Overview: PFC Oh initially faced concerns about his General Technical (GT) score upon joining the military, feeling it might hinder his ambition to become an officer. As a native Korean speaker, PFC Oh struggled with arithmetic reasoning and English comprehension. However, with dedication and support from the BSEP program, he gained confidence and proficiency, increasing his GT score 42 points.

Impact: PFC Oh's journey underscores the transformative impact of educational support programs like BSEP within the military. His future goals include pursuing a Masters degree and become an officer. Despite initial challenges, his determination and the course's structured approach yielded tangible results, positioning him well for future educational and career aspirations. His story serves as an inspiration and practical guidance for others navigating similar paths within the Armed Forces.

- It is important to dry water-damaged areas and items within 24-48 hours to prevent mold growth.

E7 and above with UNACCOMPANIED ORDERS – SENIOR LEADER QUARTERS (SLQs)

Sponsors for Personnel with unaccompanied orders (UO) scheduled to reside in SLQs please note:

V1. If, Service Member (SM) Orders state, "per the FMR you MAY be eligible re-imbursement for your pet": this does not apply to personnel with UOs. SMs with UOs are not authorized pets when residing in SLQs.

V2. Prior to PCS: Service Members MUST contact the gaining Housing Office to ensure what entitlements they are authorized.

√3. Sponsors: Should not encourage SMs to bring pets. Single SMs with UOs have mandatory assignment to SLQs. Sponsors should contact the Housing Office to ensure they are providing SMs with the correct information.

√4. TLA: Unaccompanied personnel must in-process through the Housing Office within 48 hrs. of arrival. They are authorized 3-days TLA, to include weekends.

V Directorate of Emergency Services – Civilian Misconduct

- Each sponsor is responsible for ensuring that his/her family members are aware of and comply with legal and community standards of personal conduct and will make every effort to prevent misconduct by family members.
- Examples of Administrative Sanctions:
 - (1) The sponsor may be counseled about the conduct of the family member.
 - (2) A letter of warning may be issued.
 - (3) Revocation of privileges (commissary, exchange and recreation services).
 - (4) The member's privately owned vehicle operator's license may be suspended, revoked, or disapproved in accordance with (IAW) USFK Reg 190-1.
 - (5) Members may be barred from the military installation IAW USFK Reg 190-7. However, they are still generally entitled to medical and dental care. In addition, if the civilian is employed on-
 - post, the bar may have to be tailored to permit travel to and from the work place.
 - (6) The member's ration control privileges may be withdrawn IAW USFK Reg 60-1.
 - (7) Termination of government quarters (AR 420-1, Army Facilities Management).
 - (8) Early return of military family members to the continental U.S. (CONUS).
 - (9) Performance of community service.

Things to Know Before You Go

- Parents must bring **filled** and **signed** physical forms to the appointment. BDAACH does not have copies of forms.
- If the child wears corrective lenses or glasses, they should bring or wear them.
- It is recommended (but not necessary) for the child to wear or bring shorts.
- This event is for school/sports physicals only.
 - It does not replace a routine appointment with a primary care provider.
 - If there are other concerns or issues (chronic and acute medical concerns, medication refills, referrals, etc.), please make an appointment with the child's primary care provider during regular clinic hours.





MANDATORY BACK TO SCHOOL HEALTH CHECKS

For TRICARE Select and Non-enrolled Patients:

- Contact TRICARE or your health insurance provider to ask which clinics are covered and establish care with a PCM.
- The PCM should be able to perform the sports physical and complete the paperwork provided by CYS or the school for sports participation. (See links on the right)
- Paperwork for participation in sports can be obtained from the schools/DODEA or CYS, respectively.
- If the patient desires their forms to be added to their MHS GENESIS patient records, please contact the BDAACH PAD office on the 2nd floor to have it uploaded.
- Uploading the records is unnecessary for sports participation as the only thing required by the schools or CYS is a physical copy of the form.

NEW Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Dog Importation Rules to the U.S.

ANY dog entering the United States starting 01 AUG 2024 MUST:

- Be at least 6 months of age
- Appear healthy upon arrival
- Have ISO compliant microchip AND have it listed on all required documents
- Have a CDC Dog Import Form receipt
- Have additional rabies vaccination or veterinary documentation on hand*

*Additional requirements are based on where the dog has been in the last six months and whether or not the dog received rabies vaccine in the United States

Army Veterinary Services Can Provide:

- Rabies vaccine that counts as vaccinated in the U.S.
- ISO microchip implantation and validation
- Endorsement of *Certification of U.S. Issued Rabies Vaccine Form* for dogs vaccinated in the U.S. or at
 OCONUS military Veterinary Treatment Facility
- Further guidance for owners with dogs that have visited a rabies high-risk country within the 6 months before arriving to the U.S.

Emergency Communication Messages

Red Cross Messages provide objective, timely, confidential, factual, complete and verified information about **emergency** or potential **emergency** situations involving service members and their immediate family members, which can assist service members and military authorities in making informed decisions regarding leave.

- Must be an emergency
- Must involve an immediate family member
- Must be verifiable

- Installation Clearance Record (DA Form 137-2) or civilian equivalent
- PCS Orders or Exception To Policy memo signed by unit commander
- Military Identification Card or Common Access Card
- All SMs must be in duty uniform (PTs and civilian clothing are unauthorized)
- All OCIE must be cleaned, in good condition, and serviceable at the time of turn-in
