SUBJECT: POLICY 20-50, Installation Juvenile Curfew

1. This policy establishes times for juvenile curfew as stated in this policy letter. This curfew policy does not apply to juveniles accompanied by a parent, guardian, or custodian.

2. Responsibilities:

a. Parents, custodians, or guardians will ensure juveniles comply with the provisions of this policy letter.

b. Parents, guardians, or custodians are responsible for juveniles found violating the curfew. Violation of this policy by military personnel is punitive and can be punished under the UCMJ. Further, violation of this policy may result in loss of post access.

c. Violations of this policy should be reported to the Military Police.

3. Terms:

a. Juvenile. Any person who has not yet reached 18 years of age who is not a Soldier or spouse of a Soldier.

b. Parent. Any natural or adoptive parent of a juvenile.

c. Guardian. Any person other than a parent, who has legal guardianship of the juvenile.

d. Custodian. Any person, not a juvenile, who has lawful care and custody (i.e. babysitter) of a juvenile.

4. Juveniles cannot be unaccompanied on Fort Huachuca either on foot or in a motor vehicle between the hours listed below without a parent, guardian, or custodian.

a. Sunday - Thursday: 2200 - 0500

b. Friday - Saturday: 2400 - 0500

5. The Military Police will detain and cite juveniles violating the curfew on DA Form 3975 (Military Police Report). Parent, guardian or custodian of the juvenile will be required to sign for them on DD Form 2708 (Receipt for Prisoner or Detained Person). With the understanding that some juveniles conduct activities such as work or other events that may require them to transit the installation outside established curfew hours, exceptions

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to this policy can be requested on a case by case basis with the Directorate of Emergency Services.

6. The proponent for this policy is the U.S. Army Garrison (USAG), Directorate of Emergency Services.

7. This memorandum supersedes USAG, Policy 19-16, Installation Juvenile Curfew.
