- Submits Levy Packet to S1
- S1 submits to MPD (Reassignments)

- MPD authorized to adjust report dates \pm 30 days; DA 4187/ signed by the first COL/O6 Cdr
- MPD authorized to defer report dates up to 60

- Curtailments/deferments cannot impede on the 11 Aug-15 Oct Brown Out Cut Over window

■ Transportation-PPPO

- 2.5 Weeks HHG pick-up (Standard)
- Projecting Backlog (May-July)

Military Dependents

☐ What Constitutes a Dependent

- Military Dependents: Family members sponsored by a military member for purposes of pay as well as special benefits and privileges



☐ Eligible Dependents Categories

- Spouse, Child (Step Child), Ward (Custody, Guardianship, Pre-Adoptive Ward), and Parents (Parent-in-law/Parents by Adoption)

Non-Command Sponsored Dependent

- Acquired dependent and does not meet Command Sponsorship **is not authorized transoceanic travel**; Dependent is authorized travel from Port of Embarkation to next PDS
- Unaccompanied Tour – Authorized Dependents located at CONUS designation is authorized transportation at government expense to next PDS

Command Sponsorship

- Must meet eligibility requirements to qualify 36-month tour or 12 months remaining after approval
- Dependent(s) must be ON island to qualify
- Exceptions given for Bona Fide local residents
- Command Sponsored Dependents are **authorized transportation** at Government expense from Hawaii to Soldier's next PDS

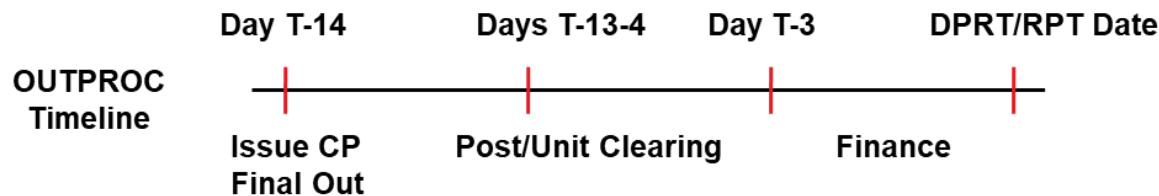
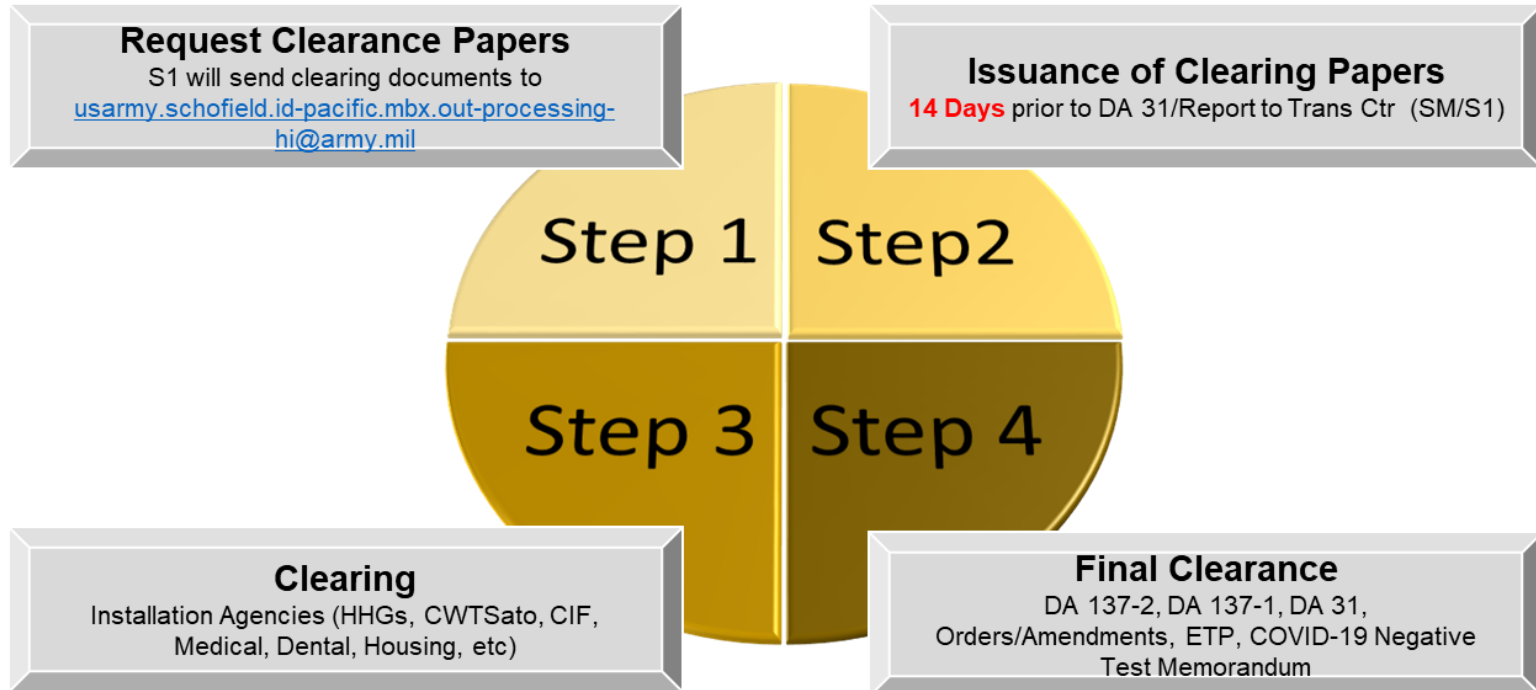

4 Overall Steps to Installation/Unit Clearance

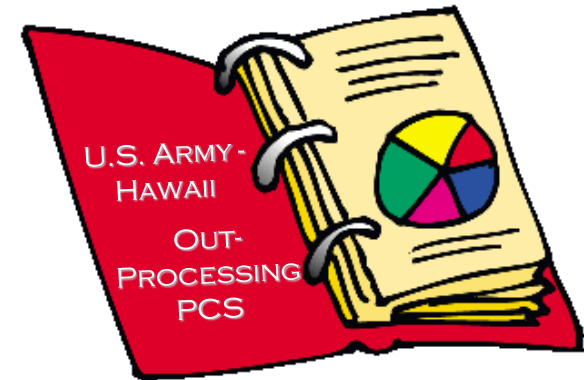

Installation/Unit Clearance

- ☐ All Soldiers within 30 days of Approved DA 31 Start Date
 - ISSUANCE of CLEARANCE PAPERS
 - 14 Days prior to DA 31 Start Date
 - Soldiers do not need clearing papers to initiate House Hold Goods or Plane Tickets
- ☐ Unit Commanders must designate a service member to clear the installation and Unit (DA 137-2, DA 137-1) in the absence of a service member.

Government Travel Charge Card

BAH/COLA



- ☐ GTCC will be used by all Government personnel, military, and civilian, to pay for costs incidents to official government travel unless exempt.
- ☐ **Serves as the primary payment method for official travel expenses**
- ☐ PCS orders are required to state whether transportation tickets are purchased using a Central Billed Account (CBA) or an Individual Billed Account (IBA)
- ☐ Travel orders are to include whether the traveler does, or does not, have a travel card

Failure to use GTCC

- *Will not be used as a basis for refusal to reimburse the traveler for appropriate charges
- *May subject the traveler to appropriate administrative or disciplinary action

*Government fares
requires a Government
Form of Payment*

Individually Billed Accounts (IBA)

- An IBA is an account issued to DoD personnel (military or civilian).
- An IBA is not for personal use; it is not transferable and will be used by the cardholder
- Will be used for all expenses associated with PCS up to the limit of their entitlements
- Payment is responsible by the individual

Centrally Billed Accounts (CBA)

- A CBA is a travel card account issued to a DoD activity.
- Issued to make travel arrangements and must be used in lieu of issuing an Optional Form (OF) 1169, Government Transportation Request, for payment purposes.
- Payment is responsible by the government

Exemptions from the Mandatory Use of GTCC

- DoD personnel (military or civilian) who have an application pending for the travel card
- Individuals traveling on an invitational travel order/authorization
- New appointees/recruits
- Individuals who are denied travels cards or whose cards have been canceled/suspended

Passports

Requirements

- ☐ Passports are issued for PCS moves for the following:
 - Soldiers (if assignment requires)
 - Dependents (if accompanying Soldier on PCS that requires passport)
 - US citizens
 - DOD Civilians and their dependents (if required by country PCSing to)
*Individual must be a US citizen or naturalized to process application.

Complete the Form Fill version of the form. Upon completion, print out the form. A bar code will appear on the first page, top left corner. **DO NOT SIGN THE APPLICATION!** Passport Agent will verify documents and witness signature during the interview process.

- ☐ Provide only original documents. If submitting a DS11 (Initial Request) – Submit (1) original birth certificate/naturalization certificate, (2) copy of Mil ID (front/back on one side), (3) Two – 2x2 photos, and (3) copy of PCS orders listing dependents.
- ☐ If submitting a DS82 (Renewal Request) – Submit (1) passport, (2) copy of Mil ID (front/back on one side), (3) Two – 2x2 photos, and (4) copy of PCS orders listing dependents.

 - *Without Orders we CANNOT see you & Name, Rank, SSN, Dependents must be CORRECT*
- **COMPLETE Personal Property Pre-counseling Worksheet**

Action Required:

- **COMPLETE 'DPS'** (<https://dps.move.mil/cust>) & **EMAIL ORDERS** to PPPO Group email,
- **Request (1-on-1) appointment, validation, or group briefing**

Transportation-PPPO will:

- **EMAIL worksheet** (if needed) & **schedule accordingly** (based on type of Orders)
- **Conduct counseling for T&TE** (Transportation & Travel Entitlements)
 - *HHG / UB shipment –or- PPM, NTS (Long-term storage), POV shipment, and Travel Slip*
 - *Complete process for shipment requests, upload & submit in DPS to JPPSO (booking office)*

Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA)

✓ Eligibility

- E6 and above
- E1 - E5 with command sponsorship for dependent(s)
- Service Member with a valid Certificate of Non-availability (CNA)
 - NOTE: If your CNA is expired, see your Barracks Unit Representative ASAP

✓ Departure TLA

- When authorized, not to exceed the last 10 days on island
- TLA is NOT paid while Service Member is on leave status
- Household goods must be picked up
- Flight Itinerary required
- Retirees and Service Members who separate from service and stay on Hawaii, with plans to move at a later date are ineligible for TLA

Secretarial Process

✓ A Secretarial Waiver

- Is required for Departure TLA for command sponsored dependent(s) who remain on island because of a Soldier's:
 - TDY
 - Unaccompanied Tour
 - Dependent Restricted Tour
- See ALARACT Message 097/2016 or current policy to request the waiver from HQ DA DCS, G-1
- The waiver is not retroactive

 - Cleaning requirements
 - Bulk items and refuse
 - Payments due at the end of the tenancy and how IPC will issue refunds

- All out=processing begins at Troop Immunizations, DDHC BLDG 679
- Soldiers **must be in a military uniform** IAW USARHAW Policy #16
- Begin Retirement/ETS exams 6 months prior to the start of terminal leave
- DDHC **cannot** sign off on clearance papers without the Separation History and Physical Exam, PHA, and Dental Exam

- Available during business hours; no appointment necessary

- Do not pack important documents in HHG.
- Document, document, document.

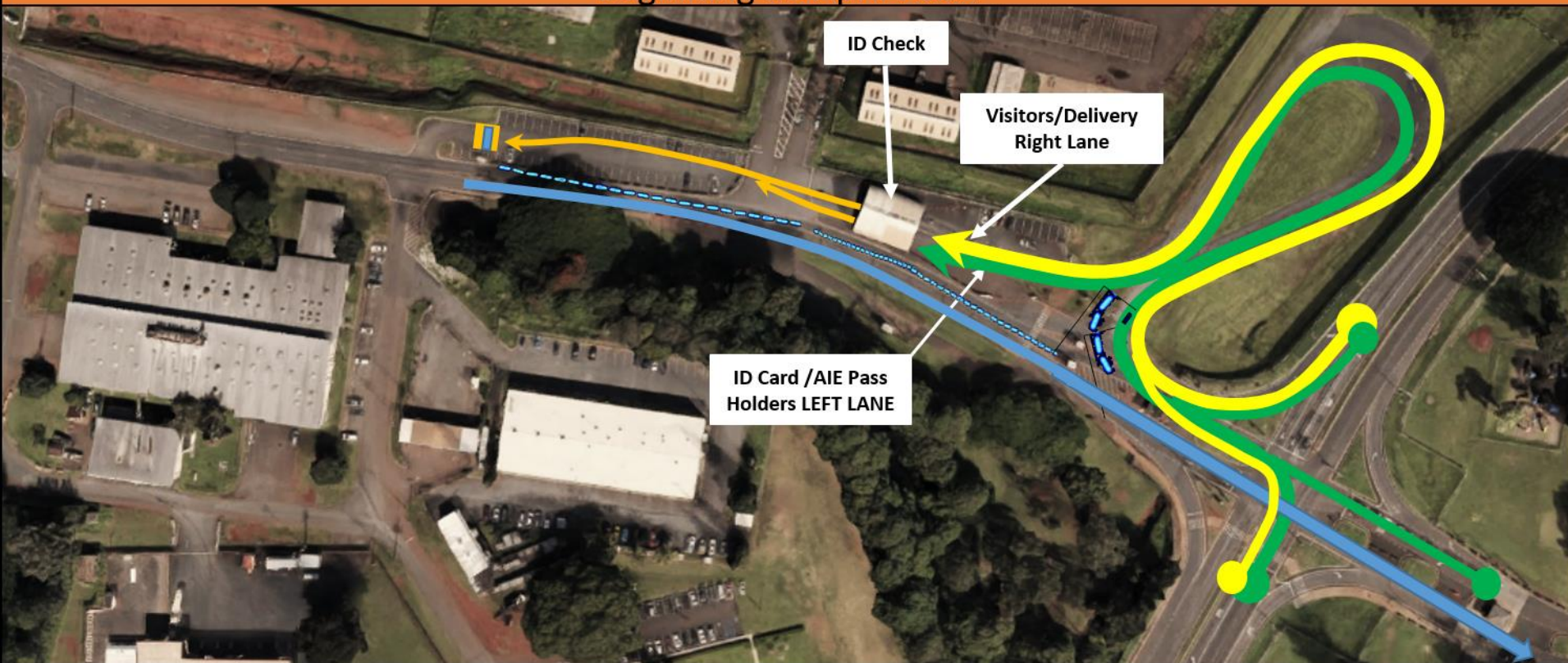
Abandoned Vehicles ICW PCS Moves

- Abandoning a Vehicle on a Military Installation could result in UCMJ or Administrative Action; Off post = monetary fine
- DOD shipped vehicles must meet requirements that a private shipper may not require; preparation is key
- Service members must provide proof that there are no open recalls during turn in before the vehicle will be accepted for shipment
- Service member must present letter of authorization to ship from lien holder if applicable; if no lien holder the service member must show proof of ownership / title
- Per USDA standards, vehicle must be thoroughly cleaned and pass an inspection of both entire and exterior
- Vehicle must be in safe and operable condition
- No cracks/chips on windows that affect safe operation
- Service members who cannot meet requirements to ship a POV or sell it are encouraged to turn in the vehicle to avoid abandonment

Changes Coming to Lyman Gate Beginning 18 April 2022



Lyman Gate Traffic

— Visitors/Delivery

— ID Card/AIE Pass

All traffic coming from Wheeler (Kunia Gate) to Schofield Barracks will be required to present their ID.

- All traffic entering Lyman gate will be directed around the loop to the right and under the canopy, where they will present their ID
- All DoD ID Card Holders, or AIE Pass holders will enter using the left hand lane
- All visitors and delivery/commercial vehicles will enter using the right hand lane

Kunia Gate Traffic

— Crossover from Schofield to Wheeler

- Crossover Traffic travelling to Wheeler from Schofield will be allowed from 0530-1800. After 1800, all traffic will have to present their ID cards when entering Wheeler.

- Parking in the Resale Lot **requires a permit**. The minimum fee for this permit is \$10 for 7 days. Prices will vary depending on the length of stay.
- You must bring the following items to the Schofield Barracks Auto Skills Center (Bldg. 910) located on Duck Road to obtain a Resale Lot Permit:
 - Valid government ID card
 - Valid state registration and license plate sticker
 - Valid state safety inspection papers and stickers
 - Valid proof of insurance Hawaii "No Fault" insurance card

Note: Power of attorney is required if you are not the registered owner.

- ✓ **Purpose:** to provide assistance with Pet Transportation for eligible individuals to reduce the financial burden on Soldiers and Families during a Permanent Change of Station.

General Guidelines

- ✓ Eligibility includes Soldiers on Active Duty, Members of the Reserve Component of the Army (National Guard and Army Reserve under Title 10 U.S.C) on Active Guard and Reserve tours and Member of the Reserve Component of the Army (National Guard and Army Reserve) activated with PCS Entitlements.
- ✓ Assistance will be provided as a Loan only up to \$5,500.
- ✓ Soldier must show proof of ownership through official license and veterinarian records.

- ✓ AER Application Form 101
- ✓ Current End of Month LES
- ✓ ERB/ORB
- ✓ Budget Worksheet
- ✓ PCS Orders
- ✓ Proof of Pet Ownership
- ✓ Estimate of pet travel costs

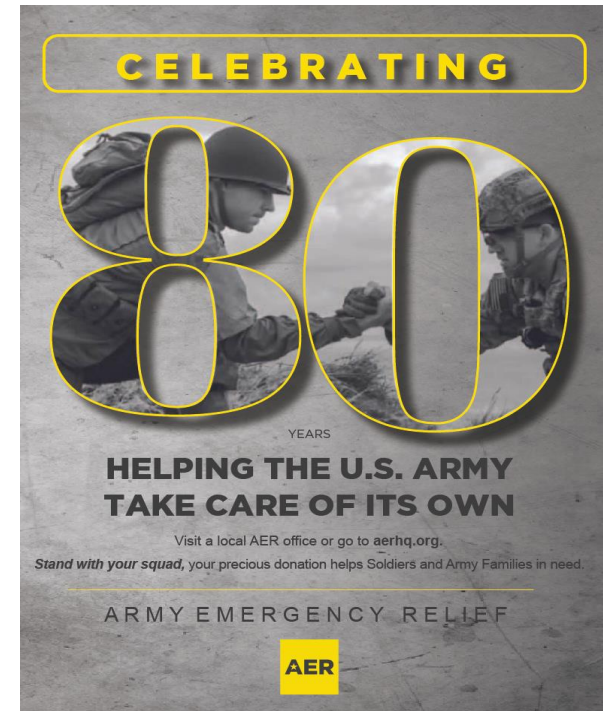

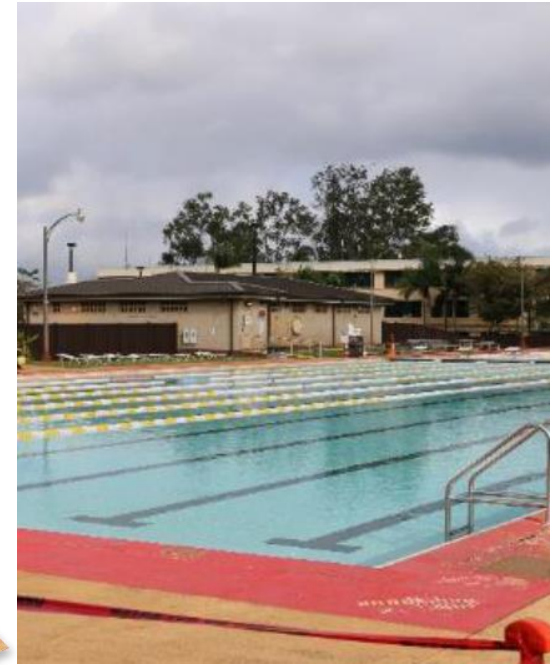

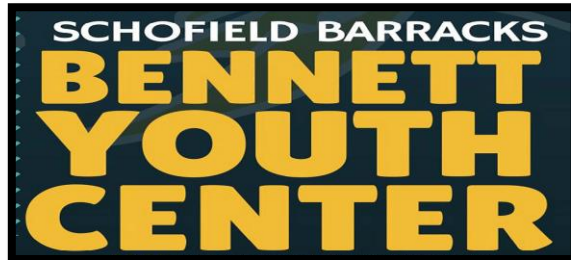

When CYS cannot provide care within 45 days of the date care is required a statement of non-availability is provided so that families can apply for fee assistance.

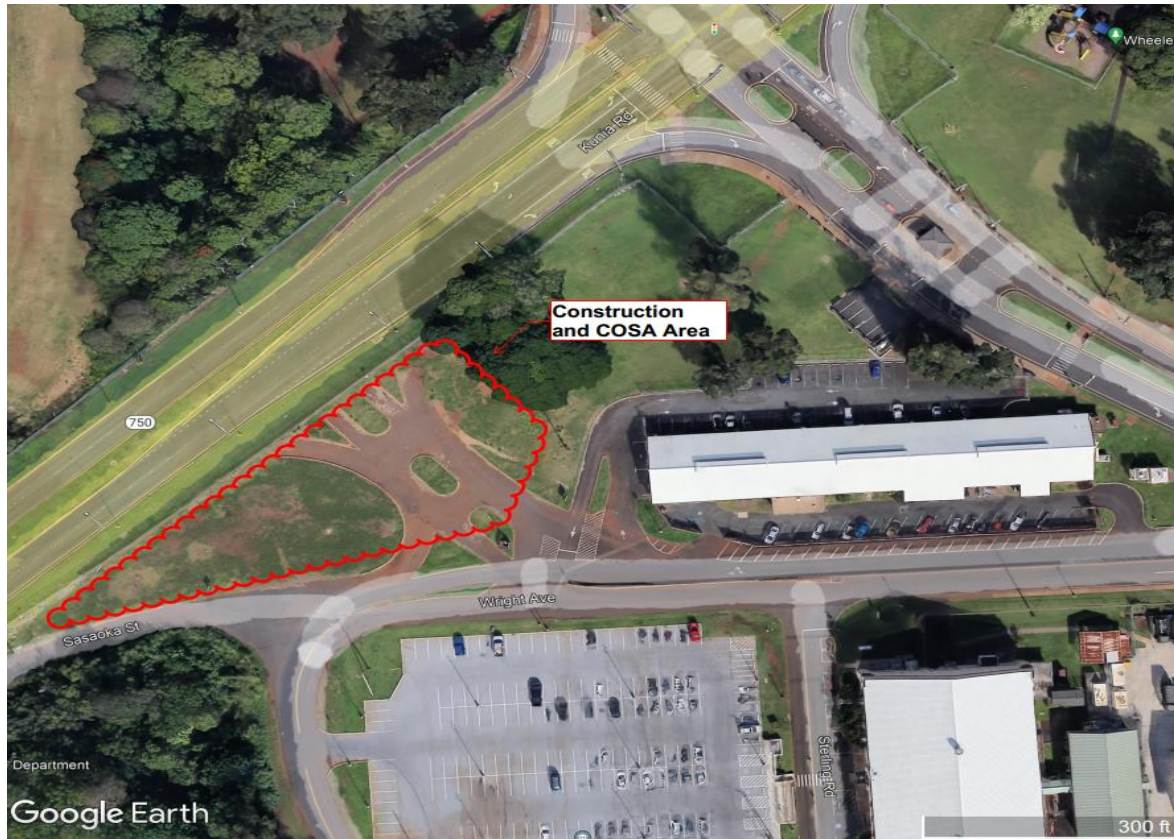

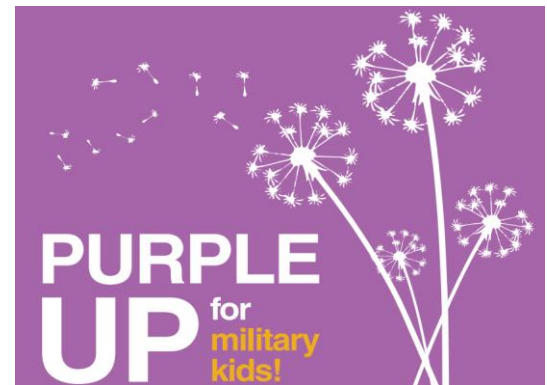

In-Home Child Care Fee Assistance Pilot Program

The Department of Defense is committed to ensuring service members and their families have access to the child care they need to be mission ready. To help with expanding child care needs, the DOD is starting a small pilot program to explore providing fee assistance for full-time, in-home child care services.

In-home providers must successfully complete requirements for background checks and complete 32 hours of training covering topics including CPR and first aid, child abuse prevention, safe sleep and care for children with special needs, if needed. Space in the pilot program is limited. To learn more, please visit:

Families may use the expanded child care service available through Military OneSource to search for in-home providers.

Reach out to Military OneSource tax consultants if you have questions about tax implications for parents who employ care providers in their home.

The fee assistance pilot program will cover full-time care for a minimum of 30 hours to a maximum of 60 hours of child care weekly. Care is not limited to Monday through Friday or time of day.

In its first year, the pilot program will be open in five regions that have high demand and the longest waitlists for child care. These locations are the National Capital Region; Hawaii; San Diego, CA; Norfolk, VA; and San Antonio, TX. Military Families currently on the MilitaryChildCare.com waitlist or requesting child care via MilitaryChildCare.com in the five selected regions are eligible to participate in the pilot program.

Eligibility requirements include:

- Single or dual Active Duty members
- Single or dual Guard or Reserve members on active duty
- Active Duty members with a full-time working spouse
- Guard or Reserve members on active duty with a full-time working spouse
- Active Duty members with a spouse enrolled in a postsecondary institution on a full-time basis
- Guard or Reserve members on active duty with a spouse enrolled in a postsecondary institution on a full-time basis

Families will be responsible for finding their own in-home child care providers. Providers must be U.S. citizens and:

- Be at least 18 years of age
- Hold a high school diploma or equivalent
- Read, speak and write English

Home Alone

Birth to age 9: No

Age 10-11: Yes, up to 4 hrs. in a 24-hr period (not overnight) w/access to adult

Age 12-13: Yes, up to 6 hrs. in a 24-hr period (not overnight) w/access to adult

Age 14-15: Yes, but not overnight. No longer than 9 hours with ready access to adult supervision

Age 16-17: Yes, no more than two consecutive overnight periods with access to adult supervision



Unattended Outside

Birth to age 5: No

Age 6-9: Yes, if in a playground/yard w/ immediate access to adult supervision (to include being within sight and hearing distance). Children 6 years old and older are exempt from the "outside unattended" rule when walking to and from school, school bus stop, or CYS activity. Walk cannot be longer than 1 mile or cross a busy street.

Age 10-11: Yes, with ready access to adult supervision. Sponsors checks on child or child checks in hourly. Adult must respond within 30 minutes or less to a child in crisis.

Age 12-13: Yes, with ready access to adult supervision. Sponsors checks on child or child checks in via phone or in person every 2 hrs., must know child's location/activity, and respond within 1hr .

Age 14-15: Yes, with access to adult supervision via phone within 2 hrs. Contact made every 3 hrs. Follow curfew.

Age 16-17: Yes, follow curfew guidance.

Babysitting Siblings & Other Children

Birth to 10: No

Age 11: Yes, may only care for siblings age 6 and older. Not to exceed 3 hrs.

Age 12-13: Up to 6 hrs. with access to adult.

Children must be age 2 and older.

Age 14-15: Up to 9 hrs. (not overnight) with access to adult. Non-siblings must be age 2 and older

Age 16-17: Yes

Unattended In Car

Birth to age 6): No

Age 7-9: Yes, up to 10 minutes if the keys have been removed and hand brake applied

Age 10-11: Yes, up to 20 minutes, keys removed and handbrake applied

Age 12-17: Yes

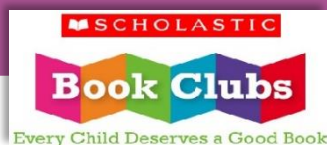

PARENT CENTRAL SERVICES Registration Requirements for CYS Services

- ❖ Official shot record with a Negative TB test result (12 months and older) or TB Document F: State of Hawaii TB Clearance Form, signed & stamped by a Licensed Practitioner.
- ❖ Flu shot is required for children enrolled in FULL DAY CARE. The deadline for the Flu Shot will be December 31st of each year. Children who are 6 months or older, or have never had the flu shot will receive the first half of the shot and the second half 30 days later.
- ❖ CYS Services Health Assessment (due within 30 days of registration).
- ❖ If your child has special needs (i.e. asthma, diet restrictions/intolerances, seizures, ADHD, Diabetes, Autism, Eczema, Behavioral concerns, etc.) additional forms will need to be submitted. Contact one of our offices for details.
- ❖ Two local emergency contacts (adults other than parents or legal guardian).

- It is Army policy that if an individual has a government travel card, it will be used for all relocation expenses up to the limit of their entitlements. DHR - Family Travel Office

Due to the COVID travel restrictions, the process to request orders for all Government Funded Travel now requires additional steps. (Early Return of Dependent, Dependent Travel, Space A Travel and Student Travel.)

All Government Funded Travel requests are processed as follows:

1. Service Member submits the packet to their Chain of Command (packet checklists provided on the Garrison Webpage)
2. Chain of Command submits the packet to Schofield Family Travel Section Military-Personnel Division (SFTS-MPD)
3. After tentatively approving the request for travel, the SFTS-MPD provides the S-1 a Memorandum to be used as a justification to request a Travel Exception to Policy (ETP) signed by the first General Officer in the Chain of Command.
4. Chain of Command submits the signed ETP to SFTS-MPD
5. SFTS-MPD then provides the final order to S-1 and Service Member

Transportation and Carlson Wagon-lit (SATO) will require a copy of the final orders and signed Travel ETP to book HHG shipments and flights
