Army Invites Public Comments on the Demolition of the Akolea and Aloala Neighborhoods at Schofield Barracks Military Reservation, O‘ahu, Hawai‘i

The U.S. Army plans to demolish 111 buildings, comprising 390 housing units, within the Aloala and Akolea neighborhoods at Schofield Barracks. The Advisory Council on Historic Preservation and the U.S. Army developed *Program Comment for Army Vietnam War Era Historic Housing, Associated Buildings and Structures, and Landscape Features (1963-1975)* (Program Comment), in accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, to address effects of all management actions occurring on the Army’s nation-wide inventory of housing, associated buildings and structures, and landscape features built from 1963 to 1975. The Army built all housing proposed for demolition between 1973 and 1974. These buildings are therefore subject to the terms of the Program Comment, which defines demolition as an adverse effect. The Army will consider all comments received from the public and will document the resolution of effects through a Memorandum of Agreement with the Hawaii State Historic Preservation Officer.
