


Why are residents in IPC housing getting letters?

Only residents and tenants who have unknown (i.e. non-lead) or galvanized service lines on base received notification letters 30 days after the LSLI was completed per regulation.

What is the way ahead?

USAG-HI will continue to investigate and verify water pipe materials throughout installations. Continue to update the inventory and notify water system users as required. See USEPA diagrams below.





Fry your turkey outdoors and more than 10 feet away from your home. Have a fire extinguisher ready at all times.






Use caution when touching the turkey fryer. The sides of the cooking pot, lid and handles can get dangerously hot.



DEPENDENT STUDENT TRAVEL

Applies to Command Sponsored Dependents - One annual round trip for each dependent student is authorized at any time within a fiscal year (1 October to 30 September) between the member's OCONUS PDS and the dependent student's school in the United States. Additionally, Unaccompanied baggage of up to 350 pounds may be transported for each authorized trip between the school and the Service member's PDS.

*** Delegated to the ACOMs, ASCCs or DRUs (AR 55-46).

Eligibility:

- Unmarried Dependent Child who is under the age of 23
- Must be attending (or will be attending) full time (12 semester hours or equivalent)
 a school in the Continental United States (CONUS) to obtain a formal education that is accredited by a
 state, regional or nationally recognized college/university

Dates Times of Outages:

- * Mon., Dec. 2,: 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. & * Tues., Dec. 3,: 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- * Mon., Dec. 9, : 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. & * Tues., Dec.10,: 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.



- Turn "OFF" and unplug all sensitive equipment (i.e., computers, TVs, etc.).
- Invest in surge protection to protect your equipment.
- Keep freezers and refrigerators closed. If you have a refrigerator/freezer, take all necessary measures to protect any perishable items.



- Keep refrigerator/freezer doors closed.
- Be aware that narrow road conditions may require that our crews block traffic near the work area to provide access to our vehicles and equipment.



- When in doubt, throw it out! Throw away any food that has been exposed to temperatures 40
 degrees or higher for two hours or more, or that has an unusual odor, color or texture.
- If the power is out for more than a day, discard any medication that should be refrigerated, unless the drug's label says otherwise. Consult your doctor or pharmacist immediately for a new supply.
- Check all foods before cooking or consuming. For the latest recommendations on food safety, visit <u>fsis.usda.gov</u> and <u>health.hawaii.gov/san/food-information</u>.
- Once power has been restored, check equipment and gradually turn on essential items.

The North Shore's winter waves are legendary but dangerous. Respect the ocean's power.



- Lifeguards and local authorities issue warnings during high surf













PCS Child Care Pilot Program

Starting October 1, 2024, if child care isn't available within 30 days of your Date Care Needed (DCN) at your new Permanent Duty Station (PDS), you may be eligible for reimbursement of travel costs for a designated person who will care for your children. Reimbursement is provided through a congressionally authorized pilot program through 30 September 2027.

How it works:

- Reimbursement amount: up to \$500 domestic locations and up to \$1500 for PCS to or from overseas
- What is covered: Travel costs for a childcare provider who is at least 18 years old and not your dependent.

Eligibility:

- You or your spouse serve in the Department of Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marine Corps, or Navy.
- You have PCS orders authorizing a move with a dependent.
- Your child(ren) have not yet entered school.
- You have requested full-day childcare at a military-operated center.
- Childcare is not available at the militaryoperated center until 30 days or more after the date you need care.

How to Apply:

- 1. Request Child Care (mcc.com)
- Obtain Your Travel Memo (link located on your MCC dashboard)
- 3. Present Travel Memo to Your Travel Office (3 months before or after the date you need care)







Military Child Care In Your Neighborhood (MCCYN)

How It Works

MCCYN is a fee assistance program that keeps affordable child care in reach for eligible families. It's intended for families who cannot access installation-based care due to distance or waitlists. With fee assistance, a portion of the child care is paid to reduce the cost of what families would pay for care in their communities. This makes it easier for families to afford quality care from local community providers. Families access MCCYN through MilitaryChildCare.com, a secure DoD gateway to military-operated and militarysponsored child care options. It provides a single online location for families to determine their MCCYN eligibility, explore qualifying providers, and request assistance.

Who is Eligible?

Army, Air Force, Marine, and Navy Families
MCCYN is available to active-duty members, Reservists on active
duty, civilians, and Army and Air Force Gold Star spouses who:

- Are stationed at an installation that has been pre-identified as fee assistance eligible or,
- 2. Do not live near a DoD installation with a Child and Youth program. If the sponsor is married, his or her spouse must be employed, actively seeking employment, or a full-time student.

Department of Defense Civilian Families

DoD has expanded MCCYN to assist employees of other DoD agencies and field activities such as employees of the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA), National Reconnaissance Office (NRO), and the Office of Net Assessment (ONA). If the employee is married, his or her spouse must be employed, actively seeking employment, or a full-time student.

U.S. Coast Guard Families

USCG MCCYN is available to active-duty members and Reservists on Active Duty Orders for at least 180 days. If the USCG member is married, his or her spouse must be employed a minimum of 20 hours a week, actively seeking employment, or enrolled in higher-education coursework.

How to Get Started?

- 1. Create an Account If you don't already have an account, go to Military Child Care.com to create one. Once you create an account, set up a Household Profile so you search for care at any time from any location.
- 2. Search for and Request Care MilitaryChildCare.com allows you to search the full range of military child care options. Search for care, and if available, submit a request for MCCYN for each of your children.
- 3. Wait for an Offer MilitaryChildCare.com will send you an offer for care if space becomes available. Keep your email address up-to-date in your Household Profile so you do not miss these important messages.
- 4. Upload Required Documents If you receive an offer for MCCYN, you will receive a notification from MilitaryChildCare.com with instructions on how to accept the offer and upload eligibility documents.

 Federal agency, office or department for compliance with applicable laws, codes, regulations and requirements.
- ✓ HBBs DOES NOT pertain to <u>on-post home childcare</u>. Interest in providing childcare in on-post housing must register, receive training, complete background checks and home inspections, as well as receive certification by the installation Child, Youth, and School (CYS) Services office as part of the Family Child Care (FCC) provider system. Contact CYS Office at (808) 655-1521 or (808) 787-4393.
- ✓ Exceptions: If you work remotely from your home or exclusively through online means, you probably don't need approval. Contact the Business and Nonprofit Liaison to review proposed business.



 - Medical care TRICARE benefits from either a military treatment facility or an approved TRICARE provider, including behavioral health services

Eligibility:

- Current or former spouse of an abusive service member
- Service member separated from active duty under a court-martial sentence resulting from a dependent-abuse offense;
- Service member administratively separated from active duty if the basis for separation includes a dependent-abuse offense; or
- Service member sentenced to forfeiture of all pay and allowances by a court-martial which has convicted a member of dependent-abuse offense









