Command Policy #27: Standards of Child Supervision

The Child Supervision Guidelines Matrix is a tool used to avoid instances of child neglect and serves as guide for the appropriate level of adult supervision for children.

Key Takeaways:

- At no time shall a child be left unattended under circumstances involving risk to health and/or safety
- Children 7 to 9 years old and walking to or from school or the bus stop should follow the buddy system
- Children below the age of 9 require direct supervision, they can't be left home alone or alone overnight
- Children 11 years old that are eligible to stay home alone should complete Home Alone Self-Care Training provided through Child Youth Services (CYS)
- Children that meet Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) criteria may require special levels of supervision
- Applies to all military and civilian employees of the Department of Defense (DoD) and Invited Contractors

Off-Post School Zone Commuting Area

1. There is an established commuting area for students transported to the Department of Defense Activity (DoDEA) at USAG Humphreys. The Student Transportation Office (STO) is the proponent for the management of the commuting Area. Maps of the DoDEA school bus commuting area is and a list of residence within the area is located at the Housing Services Office (HSO) and STO.
2. Sponsors are advised to visit the HSO and STO to ensure perspective housing they choose is within the commuting area where bus service is provided prior to signing a lease agreement.
3. USAG Humphreys Lease Agreement, Clause 6 states, “Lessee acknowledges that if housing is obtained outside the school zone commuting area, the Lessee is responsible for the transportation of dependent students, between their home and school or to an existing bus stop, on a “space-available” basis.

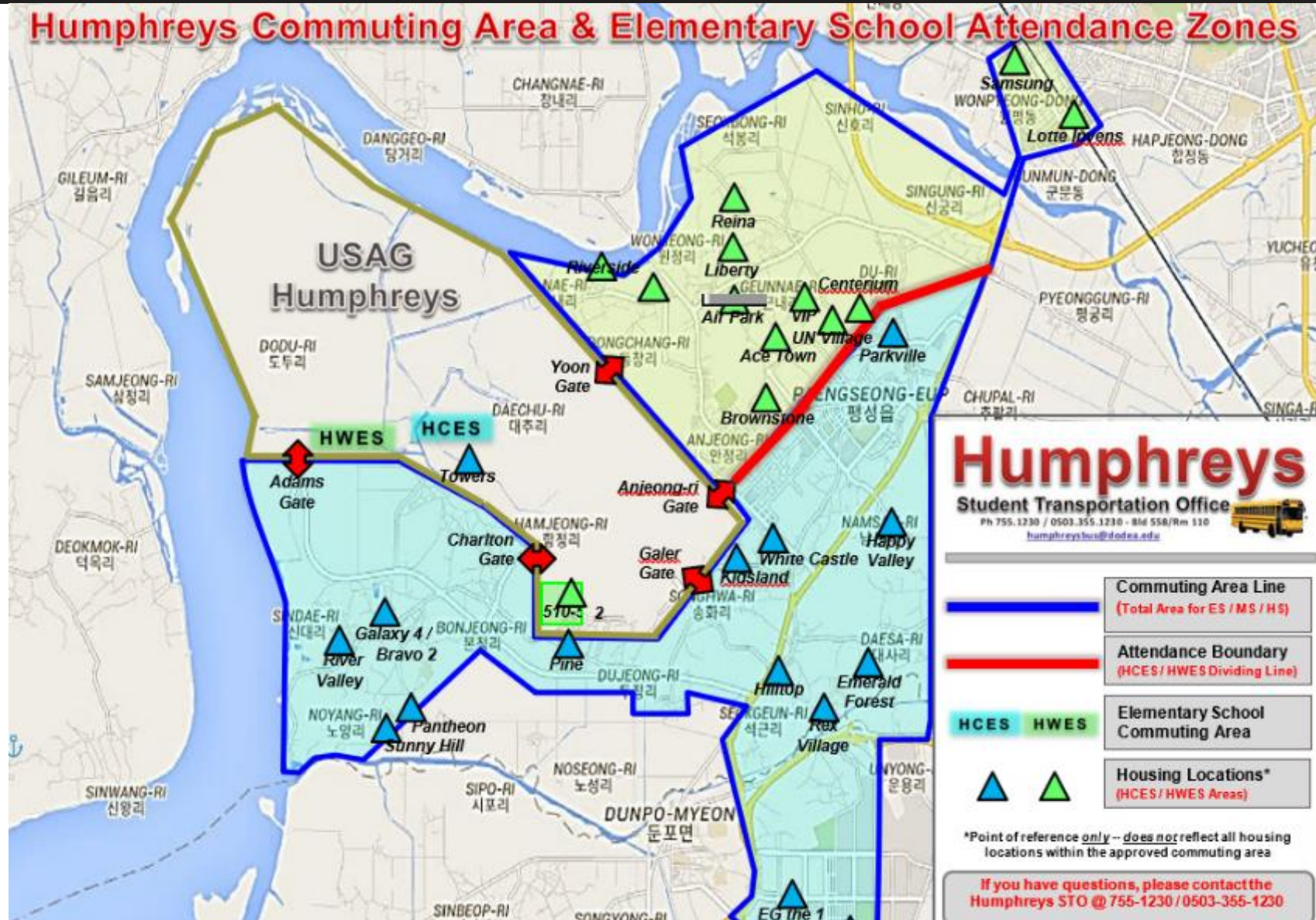

MEDPROS: NCAT Testing Program (Pt. 1)

New MEDPROS Requirement - NCAT

Currently all Soldiers on peninsula are coded “RED” (Tier I) or "AMBER" (Tier II/III) in MEDPROS for NCAT, which stands for Neuro-Cognitive Assessment Tool. This is a new mandatory requirement under the DOD Cognitive Monitoring Program (CMP). Individuals are categorized into three tiers based on their MOS's level of risk.

Blast Overpressure Exposure Prioritized by MOS		
Tier Level	Description	Suspense
I	SM's duties/position exposes them to overpressure consistently	NLT 1 OCT 2025
II	SM's duties/position exposes them to overpressure frequently	NLT 1 OCT 2026
III	SM's duties/position exposes them to overpressure occasionally	NLT 1 OCT 2027

What is NCAT?

It is DoD policy that all Service members and DoD civilian employees across the deployment cycle will undergo computerized neurocognitive assessment testing. Neurocognitive assessment tools (NCATs) are used to screen for changes in cognitive status over time.

What is ANAM?

The Automated Neuropsychological Assessment Metrics (ANAM) is the DoD-designated neurocognitive assessment tool until evolving science and medical best practices inform a change in policy. It is one of several commercially available neurocognitive tools consisting of a library of computer-based assessments of cognitive domains including attention, concentration, reaction time, memory, processing speed, and decision-making.

 - > 6 months old of age (requirement only for dogs)
 - Appears healthy upon arrival (dogs & cats)
- Consult with Veterinary Services as soon as possible if your dog has visited a rabies high-risk country within the 6 months before arriving to the U.S. as additional requirements apply.

OCONUS:

- Rabies Vaccine with Rabies Certificate (dogs & cats)
- ISO Compliant Microchip and its number listed on all required documents (dogs & cats)
- Valid FAVN (dogs & cats)
- Health Certificate (dogs & cats)
- ROK Inspection Certificate (dogs & cats)
- Quarantine Notification/Entry Permit Request (dogs & cats)
- Proof of Additional Vaccines/Parasite Treatment
 - DAPv, Leptospirosis, Parainfluenza, Bordetella (dogs)
 - FVRCP, FeLV (cats)
 - Endo/Ectoparasites (dogs & cats)

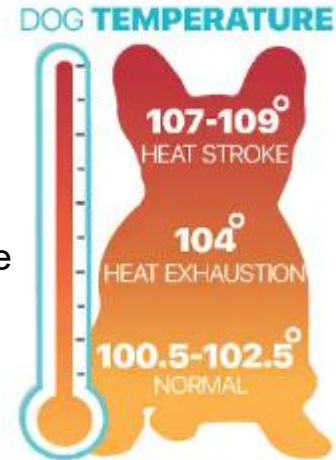


Summer Pet Safety Tips

- Risk for heat injury/heat stroke increases when:
 - Ambient temp is > 80F
 - High humidity
 - Pet is not acclimated to heat/exercise
 - Brachycephalic breeds (Bulldogs, Pugs, Boxers, Persians, etc)
- DO NOT leave pets unattended in a parked car.
- DO NOT leave your pet unsupervised outside on a hot day.
- Assess if pavement is too hot for your pet's paws by placing your hand on the pavement for five seconds.
- Avoid strenuous exercise during hottest times of the day
- Provide access to fresh, cool water frequently
- Provide shade/shelter from direct sunlight.



- Book a direct flight to destination when possible, avoid layovers
- Travel early morning or late evening
- Use a proper size IATA compliant crate.
- Familiarize your pet with the travel carrier prior to travel date
- Ensure pet crate has proper identification
- Inform airline employees when you board that you are traveling with a pet



IF YOU SUSPECT PET HEAT INJURY:

- Signs of heat injury: weakness, vomiting, diarrhea, dull mentation, uncontrollable panting, drooling, stumbling, seizures, collapse
- Move your pet out of direct heat
- Offer fresh, cool water if your pet is alert and willing to drink
- Spray your pet with cool water
- Immediately take your pet to a veterinarian for further care





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Two types of Family Force Protection Initiative (FFPI) dependent masks

□ FFPI Masks for Non-Combatants

- Infant Chemical Agent Protective System (ICAPS) for 0-8 years of age
- CH-15 Escape Hood Carrier for Adults & Children (9-years and up)

ICAPS: 0~8 years of age

- LIN: HA400J
- Nomenclature: Infant and Child Shield Hood



CH-15: 9 years and older

- LIN: HA400J
- Nomenclature: Escape Hood Carrier





- ❑ The FFPI masks are required for all dependents to execute the Noncombatant Evacuation Operation (NEO) exercise and to protect against chemical, biological, and radiological hazards
- ❑ Camp Humphreys CIF will provide FFPI masks to the Sponsor during in-processing. The Sponsor is required to bring the following documentation:
 - Command Sponsored SMs: Command Sponsored Order
 - Non-Command Sponsored SMs: Company CDR's Memo with dependent info
 - DoD Civilian: Letter of Employment (LOE) with dependent information
 - Wartime Critical Contractor: Memo of Accreditation for contract No. & USFK 700-19A
- ❑ Training information is found at the following website:

- ❑ **PLEASE DO NOT OPEN FFPI MASKS FOR TRAINING**
 - If a mask is opened, the Sponsor will incur the cost for replacement
 - The only time an FFPI mask can be opened is during a real-world chemical, biological, or radiological hazard
