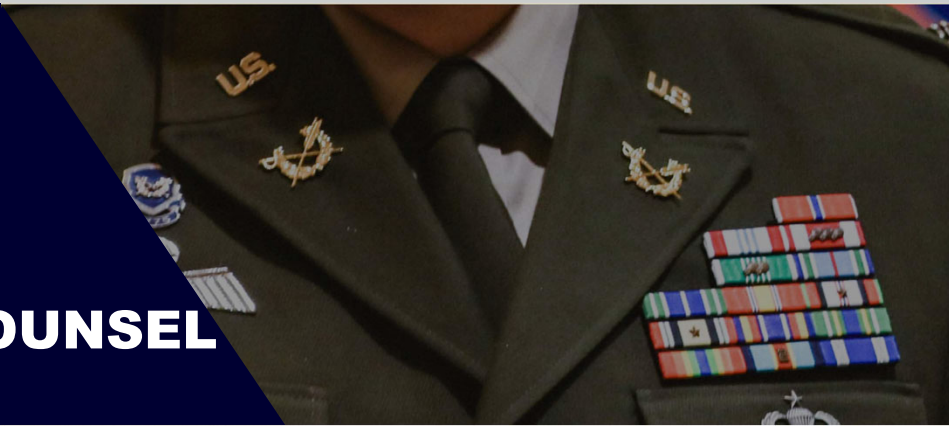




U.S. ARMY SPECIAL VICTIMS' COUNSEL

The SVC Program provides a dedicated legal advocate to victims of sexual assault and domestic violence. Our mission is to empower you by protecting your rights and ensuring your voice is heard within the military justice system.

Your Advocate, Your Rights

A Special Victim Counsel (SVC) is a certified Army Judge Advocate—a lawyer—who represents *your* interests. All communications with your SVC are confidential and protected by attorney-client privilege.

How We Help You:

- Providing confidential legal advice.
- Representing you in military justice proceedings.
- Accompanying you to interviews, hearings, and court-martials.
- Ensuring you are treated with fairness and respect for your dignity and privacy.

Your Protected Rights:

- The right to be protected from the accused.
- The right to timely notice of legal proceedings.
- The right to be heard at proceedings.
- The right to be free from unreasonable delays in the justice process.

Who We Represent

Active Duty Army Soldiers, Dependents of Active Duty Soldiers, DoD Civilian Employees, and persons eligible for legal assistance under 10 USC § 1044 are eligible for SVC representation if:

1. The person reports as a victim of an alleged sex-related offense or domestic violence; **and**
2. The U.S. military has jurisdiction over the alleged offender for the commission of the offenses described above.
