


Reassignments

PCS Orders Status



- **54** orders produced (31 May-12 Jun) - Legacy
 - **53 (98%)** orders are amendments or revocations
- **52%** orders complete through Nov 24
- **1141** orders pending review of member elections and levy packets (Jun-Nov 24) (**48%**)
- **EARLY** S1 involvement has shown to be critical to the facilitation of PCS orders and other requests (COT leave/amendments etc.)

Family Travel

 - Command Sponsorship (**204/0**)
 - Concurrent Travel (**309/22**)
 - Student Travel (**23/0**)
 - Dependent Travel (**27/0**)




Background

NOW FOR THE NEXT DISASTER

Make Your 14-Day Disaster Supply Kit (minimum of 14 days for each person)

- ☐ **Water** One gallon of water per person per day for drinking and sanitation.
- ☐ **Food** Non-perishable food that does not require cooking. Survival foods such as peanut butter, protein shakes, dried fruits, & nuts. Infant Formula & food for special needs.
- ☐ **Utensils** Plates, utensils and a manual can opener.
- ☐ **Radio** Battery-powered or hand crank radio with NOAA Weather alert.
- ☐ **Flashlight** with extra batteries.
- ☐ **Cell phone** and solar charger.
- ☐ **Whistle** Important for signaling for help. A whistle carries much farther than the human voice and uses less energy than yelling.
- ☐ **Dust mask**
Helps to filter contaminated air.



LEARN

Educate yourself on disasters that can affect you and your family.

PLAN

Create and practice a family disaster plan. Designate a secondary meeting place and an off-island contact.

- ☐ **Sanitation** Moist towelettes, heavy-duty garbage bags with ties, hand sanitizer, toilet paper, baking soda/kitty litter to absorb odors, and gloves for personal sanitation.
- ☐ **Tools** Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities, basic tool kit, duct tape.
- ☐ **Important documents and cash** Carry vital papers in a waterproof container.
- ☐ **Maps** Local area maps.
- ☐ **Medical** Prescription medications, glasses/contact lenses, medical devices, and a first aid kit.
- ☐ **Pets** Pet food and extra water.
- ☐ **Hygiene** Feminine products, personal hygiene items, diapers, incontinence supplies.
- ☐ **Pictures** Carry a photograph of you, your family & friends to help locate each other if you are separated.
- ☐ **HNL Info** Use HNL info to stay informed about emergencies, weather advisories, traffic bulletins, and much more via SMS or Email.

Independence Day Celebration Prohibited Items

- Glass Bottles
- Pets (Service animals are permitted)
- Weapons of any kind, including but not limited to:
 - Firearms (with or without permit)
 - Pocketknives and/or Multi-tools
 - Pepper Spray or Mace
 - Flares or Fireworks
- All backpacks, briefcases, luggage, or duffel bags (Diaper bags, coolers, and small purses are permitted)
- Skateboards, hover boards, rollerblades, scooters, or bicycles
- Noise making devices (e.g. air horns, drums, whistles)
- Illegal Substances
- Laser pointers
- Drones of any kind, including but not limited to:
 - UAV's, RPA's, or UAS's
- Offensive or profane messages or images on signs and clothing.



When Fireworks Go Wrong

- In Texas, a 58-year-old male died, and 4 others were hurt when a house caught on fire from "fireworks explosions and other volatile incendiaries,"
- In Kentucky, a 48-year-old male died after deputies determined Simpson was attempting to light a commercial-grade firework using a homemade mortar tube.
- In Michigan, a 43-year-old woman died, and 10 others were injured after a home fireworks explosion. Several area homes and vehicles were also damaged.

DPW ENV/Bulk Waste

DPW Solid Waste and Recycling Service Contract

Refuse dumpster and recycling bin pick-up service is provided through a contract managed by DPW-BOID. Units are responsible for keeping area around the dumpsters free of trash and bulk waste.

Regular Bulk Waste Pick-up is not supported by the current Solid Waste and Recycling Contract; Bulk waste pick-up is limited to approved Post Clean-up events.

Bulk Waste (Non-Housing Area)

Bulk waste consists of, but is not limited to, shipping cartons, scrap lumber, discarded furniture, appliances, wood pallets, mattresses, automotive parts, batteries, green waste, propane tanks and tires.

If bulk items are left outside a facility's designated waste dumpster, the dumpster will NOT be serviced until bulk items are removed.

Units may request a non-recurring dumpster to consolidate bulk waste in their AOR; Unit pays rental fee for non-recurring dumpsters. Contact DPW Service Contracts Branch at 808-864-0932 for assistance.

Personal items (items not purchased with government funds) may be disposed of by owner at a City & County Convenience center (located outside McNair Gate). Bulk items must be delivered to the Convenience Centers in a POV. Military and Company vehicles are turned away.

Bulk Pick-Up (Housing Area)

Residents of Island Palm Communities have access to curbside bulk pick-up service

Bulk items should be placed curbside, not earlier than 5 p.m., the evening prior to scheduled trash pick-up day.

- **Army Recycling Center** (Schofield Barracks, 1087B McMahon Rd., Mon-Fri, 0730-1600, 808-428-3158)

Bulk waste items accepted at the Army Recycling Center (ARC) include: cardboard (flattened), untreated wooden pallets/scrap wood, scrap metal, and green waste.

Limit of 10 wooden pallets/Unit each day

Scrap metal items accepted include: grills (no propane tanks) and metal furniture

Call ahead to confirm dumpster space (DOH permit limits number of dumpsters that may be filled)

DLA

DLA will accept up to 100 pallets/day

Units must follow turn-in procedures: complete DD Form 1348-1A and Schedule appointment for turn-ins

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Client Services

Before you PCS: Selling a POV DOs and DON'Ts:

DO:

- Ensure all vehicle paperwork is current.

- Check if your vehicle has a lien.

 - If it does not, have the title in hand.

 - If it does, coordinate with the lienholder about the sale to ensure it can be paid off and title properly transferred.

DON'T:

- Forget submit the notice of transfer to the DMV within 10 days of the sale. It helps to protect you from tickets or violations the buyer may get after the sale.



Client Services

Servicemembers' Civil Relief Act Protections for PCS

Terminating a residential lease:

- Can be terminated any time after receiving PCS orders

- Provide landlord notice of intent to terminate the lease and a copy of your orders.

- Notice should be at least 30 days in advance, or in accordance with your lease terms.

- The lease terminates 30 days AFTER your NEXT rental payment is due.

Terminating a motor vehicle lease:

- Provide the dealership notice of the intent to terminate the lease, with a copy of your orders.

- Return the vehicle no later than 15 days after delivery of notice to the dealership.

Know the Rules

A 10-hour child care limit has been established by the Department of the Army to protect children from being in unregulated child care settings on a regular basis.

This means any Family member living in government quarters providing child care for more than 10 child care hours per week on a regular basis must be certified as a Family Child Care provider.

Know the Rules

A **10-hour child care limit** has been established by the Department of the Army to protect children from being in unregulated child care settings on a regular basis.

This means **any Family member living in Government Quarters** providing child care for more than 10 hours per week on a regular basis may be penalized.
