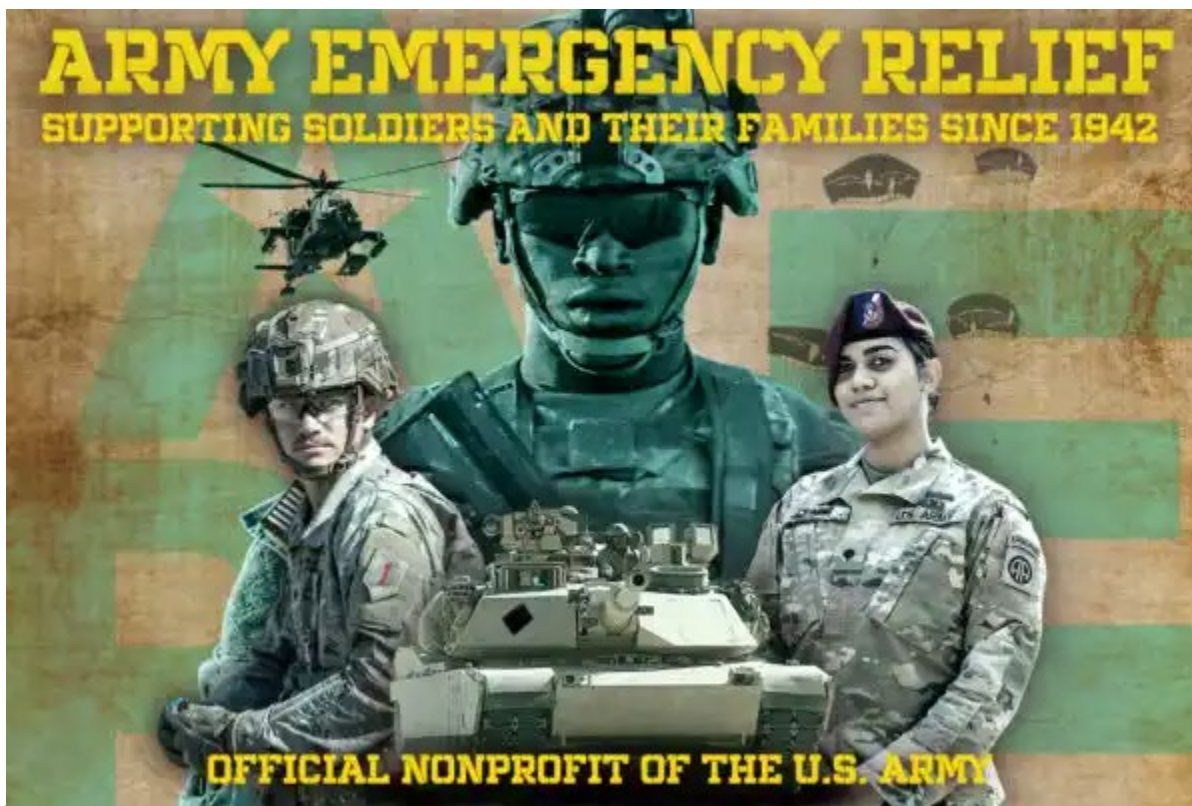

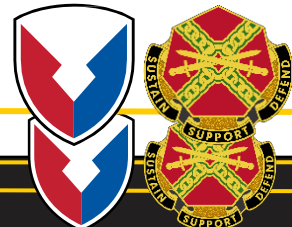

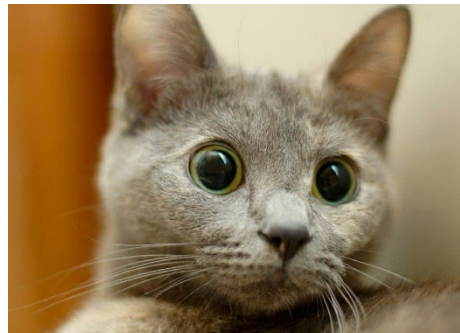
Pet Expenses Due to a PCS

In accordance with JTR, para 050107:

A Service member on a PCS order with an effective date of January 1, 2024 or later, as defined in Appendix A, may be authorized reimbursement for the costs related to the relocation of one household pet that arises from a permanent change of station.

A household pet is a **cat** or a **dog**, owned for personal companionship.

A Service member is responsible for following rules for importing and exporting a pet to and from the United States in order to be eligible for reimbursement. Denial of entry could result in denial of reimbursement.



Free Application for Financial Aid (FAFSA)

The FAFSA is the form you fill out to get any financial aid from the federal government to help pay for college and it's FREE to apply!

You may qualify for grants, scholarships, loans, and/or work-study.

Apply/renew every year; changes happening to the 2024-2025 application!

Check with your college about deadlines.

OCONUS to OCONUS moves & Command Sponsorship

Dependent Travel

- The Soldier acquired a Family member (married) before the effective date of the PCS order & is entitled to transportation of the Family member at Government expense.

Command Sponsorship

- Must meet eligibility requirements to qualify 36-month tour or 12 months remaining after approval
- Dependent(s) must be on island to qualify
- Exceptions given for bona fide local residents

❖ **E-EFMP (Medical Screening)**

- Required for all dependents traveling OCONUS
- Dependent Travel and Command Sponsorship
- Travel orders processing

❖ **E-EFMP medical screenings are required:**

- OCONUS PCS moves
- Dependent Travel and Command Sponsorship

❖ **Outbound Assignments (Transoceanic Travel of dependents on PCS orders)**

- Proof of Dependent Travel /Command Sponsorship
- Recent Trends - Leaving island

USAG – HI Potable Water Service

System Monitoring and Service Interruption Process

On the island of Oahu, U.S. Army Garrison – Hawaii operates and maintains four Public Water Systems (PWS) regulated by the Hawaii Department of Health. Three of the four PWS contain ground water extraction, treatment, and distribution. Potable water systems (i.e. pumps, pipes, treatment) are maintained by the Directorate of Public Works (DPW). U.S. Army Garrison – Hawaii also procure water at various locations from the Board of Water Supply and the Navy.

Water Systems Monitoring – are continuously operated via SCADA¹ 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. During non-duty hours, an operator is maintained on call, and called in via a SCADA alarm system.

Unscheduled Water Service Interruptions – are usually caused by water pipe breaks.

- Water leaks are usually detected by:
 - ✓ The SCADA system, or
 - ✓ Reports from community members; can visually see the water leak.
- Repairs are always with attempts to minimize the outage area by isolation of system at point of break/leak.

Scheduled Water Service Interruptions – are usually conducted due to scheduled infrastructure maintenance and repairs. Examples:

- Preventative Maintenance – valve checks and services.
- Construction of a new water tank on Schofield Barracks – testing and tie in plan and execution.
 - ✓ Scheduled with contractor two weeks prior to the scheduled outage.
 - ✓ Community notification – goal is 7 days advance announcement.

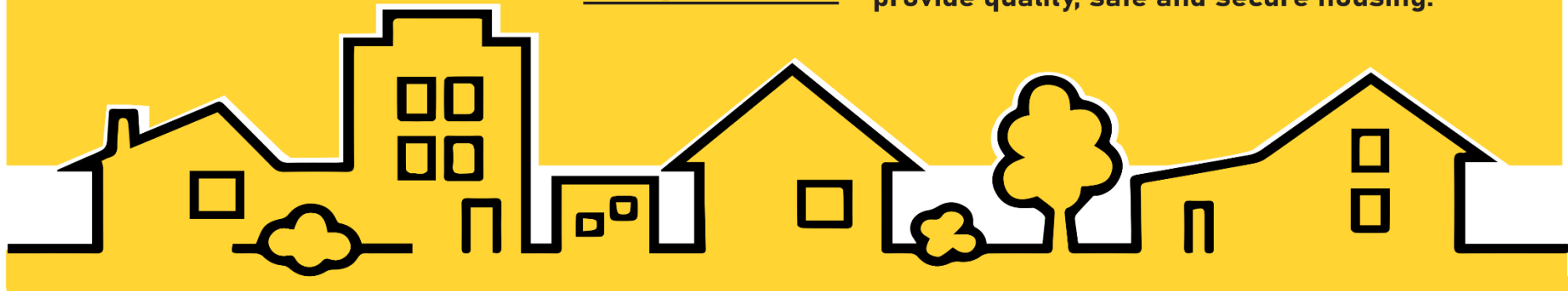

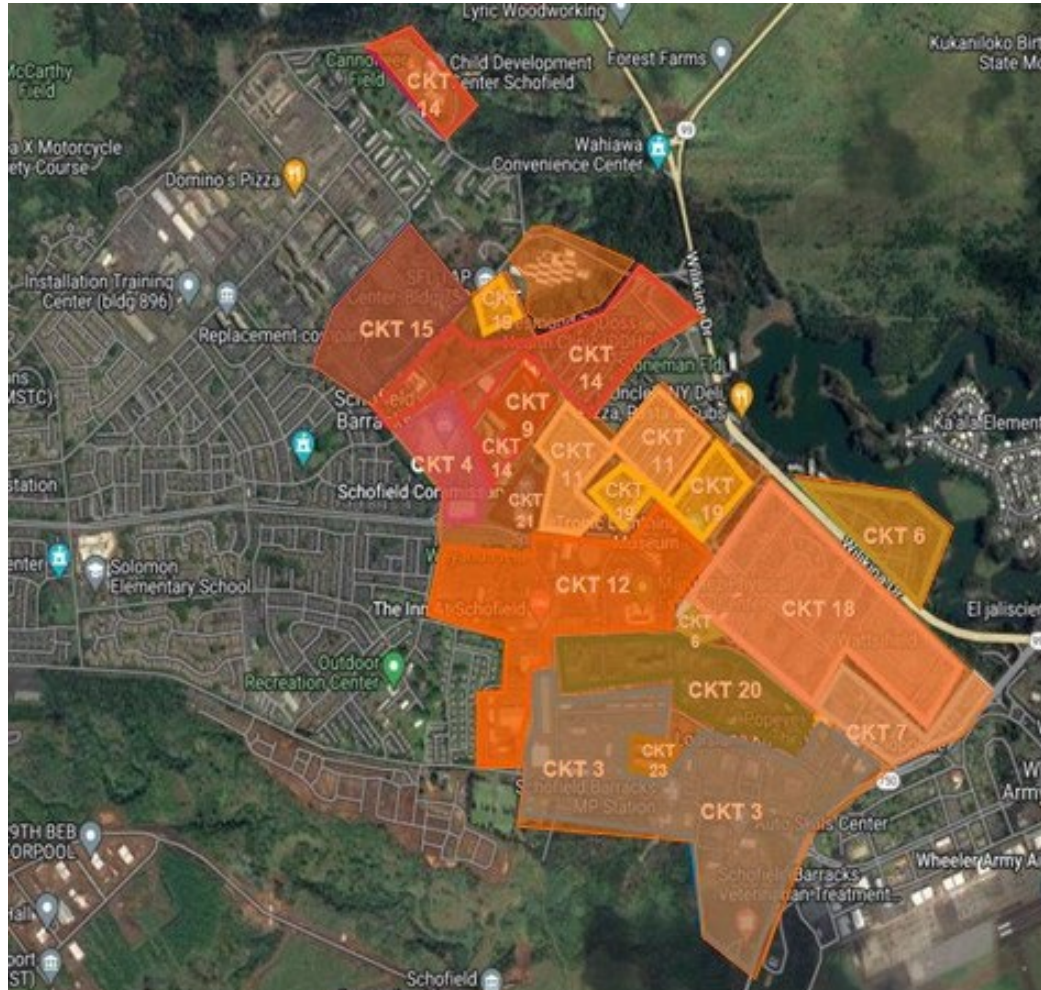

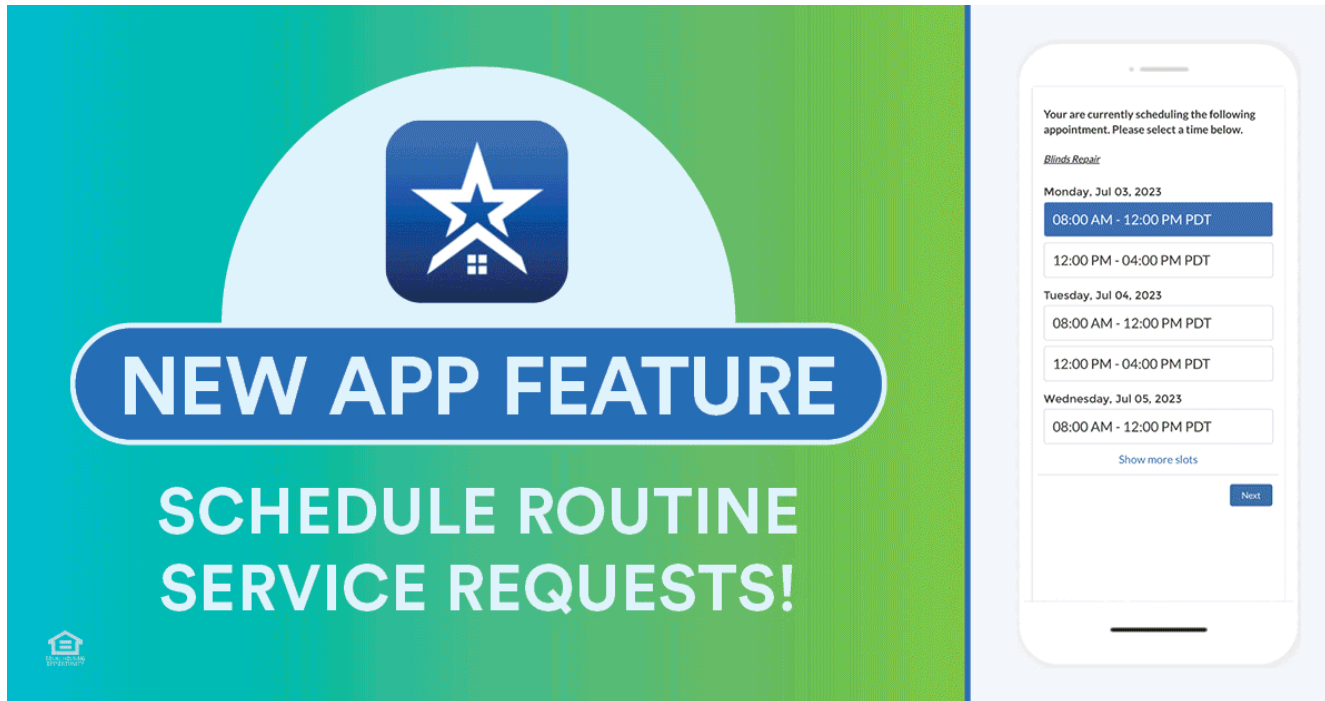
- ❖ What is an Emergency Service Request?
 - Break in water, utility outage, unable to secure door or window.
- ❖ What is an Urgent Service Request?
 - Considered not an emergency, but requires quick attention such as contained water leaks, one of two or more toilets or sinks clogged or a partial power loss.
- ❖ What is a Routine Service Request?
 - Any Service Order Request that does not meet the definition of emergency or urgent service calls and can be scheduled at a time that is convenient for our Residents' schedule.
 - Note: All HVAC Service Requests are considered Routine (Residents with approved Reasonable Accommodation requests are escalated as a priority.)

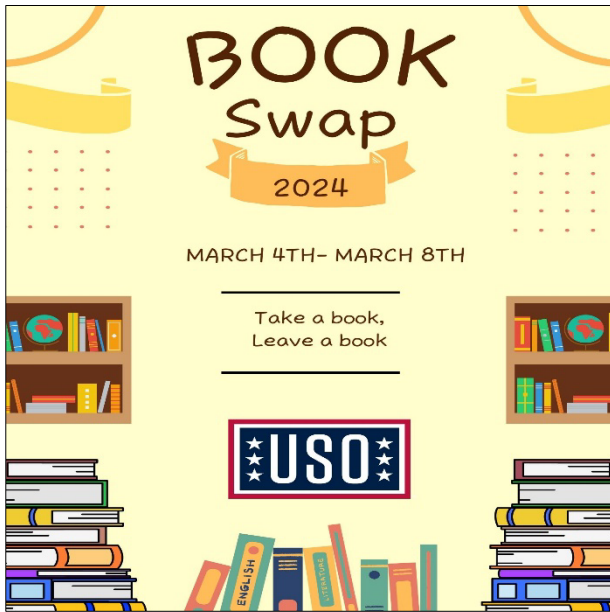

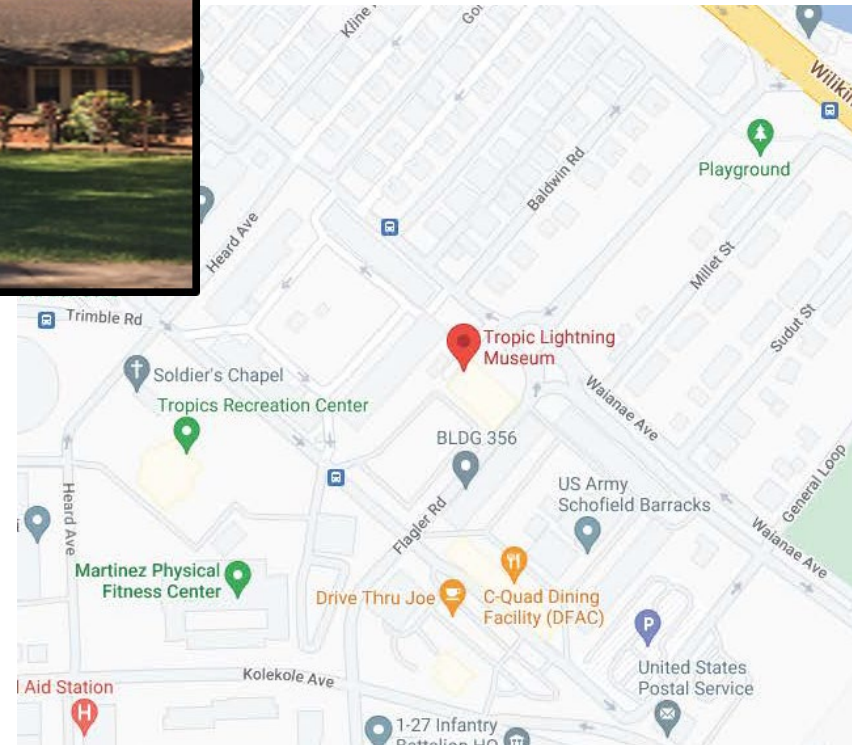

General Emergency TLA Information

- TLA was approved for the Schofield Barracks power outage from 16 Jan to 19 Jan 2024 by COL McGunegle, Garrison Commander
- Service members that were authorized emergency TLA received an individual TLA Authorization Memo from Housing Services for Meals Only or Meals and Lodging, or both
- Documents required by the Army Military Pay Office for payment:
 - TLA Approval Memo from Housing Services with Control Number
 - Itemized \$0 balance hotel receipt (as applicable)
 - PCS orders, command sponsorship memo, birth certificate to verify the number of eligible dependents on the housing memo
- OCOLA rate is verified prior to payment
 - Ex: Housing memo lists 4 dependents and Service member provided PCS orders with 2 dependents listed and 2 birth certificates for children born on island, but the account only reflected OCOLA 2, then that member was paid for 2 dependents, not 4
 - Why? Proper channels to update and verify OCOLA increase has not been completed

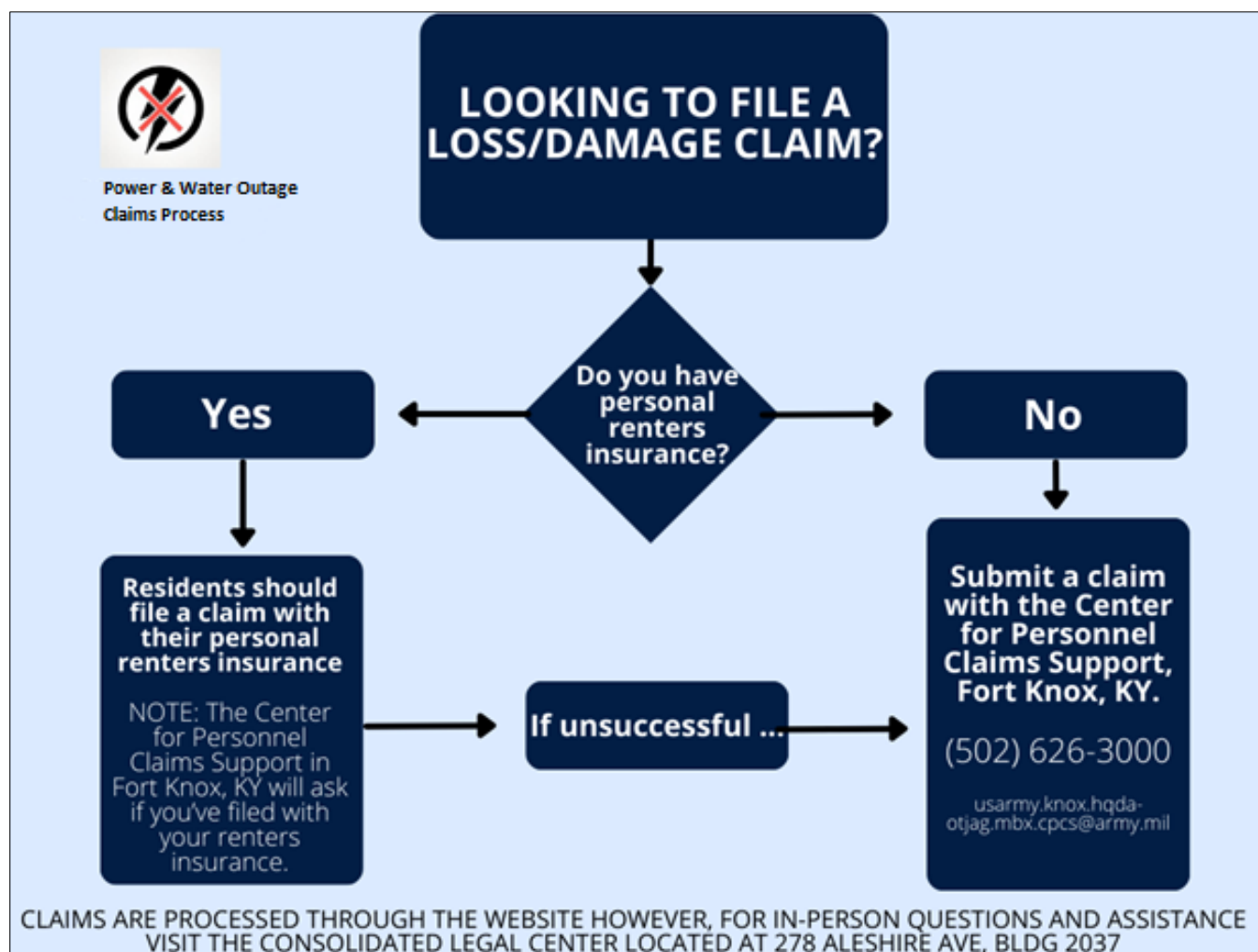

Additional Items to Consider Adding to an Emergency Supply Kit:

- ☐ Prescription medications and glasses
- ☐ Infant formula and diapers
- ☐ Pet food, water and supplies for your pet
- ☐ Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a portable waterproof container
- ☐ Cash and change
- ☐ Emergency reference material such as a first aid book or information from www.ready.gov
- ☐ Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person. Consider additional bedding if you live in a cold-weather climate.
- ☐ Complete change of clothing including a long sleeved shirt, long pants and sturdy shoes. Consider additional clothing if you live in a cold-weather climate.
- ☐ Fire Extinguisher
- ☐ Matches in a waterproof container
- ☐ Feminine supplies, personal hygiene items and hand sanitizer
- ☐ Mess kits, Paper cups, plates and disposable utensils, paper towels
- ☐ Paper and pencil
- ☐ Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children
