



POST SHUTTLE ROUTE FOR SPRINGFEST 2023







Below are some tips and reminders for successful relocation of your Pet(s)

1. Do not wait.... Plan Ahead

- ☐ As soon as orders are in hand, contact the Commercial Travel Office for assistance booking your pet reservation on a Patriot Express (PE) flight or commercial flight
- ☐ PE passenger and pet reservations can be made 90-120 days prior to departure
- ☐ Pet spaces on PE are limited (First come, first served)

2. Health and Safety

- ☐ Plan immunizations to ensure your pet is current
- ☐ Contact the local veterinarian office for specific importation requirements (pet quarantine and detention)
- ☐ Brachycephalic (snub or pug nosed) breeds are more prone to medical emergencies while flying on planes than other types of dogs/cats
- ☐ Pets with underlying health conditions, including obesity, are at increased risk during travel
- ☐ Under supervision, allow pets to spend time outdoors to acclimate to extreme temperatures in a secure setting

3. Travel Risks

- ☐ Heat stroke, respiratory problems, and the possibility of death
- ☐ Pets will experience altitude changes and extreme temperatures
- ☐ Air travel may not be possible for some pets based on their age, health status or breed

4. Pet Kennel Requirements

- ☐ IAW International Air Transport Association (IATA) and U.S. Department of Agriculture guidelines
- ☐ Kennels must provide adequate ventilation on at least three sides
- ☐ Must be large enough for pet to stand-up, turn around, and lie down with normal posture and body movement
- ☐ Snub-nosed breeds require 10% larger kennel to allow more airflow

- ❑ **Plan ahead** - Schedule a vehicle appointment on www.PCSmyPOV.com as soon as PCS orders are received
- ❑ Utilize the new VPC **FASTPASS** appointment system to quickly upload documents online for a smoother and faster on-site turn-in process of your vehicle
- ❑ Customers receive detailed information after scheduling an appointment online


Turn-in Process

- **Pre-Insp -> Sign in/Doc -> Joint Insp -> Comment Card -> Sign out**
- **Requirements**
 - 1) Pre-shipping instruction
 - 2) PCS orders & amendment USFK Military Vehicle Registration (Must be CURRENT valid registration)
 - 3) Korean Customs Import Document
 - 4) Bill of Sale (If you purchased a vehicle in Korea)
 - 5) Deregistration certificate
 - 6) Recall report stating there are **no outstanding recalls** identified on the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) website <https://www.nhtsa.gov/recalls>

Pick up

- **Sign in/Doc -> Joint Insp -> Claims -> Comment Card -> Sign out**
- **Requirements**
 - 1) ID
 - 2) VIF (Vehicle Inspection Form) from the origin VPC

Temporary plates are not required for POV pick up. Customer will be provided with a memorandum that allows the vehicle to be driven only on Camp Humphreys without plates for 2 business days after pick-up.

Reduce your time at a VPC by submitting your documents online prior to your appointment.

Visit www.PCSmyPOV.com and click the Turn In Header to schedule your Turn In appointment. You will have the option to select **FASTPASS**. It's as easy as 1, 2, 3....

1. Enter your information and upload your documents.
2. The VPC will review, communicate via email if any additional information is needed, and approve if all in order.
3. Show up to your appointment and ship your POV!

An approved **FASTPASS appointment can potentially cut your processing time in half.**

CID: Fraud Prevention

- Camp Humphreys experienced an increase in credit/debit card fraud.
- The total loss is unclear; however, the largest reported loss was \$2,100.
- Victims often reported they noticed fraudulent transactions after making purchases at the 24-hour gas stations on the installation.
- Some victims reported their outcry to the Camp Humphreys Support Group on Facebook.
- The Camp Humphreys Fraud Team opened an investigation targeting the transactions and will continue to coordinate with CID and adjacent LEO partners for assistance.
- A physical security check of the 24-hour gas stations did not reveal evidence of tampering.





CID: Fraud Prevention

1. Try to segment your funds to prevent possible losses. Place all money in one account, and only what you intend to use immediately into another account. Only transfer money from the isolated account into the active one when you need it.
2. Be aware. Skimmers are often plastic covers that sit on top of the legitimate payment method. This can often be tested by trying to wiggle or move the payment module. Do this every time you are at an isolated pay station.
3. Keep track of your card. If you lose it, recovering it is very difficult. Immediately contact banks when you lose a card. Do not wait.
4. Keep your card in sight. Shimmying is a different technique that is a lot less common than skimming, that other vendors may use if they take your card away from the pay station or use a different module often out of sight.
5. Be careful when online. Some malware through Pharming scams may try to take your card or bank information.
6. Try as often as you can not to provide your card information over the phone, this is one of the less secure ways to pay.
7. Enable two factor authentication on all apps, with banking information
8. Enable fraud alerts on all bank accounts that can be viewed on your phone through touch tones.
9. Use NFC or tap feature to pay for transactions instead of swiping or inserting your card when possible.

CID: Fraud Prevention

- If you are affected by debit/credit card fraud, notify your bank IMMEDIATELY. Also, report the incident to the Federal Trade Commission at <https://reportfraud.ftc.gov/#/>
- If you feel the incident originated from Camp Humphreys, report the incident to the Camp Humphreys DES Office who will forward the incident to CID for evaluation and investigation.



MASSIVE CRACKDOWN IN PROGRESS BY KNP : **DRUG CRIMES & DUI**

1. DRUG CRIMES

(Background)

Citizens in Korea feel very insecure due to **the recent surge in drug use**, especially after the recent shocking scam where high school students in Seoul were duped into drinking **drug-laced beverages**.



On April 2nd-3rd in Seoul, four suspects offered soft drinks laced with **amphetamines and ecstasy** to high-schoolers faking a promotional event for a new beverage that would **help improve their concentration**. They then **blackmailed their parents** with the threat that their kids would test positive for drugs.

(PLAN)

- establishing a **large-scale investigation unit** comprising 840 officials from different government agencies
➔ focusing on large-scale drug smuggling, illegal circulation of medical-purpose drugs and drug dealing over the internet
- **On-site crackdowns** at **bars, clubs**, and other establishments where illegal drugs could be frequently used.

MASSIVE CRACKDOWN IN PROGRESS BY KNP : **DRUG CRIMES & DUI**

2. DUI

(Background)

Social uproar has intensified in the wake of recent **fatal accidents caused by drunk driving**, especially after the fatality and serious injuries of 4 children aged 9 to 12 hit by a drunk driver.

(PLAN)

- Major crackdown on DUI across the country including **Pyeongtaek (20th April to 31st May)**
 - ➡ (Hours) Particularly targeting the **daytime** which have been more difficult to enforce compared to nighttime
 - ➡ (Locations) Not only focus on places like bars, restaurants and highway toll booths, but also extend to **school zones and tourist attractions.**



➔ Riding a **bicycle** or **motorcycle**, as well as **jogging**, is **not allowed** on this road.


Recently, there was a motorcycle accident involving a SOFA member, and there have been some police reports of motorcycles being ridden on the 43rd Road near Adams gate.

POV Traffic Pattern / Gate Procedures

- Upon arrival at the Out-Bound access Control Point , affiliated personnel will proceed straight ahead after manual ID verification.
- Personnel requiring an escort will be directed to the POV VCC. After affiliated and visitors ID and vehicle documents have been verified and a check against the USFK Bar Roster is performed, visitors will be manually process for a daily escorted visitor pass.
