Purpose of the Uniformed Former Spouses' Protection Act (USFSPA):

10 U.S.C. § 1408 is a federal law that provides a method for a spouse or a former spouse to receive a portion of a Soldier's retired pay. The USFSPA does not automatically entitle a former spouse to a portion of a Soldier's retired pay; the former spouse must have been awarded a portion of the retired pay through a court order. The USFSPA also provides a method of enforcing child support and alimony awarded in a court order.

Limitations: Court can grant up to 50% of retired pay to former spouse.

10/10: (10-year marriage overlapping 10-year Military Career) – Former spouse's portion of retirement (awarded by court order) can be distributed directly from DFAS.

20/20/20: (20 years of service, 20 marriage, 20 years of marriage/service overlap)

- Commissary and exchange access along with direct deposit of retirement pay.
- Full Healthcare if spouse is not enrolled on employer's health care.

20/20/15: (20 years of service, 20 marriage, 15 years of marriage/service overlap)

Transitional Healthcare (1 year of coverage)

Will I lose my benefits if I remarry?

Yes, but if the subsequent marriage ends in divorce or death, Commissary and Exchange privileges are revived.

Application Checklist:

- DD2293 Wizard application form completed and signed
- Certified copy of Decree of Divorce, Dissolution, Annulment or Legal Separation
- Marriage Certificate, if marriage date is not included in order
- Birth dates of children included, or copy(s) of birth certificates (if applying for child support).
- If order does not include entitlement award, include document that has it.
- Completed Direct Deposit form & IRS W4-P.
