### WHY DO I NEED TO KNOW ABOUT MY GI BILL BENEFITS?

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 Effective 5 January 2023, the Johnny Isakson and David P. Moe, M.D. Veterans Health Care and Benefits Improvement Act of 2020 will prevent Regular Army (RA) Soldiers from making the by-law selection to opt-in or optout of the MGIB (Chapter 30) until they reach 180 days after their Basic Active Service Date (BASD).

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 RA Soldiers will have between 180 and 270 days after their BASD to decide whether they want to opt-in or opt-out of the MGIB. If no selection is made, RA Soldiers will automatically be enrolled into the MGIB on day 271.

## WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

• If a RA Soldier is enrolled into the MGIB, a \$100 contribution will be automatically deducted each month for one year towards the MGIB and the Soldier will have access to the MGIB once they have paid a total of \$1200.









## **BAR OF DUPLICATION OF ELIGIBILITY**

- Soldiers with one period of qualifying service can choose to use the MGIB OR the Post 9/11 GI Bill.
- Soldiers with at least two periods of qualifying service can apply for 12 additional months of the Post 9/11 GI Bill if they exhaust all 36 months of the MGIB.
  - Soldiers with at least two periods of qualifying service are encouraged to contact the VA to discuss the Rudisill Act.

## THE MONTGOMERY GI BILL (MGIB)







#### **MGIB ELIGIBILITY**

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- Enlisted between 1 July 1985 to present
- Contributed \$1,200 upon initial enlistment
- Must receive a fully honorable discharge



 Must complete high school, GED, or 12 credit hours of college coursework to qualify



## **HOW DOES THE MGIB WORK?**

- 36 months of education benefits
- 10 years from last date of AD to exhaust the benefit
- Must certify enrollment each month to the VA
- VA pays Soldier directly
  - MGIB payments will be paid after the fact
- Monthly payment dependent on time in service (TIS) and rate of pursuit







### MGIB PAYMENT RATES FOR 3+ YEARS OF SERVICE Monthly rate as of 1 October 2024

Training Time	Payment Rate
Full time	\$2,438.00
3/4 time	\$1,828.50
1/2 time	\$1,219.00
1/4 time or less	\$609.50



## MGIB \$600 BUY-UP

- Soldier can pay \$600 to increase their monthly MGIB payments by \$150 (\$5,400 over 36 months)
  - Soldier may pay less than \$600 to receive a pro-rated monthly amount
- The additional money must be paid before the Soldier's final date on AD
- Soldier may pay in increments or one lump sum
- Non-refundable if Soldier does not use the MGIB





## **ARMY COLLEGE FUND (ACF)/THE ARMY KICKER**

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- ACF is an enlistment incentive designed to aid in the recruitment of highly qualified Soldiers for critical or shortage MOSs.
  - ACF linked to MGIB-AD was suspended 16 March 2012
  - ACF linked to MGIB-SR is ongoing
- ACF must be on Soldier's enlistment contract
- ACF awards participating Soldiers additional money on top of their MGIB to be divided over 36 months
- ACF is paid out through the Post 9/11 GI Bill through the monthly housing stipend (MHA)
  - If the beneficiary using the Post 9/11 GI Bill does not qualify for MHA, the VA pays the ACF on a monthly basis through the monthly housing stipend code "06H."





## THE POST 9/11 (FOREVER) GI BILL





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### WHO QUALIFIES POST 9/11 GI BILL ELIGIBILITY

- Soldiers who serve an aggregate period of 90 days to 36 months after 10 September 2001 will qualify for a percentage of the Post 9/11 GI Bill based on honorable TIS.
- Qualifying Soldiers who serve at least 30 continuous days and discharge from AD due to a service-connected disability and Soldiers who receive a Purple Heart on or after 11 September 2001 will automatically qualify at the 100% payable rate.
  - If a Soldier earns a Purple Heart, they will still qualify for 100% even if they have a non-qualifying period such as:
    - 5 year service obligation for a Service Academy commission
    - 4 year service obligation for an ROTC scholarship commission
    - 3 year service obligation for LRP

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## POST 9/11 GI BILL

- 36 months of education benefits
- VA pays tuition and fees directly to the school
- Maximum payment may not exceed the maximum amount charged for in-state tuition and fees at a public school
  - The VA will pay in-state graduate rates for graduate school
- Pays up to **\$28,937.09** at a private or foreign school
  - If you are attending a school that costs more than the annual cap, you may be eligible for extra payment under the Yellow Ribbon Program
- MHA paid at the E-5 with dependent rate based on the zip code of the school where you attend the majority of your classes in-person
  - To calculate your housing rate, visit the GI Bill Comparison Tool at <u>https://www.va.gov/gi-bill-comparison-tool</u>
  - AD Soldiers do not receive MHA with the Post 9/11 GI Bill
- MHA is not available for half-time attendance or less
- MHA is prorated for students between half-time and full-time status







## POST 9/11 GI BILL

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- Full-time online MHA is half the national BAH average
- Full-time online students must take at least one class in the classroom to qualify for the full MHA rate
- Book stipend of up to \$1,000 per year
  - \$41.67 per credit hour (up to 24 credit hours)
  - Prorated by percentage payable rate and course load
- One time \$500 rural relocation allowance
- Lifetime use of the benefit
- Must certify enrollment each month to the VA
- Can use the benefit for flight training, correspondence training, tutoring services, OJT and apprenticeship training, and certification/licensing exams







## YELLOW RIBBON PROGRAM

 Participating schools may voluntarily enter into an agreement with the VA to cover tuition and fees not covered by the Post 9/11 GI Bill. The school will pay a set amount of additional money and the VA will match the amount.

- Not all schools have Yellow Ribbon agreements with the VA. To locate participating schools, visit: <u>https://www.benefits.va.gov/gibill/yellow\_ribbon.asp</u>
  - Even participating schools may not offer the Yellow Ribbon Program to every Post 9/11 GI Bill beneficiary
  - The Yellow Ribbon Program may not always cover the entire cost of tuition and fees
- Available to Veterans and Veteran family members who are eligible at the 100% payable rate
- Available to Purple Heart recipients
- Available to AD and AD spouses who are eligible at the 100% payable rate and enrolled over half-time





#### LICENSING AND CERTIFICATION EXAMS UNDER THE POST 9/11 GI BILL

- The maximum reimbursable amount for licensing and certification tests is \$2000. There is no maximum reimbursable amount for national tests.
- Entitlement will be charged one month for every \$2,414.18 spent.





#### APPRENTICESHIP AND OJT RATES UNDER THE POST 9/11 GI BILL

Training Period	Monthly Rate
First six months of training	100% of your applicable MHA
Second six months of training	80% of your applicable MHA
Third six months of training	60% of your applicable MHA
Fourth six months of training	40% of your applicable MHA
Remaining pursuit of training	20% of your applicable MHA





#### THE EDITH NOURSE ROGERS STEM SCHOLARSHIP

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Allows some eligible Veterans and family members preparing for in-demand STEM fields to extend their Post 9/11 GI Bill benefits by up to 9-months or \$30,000.





## **MGIB REFUND**

- Veterans who paid \$1200 into the MGIB may be entitled to a refund of the \$1200 minus taxes (prorated for any use of MGIB benefits).
- Only a Veteran who is receiving the Post 9/11 GI Bill MHA stipend on the last day of the last month of Post 9/11 GI Bill eligibility will receive the refund.
- The VA will review a Veteran's file for eligibility of the refund on the last month of Post 9/11 GI Bill eligibility.
  - Veteran may contact the VA during the last month of Post 9/11 GI Bill eligibility for a review of their file.







#### **POST 9/11 TRANSFER OF EDUCATION BENEFITS (TEB)**

- Requests must be submitted prior to separation or retirement with sufficient time to fulfill the Transfer of Education Benefits (TEB) Active Duty Service Obligation (ADSO)
- A Soldier on AD or in the SELRES with a Purple Heart may submit a TEB request and it will ALWAYS be approved. Purple Heart recipients will not incur an ADSO/RDSO
- After approval Soldier may revoke or modify the TEB request at any time

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- Veteran may not add new family members to TEB after separation or retirement
- Veteran may modify months for any family member who was awarded at least one month prior to Veteran's separation or retirement







#### **POST 9/11 GI BILL TRANSFERABILITY INFORMATION**

- Transferred benefits are not marital property
- Eligible family members include spouse and/or children enrolled in DEERS (to include foster children and a ward in the Soldier's care)
  - Children ages 21-22 who were not awarded benefits prior to their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday may receive benefits only if the sponsor is still on AD or in the SELRES and children are enrolled in school.
- Spouse may use the GI Bill after the Soldier completes 6 years TIS. Children may use the benefit after Soldier completes 10 years TIS
- Children have until they turn 26 to use the GI Bill. Spouses have lifetime use

## ARE THERE ANY OTHER BENEFITS I SHOULD KNOW ABOUT?





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### **TOP-UP**

- Soldiers can use the GI Bill to cover the difference between the full cost of a college course and the amount covered under Tuition Assistance (TA) for up to 36 months.
- The combined amount paid by DoD and TA can never be more than the total cost of the course.

#### **TOP-UP UNDER THE MGIB**

- Soldier will receive the difference between the DoD payment and the total cost of the course.
- Soldier will be charged one month of entitlement for each payment received that is equal to the full-time monthly rate.

#### **TOP-UP UNDER THE POST 9/11 GI BILL**

- VA pays the school the difference between the DoD payment and the authorized tuition and fees.
- The benefit will be charged based on training time.
  - Half-time training rates reduce your GI Bill benefit by a half-month for each month you're enrolled.





## MONTGOMERY GI BILL-SELECTED RESERVES (CHAPTER 1606)

- Soldier must have joined between 1 July 1985 to present
- Soldier must agree to a 6 year SELRES contract
- No contribution required
- As of 1 Oct 2020 monthly rates up to \$397 per month
- VA pays Soldier directly
- Can only use while in SELRES status







#### **VETERAN READINESS AND EMPLOYMENT (CHAPTER 31)**

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- Assists entitled Veterans with service-connected disabilities and an employment handicap to prepare for, obtain, and maintain a job.
- VR&E Counselors provide ongoing services to include:
  - Tutorial assistance
  - Job skills training or education
  - Other services required to help achieve a career and live as independently as possible

#### THE FOLLOWING ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA MUST BE MET IN ORDER TO QUALIFY FOR VR&E

- Have a VA service-connected disability rating of 10% with a serious employment handicap
- Have a VA service-connected disability rating of 20% or more with an employment handicap
- Determined by VR&E to need rehabilitation services



## **CHAPTER 35**

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The Marine Gunnery Sergeant John David Fry Scholarship

- For children and spouses of:
  - Active-duty service members who died in the line of duty on or after 11 September 2001
  - Members of the Selected Reserve who died from a service-connected disability on or after 11 September 2001

#### The Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance (DEA) Program

- Offers education and training to qualified dependents of Veterans who:
  - Are permanently and totally disabled because of a service-related condition
  - Died while on active duty or as a result of a service-related condition





### HOW TO APPLY FOR THE GI BILL

- Go to www.va.gov
- Click on Education and training
- Under the following heading (Get GI Bill and other education benefits) click on About GI Bill benefits
- Click the green button that says Apply for education benefits
- Under How do I apply click the blue button that says Apply for education benefits
- After you click the blue button, check the radio button that says you are applying for a new benefit, then answer the next three questions to access the correct VA form
- Click Apply now
- Click the blue button that says **Sign in to start your application**
- Sign in to complete the correct form through Login.gov, ID.me, DS Logon or My HealthVet (you may be required to create a Login.gov or ID.me account)

## RECOUPMENTS

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 All TA and CA obligations must be resolved, and recoupment actions initiated before clearing. If Soldiers do not resolve recoupment actions prior to out-processing, the Army should audit the account and process recoupment actions in ArmylgnitED. Money owed to the Army may still be recouped even after the Soldier separates.
