



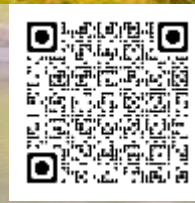

Pre-Registration (New and Existing Students)

- To register to attend a DoDEA School the following age requirements must be met.
A child must be:
 - four years old by September 1 to attend Sure Start.
 - five years old by September 1 to enroll in kindergarten.
 - six years old by September 1 to attend first grade.
- DoDEA Online Registration Portal <https://dodeasis.myfollett.com/aspen> to register new students.
- Existing students contact the School Registrar to update student information.

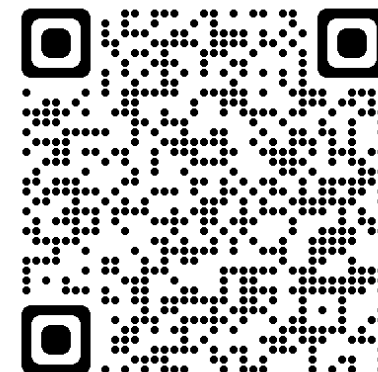

WHEN DO WE MEET?

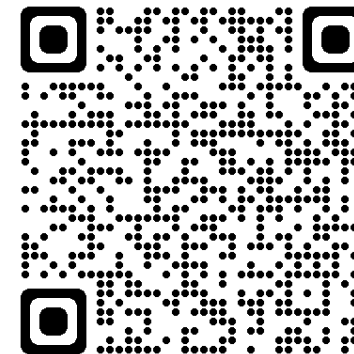
We meet **every Thursday** for a few hours during the typical school semesters providing classes for school aged children from **K-12**.

School Speed Limit Hours
0700-0900 and 1200-1600



- The crosswalk between Central Elementary and the Four Chaplains Chapel has priority during the School Zone hours.
- During inclement weather headlights will be illuminated to increase safety.

VIOLATION

1 to 16 km/h (1 to 10 MPH) over posted speed limit. **Points assessed: 3**

Over 16 to 24 km/h (10 to 15 MPH) above posted speed limit. **Points assessed: 4**

Over 24 to 32 km/h (15 to 20 MPH) above posted speed limit. **Points assessed: 5**

Over 32 km/h (20 MPH) per hour above posted speed limit. **Points assessed: 6**

AAFES – School Meal Program (SMP)



1. REGISTER EACH STUDENT WITH DODEA (New Students)

- Obtain 10-digit DODEA student ID# for all students from the school registrar.
- You will need each student's ID# for step 3.

2. REGISTER YOUR FAMILY ON LINQ CONNECT

- Register at linqconnect.com.
- Confirm your email address by clicking on the email verification link sent to your email address.
- Now you can sign in at linqconnect.com using your email and password.
- LINQ Connect is a secure, online system that allows parents to:
 - Make online payments for their student's meal accounts
 - Remotely monitor their student's accounts
 - Set up automatic recurring payments
 - Submit an online application for free and/or reduced meals



3. OPTIONS FOR DEPOSITING MONEY INTO YOUR STUDENT'S ACCOUNT

- **Option 1: COMING SOON!** Add money to your student's account through LINQ Connect at linqconnect.com. There is a \$2.60 bank convenience fee each time you add money through the portal.
 - Click on Add Money to Meal Account and choose either One Time Account Payment or New Recurring Payment.
 - You may transfer money from one student account to another provided they are listed on the same family account.
- **Option 2:** Make deposits at your local Exchange.
 - There will be no transaction fee for this service. You will need each student's DODEA ID# obtained in step 1 above.
- **Option 3:** You may send cash to school with your student to be added through your school meal cashier. There is no transaction fee for this service.

4. SUBMIT YOUR 2023/2024 ONLINE APPLICATION FOR FREE OR REDUCED MEALS

- Mandatory for all Sure Start students.
- A new application is required for every school year.
- You only need **one** application per **household**.
 - Please include **ALL** family members on **one** application.
- Apply at linqconnect.com. See instructions and FAQ attached.

New SMP System: LINQ connect

- › Students will be in LINQ connect once registered in DoDEA school
 - › Current students' funds will be imported
 - › Negative Account Balances
- › LINQ connect parent account required to monitor students spending account
 - › Need Students ID# to link to parent acct
 - › Monitor accounts, make payments
 - › Apply for free and reduced meals
 - › Only one application required per household
 - › Mandatory for all Sure Start students
- › Refunds- send request to SMPCustsvc@aafes.com for those who have PCS'd

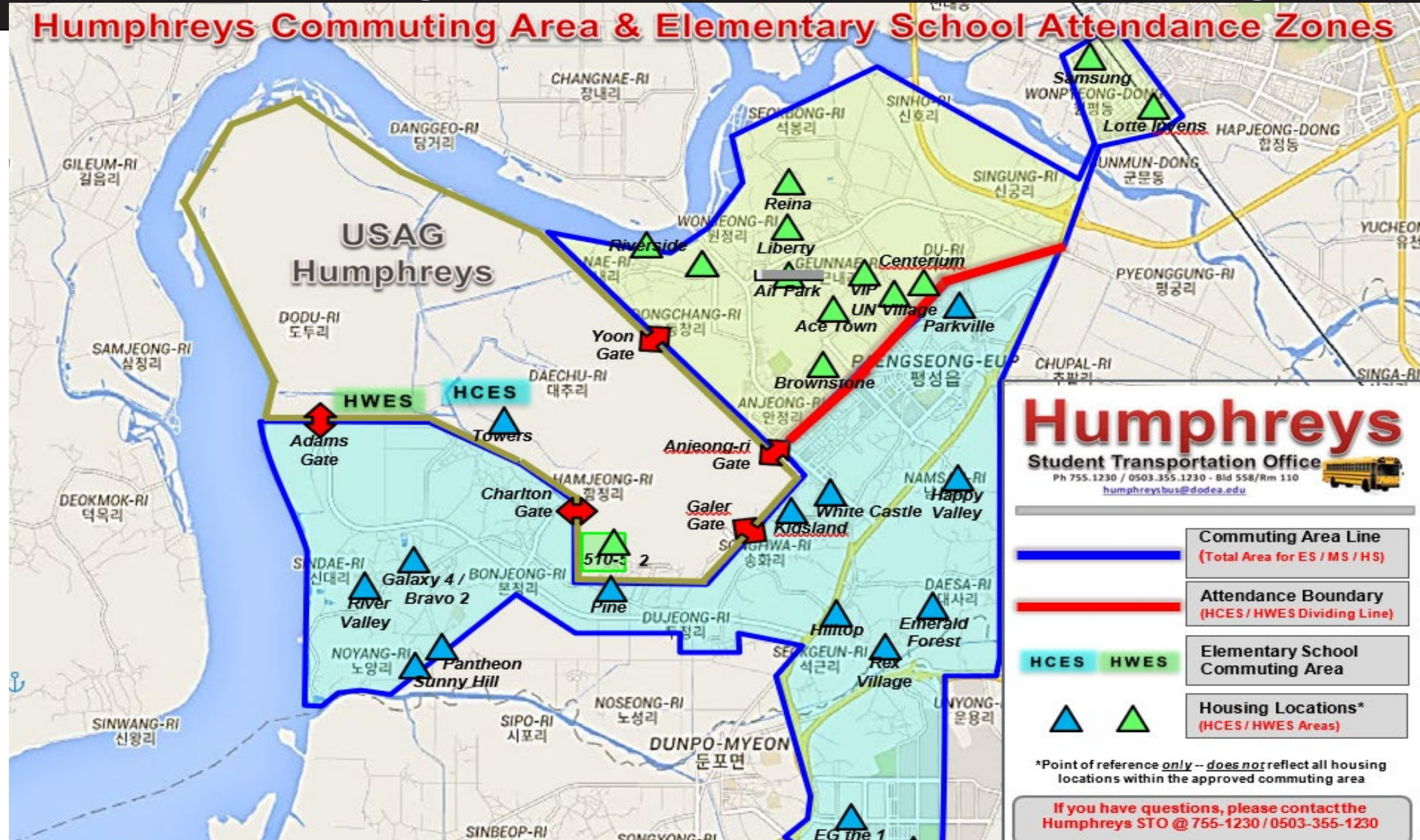
DPW – Housing Off-post School Zone Commuting Area

1. There is an established commuting area for students transported to the Department of Defense Activity (DoDEA) at USAG Humphreys. The Student Transportation Office (STO) is the proponent for the management of the commuting Area. Maps of the DoDEA school bus commuting area and a list of residences within the area is located at the Housing Services Office (HSO) and STO.
2. Sponsors are advised to visit the HSO and STO to ensure prospective housing they choose is within the commuting area where bus service is provided prior to signing a lease agreement.
3. USAG Humphreys Lease Agreement, Clause 6 states, “Lessee acknowledges that if housing is obtained outside the school zone commuting area, the Lessee is responsible for the transportation of dependent students, between their home and school or to an existing bus stop on a “space-available” basis.

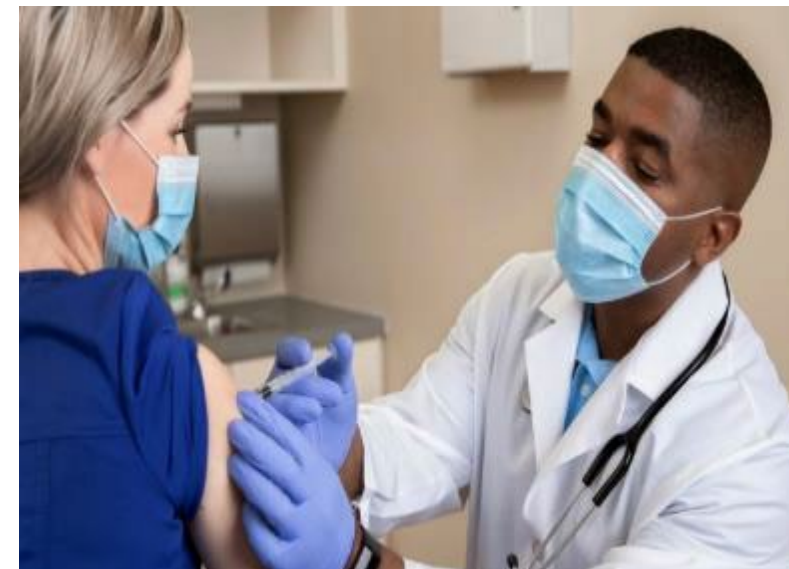

Immunizations

- Immunizations available on a walk-in basis for routine immunizations
- Where: BDAACH PCMH, 1st floor of hospital
- When:
 - Pediatric clinic hours: 0820-1130; 1300-1700
 - Immunization hours: 0830-1100; 1300-1600
 - For both services, excluding Thursday mornings from 0830-1130 (Leader's Time Training)
- Routine childhood immunizations can be performed in concert with pediatric well child exams in the Pediatric clinic (pending availability of vaccine) or on a walk-in basis
- For well child exams, schedule via Central Appointments (737-2273), TOLSM (Tricare Online Secure Messaging) and PCMH front desk
- For walk-in immunizations, pull ticket at kiosks in PCMH waiting area
