

- Non-ID Card Holder Services:
 - Generally a military ID Card is required for all Legal Assistance Services.
 - Exception(s):
 - Primary next of kin (PNOK), executors, personal representatives, administrators, and legally recognized estate representatives for matters relating to the settlement of the estate of AD Servicemembers who die while in a military duty status;
 - Fiduciaries, including those who hold power of attorney, appointed by a Servicemember for purposes of carrying out the scope of the fiduciary duty; and
 - Individuals receiving transitional compensation under 10 USC 1059.




Most suicides and suicide attempts are reactions to intense feelings of:

Loneliness – Worthlessness – Hopelessness – Guilt

When someone presents with any one of these concerns, they should be seen immediately by a helping provider.

- Talking or hinting about suicide
- Formulating a plan to include acquiring the means to kill oneself
- Having a desire to die
- Obsession with death (music, poetry, artwork)
- Themes of death in letters and notes
- Finalizing personal affairs
- Giving away personal possessions


