Once you know the career you would like to pursue & what you need to achieve your career goal, you will create an education plan.









THINGS TO CONSIDER BEFORE ENROLLING IN COLLEGE

- Am I college ready or do I need to work on basic skills?
- Do I have time to devote to classes?
 - 1 Semester Hour (SH) = 2 hours outside of classroom work per week (reading, papers, study time).
- What education do I need to achieve my career goal?
 - Associate Degree
 - Bachelor's Degree
 - Master's Degree
 - Certificate
 - Credential
- Can I complete my education while on active duty?



WHAT IS AN ASSOCIATE DEGREE?



An undergraduate degree awarded upon completion of approximately 60 SH.



You do not need an associate degree to pursue a bachelor's degree.



Associate of Arts: Designed to transfer to another academic institution (AI) as part of a bachelor's degree. An AA satisfies the first two years of a bachelor's degree



Associate of Applied Science: Designed to lead directly into entry level employment.



WHAT IS A BACHELOR'S DEGREE?

- Students will complete 120 SH or about 40 college courses.
 - Bachelor of Arts:
 - Requires fewer credits that are directly linked to a particular major.
 - Bachelor of Science:
 - Classes are more directly linked to the major.



WHAT IS A MASTER'S DEGREE?

- The first level of graduate study.
- To apply for a master's degree, you must typically hold a bachelor's degree.
- Students will complete approximately 36 - 54 SH or 12 to 18 college courses.





WHAT IS A CERTIFICATE?

A certificate provides instruction to enhance knowledge, skills & abilities.





WHAT IS A CREDENTIAL?

- A document that shows a person is qualified to do a specific job.
- Often obtained by successfully passing a certification or licensing exam.





THINGS TO CONSIDER WHEN CHOOSING AN ACADEMIC INSTITUTION (AI)





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SHOULD I TAKE CLASSES ONLINE OR IN THE CLASSROOM?





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ACCREDITATION

- Institution accreditation is a form of quality control, ensuring that AIs satisfy certain standards.
- Some fields require students to complete an accredited program for graduate level acceptance or professional licensure or certification.







REGIONAL ACCREDITATION

PROS

- The highest standard of accreditation.
- Credits & degrees typically accepted in transfer.

<u>CONS</u>

- Often require more liberal arts coursework.
- Typically offer less vocational & technical programs.

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NATIONAL ACCREDITATION

PROS

- May require less liberal arts coursework.
- Offer more technical, careeroriented degrees.

<u>CONS</u>

- Credits not widely accepted in transfer to regionally accredited AIs.
- Coursework & degrees may not be accepted for professions that require licensing after degree attainment.





DIPLOMA MILL RED FLAGS

- Degree completion time.
- The school lists accreditation from organizations that aren't recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.
- Tuition is paid per degree.
- There is little or no interaction with professors.
- There is little to no coursework required.
- The school has no physical location.
- The degree is awarded based on criteria unrelated to academics.

 - Offers bachelor's/master's degrees.
 - Must have 30 SH of undergraduate coursework completed prior to enrollment.
- University of Maryland Global Campus: 254-202-9650
 - Offers associate/bachelor's/master's degrees & certificates.

- Do you accept transfer credit & CLEP/DSST exams?
- What is the cost of tuition?
- Are you nationally or regionally accredited?
- What is the job placement rate for graduates in my degree program?
- What additional resources do you provide?
 - VA Office, academic advising, disability services, etc.





HOW TO APPLY TO COLLEGE

- Determine the application timeframe.
- Identify the individual components of a complete application.
- Gather the necessary documents, to include previous college transcripts and your Joint Services Transcript (JST).
- Review your application before submitting.

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GET YOUR JST EVALUATED

- Receive college credit for:
 - Language Skills (DLPT, CLEP)
 - Formal Training (Drill SGT, Recruiter)
 - Basic & AIT-MOS Training
 - Certifications
 - Skill Level (NCO Schools)
- Go to https://jst.doded.mil/ to send your JST to your AI.







CLEP/DSST EXAMS

- CLEP and DSST exams allow you to test out of subjects with passing scores.
- Log onto <u>https://www.dantes.mil</u> or <u>www.free-clep-prep.com</u> to learn about CLEP/DSST exams & access study materials.
- Visit <u>https://www.ctcd.edu/students/current-ctc-</u> <u>students/testing-services/</u> to schedule a CLEP/DSST exam through the CTC Testing Center.







FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID

APPLY!

You must apply for federal grants to be eligible for schoolbased aid.

Three types of financial aid:

- Pell Grant
- Work Study
- Student Loans

Eligibility is based on income & rate of pursuit.

Can be used in conjunction with TA.

This brief is **HIGHLY RECOMMENDED** for all new Soldiers.







TOP-UP

• Soldiers can use the GI Bill to cover the difference between the full cost of a college course & the amount covered under TA for up to 36 months.

TOP-UP UNDER THE MGIB

- Soldier will receive the difference between the DoD payment & the total cost of the course.
- Soldier will be charged one month of entitlement for each payment received that is equal to the full-time monthly rate.

TOP-UP UNDER THE POST 9/11 GI BILL

- VA pays the school the difference between the DoD payment & the authorized tuition and fees.
- The benefit will be charged based on training time.
