FINANCIAL-BASED RESOURCES



ARMY EMERGENCY RELIEF

Provides an interest-free laan equal to the amount of one not paycheck, up to a maximum amount of \$6,000, for soldiers and families who experience financial hardship due to lock of pay. Soldiers must repay the full amount within 30 days, and will begin on Oct. 30, after they receive back pay following the government shutdown. AER now offers online applications for loans. https://www.armyemergencyrelief.org/loans/



FINANCIAL READINESS PROGRAM

Financial Counselors can help review your budgets and prioritize essential expenses. They can provide education on managing bills, communicating with creditors, and explaining available reliaf options. USAA

Members who are employed by a federal agency that's been affected and have received an eligible direct deposit into a USAA checking or savings account within 30 days prior to the beginning of the shutdown will be able to apply for a zero-interest loan equal to the amount of one net pay check, up to \$6,000. Members may also be able to set up special payment arrangements for auto and property insurance premiums, life and health insurance premiums, credit cards, consumer loans, home equity lines of credit, and other credit.

Offering 0% interest for three months for all commissory purchases worldwide made using a MIU TARY STAR card from Oct. 1 to Oct. 31 for all new and existing cardholders.

WARRIOR FOOD PANTRY

Serving all military families in need by providing dry goods, baby items, disposable cutlery, and hygiene items. Located at 1009 Talon Street and open M, W, F 1000-1400



IAVY FEDERAL

Eligible members with direct deposit of pay who are service members, federal government emplayees and federal government contractors paid directly by the federal government may be eligible for a loan with zero interest or fees. Loan amounts of up to \$6,000 are calculated based on the most recent direct deposit. Once direct deposit of pay resumes, the amount credited to the account will be deducted automatically as repayment.

HOLIDAY LIGHTING GUIDELINES

Balcony/Exterior of Residences

Everyone loves to decorate during the holiday season! Especially during the holidays, it is extremely important to be aware of fire dangers. **DO NOT overload electrical outlets.**

- All Halloween lights must be removed NLT 8 November.
- Christmas lights must not be installed prior to 15 November and will be removed NLT 15 January 2026.
- Light strands should be limited to no more than five (5) per tower unit, seven (7) for Red Cloud Circle, and ten (10) for MacArthur Circle. Written requests are required, for any exceptions beyond these limitations, to the attention of the Housing Division Facilities Branch Chief, Mr. Don Bizek, at donald.r.bizek.civ@army.mil, DSN 757-2069
- Outside decorative lights are to be turned off by 2200 nightly, except on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve, when they are allowed to remain on overnight.
- All lights must be turned off during daylight hours!

- Army Family Housing Towers: AC has been shut off and turning on heat has started.



CARBON MONOXIDE POISONING

Winter can be a prime time for carbon monoxide poisoning as people turn on their heating systems and warm their cars in garages. So as the weather turns colder, it's important to take extra precautions.

Open the garage door prior to starting your vehicle in the garage.

Use caution when operating space heaters, wood stoves and gas logs.

Ensure the space is well ventilated and clear.

Carbon monoxide detectors save lives. Every year, over 400 people die in the U.S., and 50,000 are treated for carbon monoxide poisoning.

If an alarm sounds, move to fresh air and call 9-1-1.

The most common symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning are often described as "flu-like"-headache, dizziness, weakness, upset stomach, vomiting, chest pain and confusion.

TIP: Install a battery-operated or battery-backup carbon monoxide detector in the hallway near each separate sleeping area in your home.

Check or replace the battery when you change the time on your clocks each spring and fall and replace the detector every five years.



Criminal Offenses: Defamation & Insult

■ Recent Criminal Cases Involving SOFA Members in Pyeongtaek

Defamation	In a group chat, the offender wrote, "(Victim's name) is a cheater. she had an affair with her colleague."
Insult	Posted on Instagram a photo and the name of his ex-girlfriend with the caption "the worst bit" to be with."
Insult	In an underground parking lot, the offender shouted at the victim, "Crazy bit*, are you nuts? Drive properly!"

■ Legal Definitions and Punishments (IAW The Criminal Act)

Defamation (Article 307)	Insult (Article 311)
Publicly disclosing specific facts whether true or false that lower someone's social reputation in the eyes of others. True: ≤ 2 yrs imprisonment or ≤ ₩ 5M False: ≤ 5 yrs or ≤ ₩10M	Publicly degrading or humiliating another person through offensive language, ridicule, or other derogatory remarks. ≤ 1 yr imprisonment or ≤ ₩2M

- Even true statements can be punishable unless made solely in the public interest (e.g., exposing a candidate's misconduct).
- ✓ Talking about someone's rumor with a friend can be a criminal matter if it's likely to spread to others.
- ✓ Online defamation, including posts and comments, is punished more severely due to its wide reach.
- ✓ Sharing or reposting defamatory content can also be a criminal offense, even if you believed it to be true.



BDAACH MSU/ICU – New Tele-Critical Care (TCC) Program



As of October 15th, 2025 Brian D. Allgood Army Community Hospital joined the DHA's Joint Tele-Critical Care Network, integrating Tele-ICU capabilities within the MTF.

Like the civilian community, there is a shortage of intensivists (critical care) in military medicine. As a result, tele-critical care services have been implemented in numerous hospitals in the U.S.

The JTCCN provides critical care support provided by doctors and nurses located at hub sites to on-site staff and patients via high-definition video-teleconference technology. The JTCCN currently provides services to 26 MTF's covering 135 beds.

BDAACH's ICU teams now have access to 24/7 Tele-Critical Care support from board-certified intensivists and critical care nurses located at Naval Medical Center San Diego, Brooke Army Medical Center, and Walter Reed National Military Medical Center.

This approach to critical care has been shown to decrease ICU length of stay and allows the facility to retain high-acuity patients as opposed to transferring directly to local Host Nation Hospitals.

SUBJECT: Army Directive 2025-18 (Appearance, Grooming, and Army Body Composition Program Standards)

- 1. References.
- Army Regulation (AR) 600-8-2 (Suspension of Favorable Personnel Actions (Flag)), 5 April 2021
 - b. AR 600-9 (The Army Body Composition Program), 16 July 2019
 - c. AR 670-1 (Wear and Appearance of Army Uniforms and Insignia), 26 January 2021
- 2. Purpose. This directive establishes updated policy for appearance, grooming, body composition, and uniform wear standards, emphasizing military appearance as a reflection of discipline, professionalism, and a shared commitment to the Army's values. The intent of this directive is to reinforce uniformity and discipline while fostering consistency and professionalism across the Army.
- Applicability. This directive applies to the Regular Army, Army National Guard/Army National Guard of the United States, and U.S. Army Reserve.
- 4. Policy. Within 30 days of the date of this directive, all Soldiers will be required to meet the appearance, grooming, and body composition standards in this directive. This period serves as a transition to facilitate understanding and compliance for both Soldiers and leadership. All Soldiers will comply with hair, fingernail, grooming, and body composition policies while in any military uniform or while on duty in civilian attire. The standards for appearance, grooming, and body composition are necessary to maintain uniformity and discipline, which are fundamental to military service.
- a. Adhering to policies and regulations regarding appearance, including uniform wear and grooming standards, demonstrates a shared commitment to maintaining a professional military appearance. A well-maintained military appearance reflects disciplined attention to detail, respect for authority, and pride in oneself and the Army that are critical to building cohesive teams and enabling an effective warfighting organization. Commanders, supported by the noncommissioned officer support chain, will enforce the standards prescribed in enclosure 1 (Personal Appearance Policies) and enclosure 2 (Wear of Army Uniforms and Insignia).
