ARMY EMERGENCY RELIEF

Service Description

The **Army Emergency Relief (AER)** fund provides financial services to include interest-free loans, grants (when loan repayment would cause undue hardship), and student scholarships. There is no charge for the services provided by AER. Loans are repaid based on an individual budget plan.

Eligibility

Active Duty Army, Retirees, and their Dependents, orphans and widows of active duty or retired personnel, ARNG, and USAR Soldiers (Title 10) and their Family Members are eligible for AER services.

ARMY FAMILY ACTION PLAN (AFAP)

Service Description

The **Army Family Action Plan (AFAP)** is your platform to voice qualityof-life issues, feedback, ideas, and suggestions. It's the best way to let Army leadership know about what works, what doesn't, and how you think problems can be resolved. We give Active and Reserve Component Soldiers, Army Civilians, Retirees, Survivors, and Family Members a primary tool to help identify issues and concerns and shape your standards of living.

You can submit issues at your Garrison's Army Community Service office or to a unit Family Programs liaison. <u>Army OneSource</u> also facilitates AFAP issues online and makes sure your concerns get the attention they deserve. The information you submit gives Army leadership insight and helps foster a satisfied, informed, and resilient Army Community. AFAP makes a meaningful difference. Since AFAP was created in 1983 over 698 issues have been submitted. These submissions resulted in 128 legislative changes, 186 Department of Defense or Army policy changes, and 210 improved programs or services.

ARMY VOLUNTEER CORPS PROGRAM (AVC)

Service Description

Army Volunteer Programs provide Families with an opportunity to volunteer their time to a range of activities and services to support the Army community. The key components of success in the Army Volunteer Programs are the Army Volunteer Corps Coordinator (AVCC), the Army Family Action Plan (AFAP), and Army Family Team Building (AFTB).

The Army requires volunteers of Army organizations to use the online Volunteer Management Information System (VMIS) at Army OneSource (<u>www.myarmyonesource.com</u>) to register and report hours. VMIS allows you to search and apply for volunteer opportunities, log your volunteer hours, and document training and awards in your individual Volunteer Service Record. ARMY FAMILY TEAM BUILDING (AFTB)

Service Description

AFTB empowers you through self-development and leadership skills to learn basic Army knowledge and receive specialized training to maximize your personal and professional potential. This program improves personal and family preparedness which enhances overall Army readiness and helps America's Army adapt to a changing world. AFTB is organized into three levels and is taught through interactive classes.

AFTB Level K: "Military Knowledge" - This is a fun, simple class that will teach you basic military knowledge.

- Military benefits and entitlements
- Decipher Army Acronyms and the Leave and Earning Statement (LES)
- How to utilize community resources
- Improve financial readiness skills
- Understand the goal and impact of the Army mission on daily life

AFTB Level G: "Personal Growth and Resiliency" - Learn how to improve your personal relationships, communication, and stress-management skills. Discover how teams form and grow, how to solve problems, and how to resolve personal conflict. You'll also learn about:

- Army Traditions
- Army Customs
- Army Courtesies
- Army Protocol

AFTB Level L: "Leadership Development" - This course develops leadership skills. Thrive in the Army and civilian life by expanding leadership skills, effective communication techniques, and learning to mentor others into leadership positions. You'll learn about:

- Different leadership styles
- How to run an effective meeting
- How to manage group conflict
- How to coach and mentor others

EFMP RESPITE CARE PROGRAM

Service Description

The **Respite Care Program** provides a temporary rest period for Active Duty Army, Guard, and Reserve Families who are responsible for the regular care of persons with disabilities. Care is provided in the family's home. Respite care is important because it decreases family stress, increases family stability, and reduces costly out-of-home placements. Thereby, contributing to Soldier readiness.

Eligibility is based on EFMP enrollment and the medical condition of the Family Member.

FAMILY ADVOCACY PROGRAM (FAP)

Service Description

The **U.S. Army Family Advocacy Program (FAP)** helps Soldiers and their Families recognize and prepare for the unique challenges of military lifestyles. Our services include seminars, workshops, counseling, and intervention to help strengthen the relationships of Army Families. We are also dedicated to the prevention domestic abuse, child abuse, and neglect of Soldiers and their Families through offering education, prompt reporting, investigation, intervention, and treatment.

The ACS FAP offers Family enrichment programs that cover the life cycle of the Family, infants, children, teens, couples, and parents. The classes include parenting, stress management, child development, support groups, and deployment support issues. Services are available to unit support groups and Family organizations.

FINANCIAL READINESS PROGRAM (FRP)

Service Description

The **Financial Readiness Program (FRP)** offers a wide range of services to assist Soldiers and their Families with financial affairs. Emphasis is placed upon educating Soldiers and spouses in money management, proper use of credit, financial planning, deployment finances, transition and relocation budgeting, credit improvement, identity theft, investment information, and debt management principles to prevent financial difficulties before they arise and prepare them for their financial future.

Accredited Financial Counselors (AFC) are available to teach financial classes and help Soldiers and their spouses in all areas of financial readiness to include reviewing credit reports, establishing budgets, working with creditors, filing consumer complaints, and gathering information on local consumer laws. They are available to empower Soldiers and Family Members to make sound financial decisions.

MOBILIZATION AND DEPLOYMENT READINESS PROGRAM

Service Description

The **Mobilization, Deployment, and Support Stability Operations** (**MDSSO**) helps support community readiness during deployments and emergencies. We help make sure installation programs align with unit deployment cycles, provide pre- and post-deployment support, and help unit Commanders with their Family Readiness plans and deployment support services for Service Members and their Families. We're responsible for operating an Emergency Family Assistance Center in the case of an all-hazards event, and supporting Service Members and Families during Non-Combatant Evacuation Operations (NEO) and Repatriation. We also act as a case manager for all requests for assistance through the Army Disaster Personnel Accountability and Assessment System (ADPAAS).

Active duty Army Service Members and Family Members who are expecting a child and/or have children from 0 to 3 years of age are eligible to participate in the NPSP. Even if you are not a first time parent, you may find that adding a new family member presents significant changes in your family. The NPSP offers you the opportunity to express your concerns and ask questions regarding your changing family.

Items available include small electrical appliances, pots, pans, dishes, irons, portable booster chairs, pack n' plays, and more. Your ID Card and copy of orders are required.

Survivor Outreach Services is part of the Army Casualty Continuum of Care. It's designed to provide long-term support to surviving Families of Fallen Soldiers. Our goal is to reassure Survivors that they remain valued members of the Army Family.

SOS is able to help in many ways including Support Coordinators, Financial Counselors, and Gold Star Advocates.

VICTIM ADVOCACY PROGRAM (VAP)

Service Description

The **Victim Advocacy Program (VAP)** provides emergency and followup support services to adult victims of domestic abuse. Advocacy services are available to Service members, their current or former spouses, an individual with whom the Service member shares a child, and significant others of Service members who live together. Our services are available twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week.

Our trained professionals are here for crisis response, information on reporting options, medical treatment options, law enforcement's response, emergency services, safety planning, obtaining military and civilian protective orders, and accompaniment to medical forensic exams and medical appointments, as well as accompaniment to court for orders of protection hearings and trials. Advocates work closely with their civilian counterparts and ensure a personal and smooth transition for victims who do not qualify for ongoing advocacy services within the military community.

Service Description

The Finance Office provides the following services:

- Assists units with the proper preparation and timely submission of pay-related documents.
- Resolves pay-related problems with the ability to make check payments for health and comfort items and casual payments or advance payments as appropriate.
- In-processes Soldiers upon their arrival in the command.
- Computes and prepares settlement payments for Permanent Change of Station (PCS) travel, Family member travel, and inbound Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA) payments.
- Assists Soldiers prior to their departure from the command.
- Provides advance payments for PCS travel, Family Member travel, and out-going TLA settlements.
- Computes and prepares miscellaneous payments to qualified Soldiers or their Family Members. These payments include all reenlistment bonuses, accrued leave payments upon reenlistment, and death gratuity payments to Family members of deceased Soldiers.
- No check cashing services are available.

<u>Eligibility</u>

Active Duty Military and Reservist. Family Members may inquire about service member pay issues as long as the Family Member has a current and eligible Power of Attorney.

CHAPLAIN'S OFFICES

There is a very specific, time sensitive process to be able to take your pet directly home from the airport. You will need to complete the AQS-279 and follow all instructions on "Checklist 1— For Direct Airport Release & 5 Days or Less Program" in order to avoid quarantine. If you do not complete the tasks for Direct Airport Release, your pet could be quarantined for up to 120 days or sent back to the mainland at your expense. Expect to pay a fee of \$185- \$244 to retrieve your pet from the airport animal quarantine station.

Eligibility

- Active Duty component Service Members with a current military ID & Dependents.
- Reserve component Service Members mobilized for 29+ consecutive days and their Dependents. A copy of orders must be provided.
- Department of Defense Civilian Employees only eligible for assistance on deployment matters & responses to Financial Liability Investigations.
- Active or reserve component Veterans who are receiving military retirement or disability pay, and their Dependents.

The only individuals eligible for services without a military ID are:

- Next of kin of Service Members who died in an active status are eligible for probate assistance.
- Parents or guardians acting on behalf of a minor (with an ID card).
- Holders of a special Power of Attorney for a legal assistance service from a deployed Service Member acting on his or her behalf

Department of Defense Contractors are not eligible for legal assistance services in Hawaii.

To file a tort claim with our office, please submit an SF-95 along with any accompanying evidence that you have to support your claim. If government property is damaged by a third party, the government may pursue an affirmative claim against the person to recoup the cost to repair or replace the damaged property. Claims must be filed within 90 days of the occurrence and filed with the Soldier's Commander. These claims are not filed with our office. An investigation will take place by the Soldier's unit to determine liability.

Household Goods, POV Shipment, and Personnel Claims

The Consolidated Legal Center no longer handles any claims related to the shipment of household goods, POVs, or personnel claims incident to service. All of these claims are now filed online via <u>https://move.mil</u> through Fort Knox, Kentucky.
