be visible to drivers.
- 6. Stay on the lookout and be cautious when crossing the streets.
- 7. For those driving, please be extra cautious and keep an eye out for our little ghouls and goblins!



Scheduled Water Outages

Halloween is a fun and spooky time of the year for kids. Make trick-or-treat safe for your little monsters with a few easy safety tips.

VISIBILITY:

Provide children with flashlights or glow sticks to carry for lighting. Use reflective tape as part of their costume.

DECORATIONS:

Dried flowers, cornstalks, and crepe paper catch fire easily. Keep all decorations away from open flames and other heat sources, like light bulbs and heaters. Remember to keep exits clear of decorations, so nothing blocks escape routes.

Use battery-operated candles or glowsticks in jack-o-lanterns.

EATING THEIR TREATS:

Inspect all candy for any signs of tapering before allowing your little monster to eat it.

DRIVERS:

Slow down and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.

WALKING:

Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the side as possible.

Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks. Parents should remind children to watch for cars.

COSTUME:

When choosing a costume, make sure costume and accessories are fire retardant and stay away from long trailing fabric. If your child is wearing a mask, make sure the eye holes are large enough so he or she can see out.




