MEMORANDUM FOR United States Army Garrison (USAG) Fort Huachuca

SUBJECT: POLICY 25-01, Open Door

- 1. REFERENCE. Army Regulation (AR) 600-20, para 2-2 (Command Policies), 6 February 2025.
- 2. POLICY. I am committed to addressing unresolved concerns that impact our community. Accordingly, any uniformed service member or DA Civilian assigned to Fort Huachuca may request an open-door meeting to discuss concerns within the Garrison's purview. I encourage everyone to resolve issues through their chain of command, supervisory channels, or other appropriate means; however, I am available to help when other avenues have not produced resolution. My goal is to foster transparency, accountability, and trust across the installation.
- 3. PROCEDURE. To request an open-door meeting, call the Garrison Administrative Officer (520) 533-1562. Be prepared to describe the issue and steps taken to resolve it. The Administrative Officer may, at my direction, arrange a preliminary meeting with the respective Director, the Deputy to the Garrison Commander (DGC) or Garrison Command Sergeant Major (CSM).
- 4. LIMITATIONS. This policy does not override, supplement, or replace procedures that ensure due process, such as Equal Opportunity (EO) and Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) complaints, Inspector General (IG) inquiries, AR 15-6 investigations, or administrative proceedings. If I serve as a decision authority, I will not engage until the formal process concludes.
- 5. This memorandum supersedes memorandum, USAG, Policy 24-01, Open Door Policy, dated 21 June 2024.
