



BUILD A KIT

Include enough food, water, and medical supplies for your needs in your emergency kit to last for at least 72 hours.







3 Key Steps



1. Get a Kit

- Food and water for 14 days
- Blankets and change of clothes
- Flashlight, batteries, and first aid kit
- Personal hygiene items
- Reusable plastic plates, cups, and eating utensils

- Items specific to your needs (eye glasses, medication, diapers, food and water for pets)
- Important family documents in a waterproof container
- Cash or traveler's checks
- Local maps







3 Key Steps (continued)



2. Make a Plan

- Think of the 5 Ws who,
 what, where, when and why
- Know where your closest shelter or safe haven is
- Making a plan is the first step; you must practice and adjust to meet your family's needs



3. Be Informed

- Mobile Alerts from the Army, HNL.info
- State siren and installation giant voice system
- Garrison website, social media and Digital Garrison (app)
- TV/Radio broadcasts

Emergency Preparedness

Before Emergencies

- Create an emergency kit for your family, and make sure to include:
 - First Aid Kit with at least a week's worth of medication & copies of current prescriptions
 - Contact info for your medical providers & specialists
 - Insurance cards and IDs
 - FEMA Emergency Kit: <u>www.fema.gov/press-release/20210318/hot-to-build-kit-emergency</u>

During Emergencies

- Once the government declares a State of Emergency, TRICARE offers certain benefits. TRICARE will release a disaster alert providing additional details including available benefits and affected areas
- Prescription Refills
 - Take your prescription bottle to any TRICARE retail network pharmacy. Visit www.express-scripts.com/TRICARE/pharmacy/ to find the nearest location
- Blanket Referral Waivers
 - For when you're displaced during a disaster and cannot access your PCM
 - If a referral waiver is in place, you may not need a referral from your PCM to see a TRICARE authorized provider.

After Emergencies

- Maintain copies of medical records for care received during the disaster
- File any required claims in a timely manner
- Contact TRICARE West with any questions at 844-866-9378

Accessing Medical Care

- In the event Military Treatment Facilities are closed, beneficiaries have options for care:
 - If you are having a medical emergency, dial 9-1-1 or proceed immediately to the nearest open Emergency Room
 - Nurse Advice Line 24/7 800-874-2273, Press 1 to speak with a registered nurse
 - DrOnDemand 24/7 Download the DrOnDemand app, fill out the required information, and enjoy access to a licensed health care provider from anywhere you have an internet connection. Unlimited authorization for dependents, ADSM require a referral
 - Keep copies of medical records for care received outside of your Primary Care Manager or Military Treatment Facility

- On June 9th, the Acute Care Clinic will be closed until 3 p.m. If there is an emergency during the closure, call 911 or proceed to your nearest emergency room.

Obtaining a COVID-19 Test

- On 25 April, the DDHC COVID-19 drive-through testing garage closed.
- If you need a COVID-19 test, send your provider a secure message via MHS Genesis or call the COVID Hotline (808-433-8102) to request an order for a test. A staff member will contact you to schedule your test.
- On 25 April, the Fort Shafter Flats testing site reduced its hours of operation to Tuesday & Friday from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. Pre-surgical and pre-procedural testing will be conducted on those days. Symptomatic patients requiring testing can receive a test at the TAMC Emergency Department.

COVID-19 Test Results

- Results are typically available within 24-48 hours, but patients may experience a slight delay if demand for COVID-19 testing increases. The fastest way to receive your results is through the MHS Genesis Patient Portal. If you do not have access to the Patient Portal, register for a DS login at https://dmdc.osd.mil/milconnect.

Emergency Preparedness: Claims

For Those Living On-Post

- ✓On-Post Housing: Since May 2019, the Army no longer pays claims for unusual occurrences under the Personnel Claims Act when the damage is caused by flood, hurricane, earthquake, or other acts of nature or weather phenomena.
- ✓ What that means: Maintain private insurance against personal property losses caused by adverse weather and other hazards.

All Homeowners or Renters

- ✓ If you are renting, renters' insurance may be for you.
- ✓ Flood insurance is usually a SEPARATE policy from other homeowners' or renters' insurance policy.
- ✓ To help with insurance claims, take photos or video of all valuables, belongings, and structures to document the existing conditions.





Emergency Preparedness: Legal Assistance

- ✓ Ensure your important documents are protected in waterproof/fireproof containers that can be easily gathered if you need to evacuate.
 - Passports
 - Social security cards
 - IDs
 - Birth certificates

- Deeds
- Wills
- Powers of attorney
- ✓ The Legal Assistance Office can assist with powers of attorney if you need someone to make a claim for you.
- ✓ We generally CANNOT make certified/true copies of government records, such as marriage/birth/death certificates. Government certified documents must come from the originating office. Request extra copies from those agencies ahead of time.


Mobilization, Deployment & Stability Support Operations





Know the Rules

A 10-hour child care limit has been established by the Department of the Army to protect children from being in unregulated child care settings on a regular basis.

This means any Family member living in government quarters providing child care for more than 10 child care hours per week on a regular basis must be certified as a Family Child Care provider.





A - Zone A is the flood insurance rate zone that corresponds to the 1-percent annual chance floodplains that are determined in the Flood Insurance Study by approximate methods of analysis. Because detailed hydraulic analyses are not performed for such areas, no Base Flood Elevations or depths are shown within this zone. Mandatory flood insurance purchase requirements apply.

X - Zone X is the flood insurance rate zones that correspond to areas outside the 1-percent annual chance floodplain and areas protected from the 1-percent annual chance flood by levees. No Base Flood Elevations or depths are shown within this zone. Insurance purchase is not required in these zones.


High Flood Areas

No Base Flood Elevations or depths are shown within this zone. Insurance purchase is not required in these zones.

AE - Zones AE is the flood insurance rate zones that correspond to the 1-percent annual chance floodplains that are determined in the Flood Insurance Study by detailed methods of analysis. In most instances, Base Flood Elevations derived from the detailed hydraulic analyses are shown at selected intervals within this zone. Mandatory flood insurance purchase requirements apply.

AO - Zone AO is the flood insurance rate zone that corresponds to the areas of 1-percent shallow flooding (usually sheet flow on sloping terrain) where average depths are between 1 and 3 feet. Average flood depths derived from the detailed hydraulic analyses are shown within this zone. In addition, alluvial fan flood hazards are shown as Zone AO on the Flood Insurance Rate Map. Mandatory flood insurance purchase requirements apply.




D - **Zone D** designation is used for **areas where there are possible but undetermined flood hazards**. In areas designated as Zone D, no analysis of flood hazards has been conducted. **Mandatory flood insurance purchase requirements do not apply**, but coverage is available. The flood insurance rates for properties in Zone D are commensurate with the uncertainty of the flood risk.

Emergency Preparedness

Hurricane Season

We start building the orders early in the support of a natural disaster. The Exchange does have a process in place and plans for events like this for the Hawaii Consolidated.

- ✓ Located in our Hardware area, we have an endcap with supplies for hurricane emergency preparedness. These items include:
 - Batteries, Flashlights, Tarps and Zip Ties






Abandoned Vehicles Tips and Tricks

Prevention:

- Don't buy a vehicle with questionable or missing documents or obvious defects. This may lead to difficulty registering.
- Don't take on a "project" car. The best plans rarely survive first contact.
- Bring a car-take a car.

Maintenance:

- Use the Auto Skills Center to DIY and source issues before they cause problems. They conduct state inspections and offer sound advice.
- Perform regular pre-inspections to stay ahead prior to due date.

Final Thoughts:

- Abandoning a Vehicle on a military installation could result in UCMJ or administrative action; Off post = monetary fine.
- Reference abandoned vehicles USARHAW Regulation 190-5





Soldiers (E1-O6)

- ✓ Soldiers must log onto the Army Career Trackers Total Army Sponsorship Program to initiate DA Form 5434 and request a sponsor.
- ✓ Units are required to assign a sponsor 120 days prior to report date.

Department of Army Civilians

✓ DA Civilians can fill out the PDF version of the DA Form 5434 and email it to their gaining organization.








DHR - Transition Assistance Program (TAP)



DHR - Reassignment Office

- Process & Publish the Following:
 - ✓ PCS Orders
 - ✓ IPCOT/COT Travel Orders
 - ✓ Excess Leave Orders
 - ✓ Confinement Transfer Orders
 - ✓ Deletion or Deferment of Assignments- Non PSDR units



- Levy Notifications are sent within 5 days of MPD receiving notification of assignment via CAP Cycle. MPD notifies via email to the Soldier, S1, and SGM/CSM. Soldiers are to complete the Levy Packet NLT 30 days from notification.
- Orders are published up to <u>6 Months</u> from departure date, if all required documents are submitted to include the PCS ETP. S1 submits completed Levy Packets to: usarmy.schofield.id-pacific.list.reassignments-hi@mail.mil
- Reassignments Office provides S1's and SGM/CSMs a Missing Documents log weekly.
- It is Army policy that if an individual has a government travel card, it will be used for all relocation expenses up to the limit of their entitlements. A centrally billed account is only available for Soldiers who do not have a government travel card. Account type must be indicated to Reassignments Office prior to orders being cut.

DHR - Family Travel Office

Due to the COVID travel restrictions, the process to request orders for all Government Funded Travel now requires additional steps. (Early Return of Dependent, Dependent Travel, Space A Travel and Student Travel.)

All Government Funded Travel requests are processed as follows:

- 1. Service Member submits the packet to their Chain of Command (packet checklists provided on the Garrison Webpage)
- 2. Chain of Command submits the packet to Schofield Family Travel Section Military-Personnel Division (SFTS-MPD)
- 3. After tentatively approving the request for travel, the SFTS-MPD provides the S-1 a Memorandum to be used as a justification to request a Travel Exception to Policy (ETP) signed by the first General Officer in the Chain of Command.
- 4. Chain of Command submits the signed ETP to SFTS-MPD
- 5. SFTS-MPD then provides the final order to S-1 and Service Member

Transportation and Carlson Wagon-lit (SATO) will require a copy of the final orders and signed Travel ETP to book HHG shipments and flights

Early Return of Dependents

 Only used for unusual/emergency circumstances like marital difficulties, financial difficulties, divorce, hardship, etc.

Dependent Travel

 The Soldier acquired a Family member (married) before the effective date of the PCS order & is entitled to transportation of the Family member at Government expense.

Space Available Travel

•Soldier acquired a Family member (married) after the effective date of the PCS order and is not entitled to transpiration of Family members at Government expense but may be authorized space-available transportation once command sponsorship is approved by the overseas command.

Command Sponsorship

- Must meet eligibility requirements to qualify 36-month tour or 12 months remaining after approval
- Dependent(s) must be on island to qualify
- Exceptions given for bona fide local residents

Student Travel

- An entitlement for Command Sponsored children of Active-Duty Soldiers stationed overseas (Hawaii) who are full time students attending an accredited college/university.
- One fully-funded round trip per fiscal year for dependent student between the student's school and the sponsor's duty station.
- Application should be submitted no later than 60 days
