


Visitor Policy

VISITORS

- To ensure the security and safety of all U.S. Army Garrison Hawaii installations, all non-military affiliated visitors requesting unescorted access will be properly vetted through the National Crime Information Center (NCIC III), Automated Installation Entry (AIE) and ALERTS, prior to being issued an installation visitor pass.
- Guests remain the responsibility of their sponsor at all times. The sponsor must be 18 years or older and possess a valid Department of Defense ID card.
- Anyone entering a U.S. Army Garrison Hawaii installation must have a Department of Defense ID card, (to include Common Access Card (CAC), DoD retiree ID cards, Transportation Workers Identification Card (TWIC) and Gold Star Family ID cards); or a Visitor Pass.
- ALL VISITORS must present their full name, date of birth and social security number in order to obtain a background check.
- All visitors will provide a valid and original form of ID, to include a federal identification card, state driver's license, state identification card, or passport which complies with Public Law 109-13 (The REAL ID Act of 2005).

VEHICLES

- Drivers must possess a valid operator's license, vehicle safety inspection, registration, and proof of no-fault insurance. Operators of rental vehicles must have the rental agreement.





Visitor Passes

ALL PASSES

Apply at a Visitor Control Center (VCC) or Vehicle Processing Center (VPC). All visitors will provide a valid and original form of ID, to include a federal identification card, state driver's license, state identification card, or passport which complies with Public Law 109-13 (The REAL ID Act of 2005). Otherwise, access will be denied. Please note: House guests staying in on-post family housing for more than six days must be registered at the resident's community center.

Other Non DoD affiliated personnel, such as Veteran Health Identification Card holders, Dept. of Education (DOE) teachers and bus drivers, agent card holders, au pair/child care providers, family (non-DoD), Gold Star Families, and contractors/vendor, can obtain a pass at one of the VCC/VPCs as well and must comply with the ID Requirements listed above.

Passes can be valid up to one year based upon need. Requires a valid reason for entry onto the installation; once vetted, pass holder can enter through any gate unescorted to the installation they have been granted access.



HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR STABILIZATION PROGRAM

What is it?

Soldiers who have high school juniors and/or seniors can request assignment stabilization! The intent of the procedure is to provide stability to Soldiers with Family members in their junior and senior years of high school.

Are there changes to the program?

The policy was expanded to include Soldiers with Family members in their junior year.

How do I apply?

Soldiers should use a DA Form 4187 located at <https://www.hrc.army.mil/asset/16562> to request stabilization no earlier than March 1 of the student's freshman year and no later than the start of the student's sophomore year (applying between March and September).

Supporting Our Military Families



- Issue/renew Active, Retiree and dependent ID Cards
- Issue CACs for Military and Civilian personnel
 - ✓ ID Cards transactions for initial issuance, lost/stolen, information change or expiring within 90 days.
- Requirements for receiving ID cards
 - ✓ Age 18 and over > 2 forms of non-expired identification (one being photo ID)
 - ✓ The minimum age for initial ID card issuance is 14 (child)
 - ✓ If sponsor is unavailable; dependent will need to provide POA or DD Form 1172-2
 - *DD Form 1172-2 electronically signed by the sponsor (wet signature must be notarized)*
 - *General POA, (Special POA must state ID transactions)*
- Walk-ins for ID card on space available basis
- Ensure address for dependents is updated in DEERS

 - ✓ Schedule appointment > ID Card Office Locator & Appointment
 - ✓ Update/Verify family member's information and electronically sign DD Form 1172-2 > Family ID Cards

Schofield Barracks Agent Card

The Agent Card authorizes patrons to purchase items at the U.S. Army - Hawaii Exchange, Commissary and MWR facilities as the agent for the Sponsor. This Agent Card (U.S. Army Garrison – Hawaii) is only acceptable for usage at the main exchange, commissary and MWR facilities located on Schofield Barracks.

- All Non-Army Commissaries **DO** honor U.S. Army – Hawaii Agent Card (Air Force, Navy and Marine Corps Exchanges and Commissaries)
 - Single or Dual Military parents - Deployment or TDY orders (for Dual Military, **both parents must be off-island simultaneously**)
 - Minor Child reside with a Non-Military Parent - Divorce decree or court document showing custody.
 - Active Duty Member – Signed physician's letter stating the Patron is incapable of shopping for themselves.



Installation/Unit Clearing

Family Member Out-Processing for a Absence Service Member

- Family members require a Special Power of Attorney (SPOA) stating the Soldier authorizes the Family member to clear the Installation (DA 137-2).
- Unit Commanders must designate a Service Member to clear the Unit (DA 137-1) in the absence of a Service Member.
- Family member should have multiple copies of orders, any amendments, and DA-31.

Estate Planning – Wills

✓ Advantages To Having A Will

- Intestacy (lack of a will) may not meet your intent.
- Administrative costs may be less to execute the will.
- Ability to name Executor and Guardians in the will.
- Can arrange disposition of property to minor children.
- Can minimize Federal and State estate tax liability.

✓ How To Care for Executed Will

- Do not remove staples.
- Do not write on executed will.
- Do not make copies of the executed will.
- Do not hide will or take the will with you.

✓ Any of these actions could lead to an invalid or ineffective will

 - **General**
 - **Special**
- ✓ **When the Power is Granted:**
 - **Durable**
 - **Springing**
- ✓ **Termination of Power of Attorney**





Ancillary Documents

- ✓ **Living Will**
 - Expresses your wishes **NOT** to be kept alive under particular medical circumstances
- ✓ **Healthcare Power of Attorney**
 - Allows someone to make specified healthcare decisions for you **IF** you are unable to do so yourself.
- ✓ **Other Legal Instruments**
 - DD Form 93, Record of Emergency Data
 - Death Gratuity
 - Pay and Allowances



Urgent Care Center

- Our Urgent Care Center is experiencing an increase in wait times.
- Tricare beneficiaries have several options for same-day care, including:
 - **DrOnDemand** – 24/7 access to a licensed provider from any web-connected device. Simply download the app, enter the required information, and you're set! Soldiers require a referral. Dependents do not require a referral.
 - **Tricare Nurse Advice Line** – 24/7 access to a licensed nurse who can provide medical advice. Call 1-800-874-2273, Option 1 to speak to a nurse.
 - **Secure Message your Provider** – send your provider a secure message through the MHS Genesis Patient Portal. Providers typically reply within 24-48 hours.
 - **Network Urgent Care Centers** – Dependents do not need a referral to visit in-network UCC's. Visit https://www.tricare-west.com/content/hnfs/home/tw/bene/symbolic_links/nw-dir-app.html to find a list of in-network UCCs.
 - **Emergency Department** – for injuries threatening life, limb, or eyesight.

DHR - Total Army Sponsorship Program

- Sponsorship is **required** in order to process permanent change of station (PCS) orders to Hawaii and other regions.
- **Soldiers (E1-O6)**
 - ✓ Soldiers must log onto the Army Career Trackers Total Army Sponsorship Program to initiate DA Form 5434 and request a sponsor.
 - ✓ Units are required to assign a sponsor 120 days prior to report date.
- **Department of Army Civilians**
 - ✓ DA Civilians can fill out the PDF version of the DA Form 5434 and email it to their gaining organization.
- **ACS Sponsorship Classes**
 - Classes held every Thursday at 1200 hrs via MS TEAMS.
 - Required for all assigned sponsors and volunteers.






DHR - Transition Assistance Program (TAP)



DHR - Reassignment Office

- Process & Publish the Following:
 - ✓ PCS Orders
 - ✓ IPCOT/COT Travel Orders
 - ✓ Excess Leave Orders
 - ✓ Confinement Transfer Orders
 - ✓ Deletion or Deferment of Assignments- Non PSDR units
- Levy Notifications are sent within 5 days of MPD receiving notification of assignment via CAP Cycle. MPD notifies via email to the Soldier, S1, and SGM/CSM. Soldiers are to complete the Levy Packet NLT 30 days from notification.
- Orders are published up to **6 Months** from departure date, if all required documents are submitted to include the PCS ETP. S1 submits completed Levy Packets to:
usarmy.schofield.id-pacific.list.reassignments-hi@mail.mil
- Reassignments Office provides S1's and SGM/CSMs a Missing Documents log weekly.
- It is Army policy that if an individual has a government travel card, it will be used for all relocation expenses up to the limit of their entitlements. A centrally billed account is only available for Soldiers who do not have a government travel card. Account type must be indicated to Reassignments Office prior to orders being cut.

DHR - Family Travel Office

Due to the COVID travel restrictions, the process to request orders for all Government Funded Travel now requires additional steps. (Early Return of Dependent, Dependent Travel, Space A Travel and Student Travel.)

All Government Funded Travel requests are processed as follows:

1. Service Member submits the packet to their Chain of Command (packet checklists provided on the Garrison Webpage)
2. Chain of Command submits the packet to Schofield Family Travel Section Military-Personnel Division (SFTS-MPD)
3. After tentatively approving the request for travel, the SFTS-MPD provides the S-1 a Memorandum to be used as a justification to request a Travel Exception to Policy (ETP) signed by the first General Officer in the Chain of Command.
4. Chain of Command submits the signed ETP to SFTS-MPD
5. SFTS-MPD then provides the final order to S-1 and Service Member

Transportation and Carlson Wagon-lit (SATO) will require a copy of the final orders and signed Travel ETP to book HHG shipments and flights
