

RANGE D (FTIR-016-R-01)

United States Army Garrison - Fort Irwin (USAG:FTIR) has updated the Munitions Response Site Prioritization Protocol (MRSPP) at three former military training areas on National Training Center and Fort Irwin, Fort Irwin, to assign the sites a relative priority for response activity. The former munitions training areas RANGE D (FTIR-016-R-01) underwent phase Feasibility Study Investigations following the Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) process in order to determine the best remedial action alternative for the sites.

The projects are moving on to the Purposed Plan phase. National Training Center and Fort Irwin is an active Department of Defense (DoD) military installation, one of many throughout the United States that is reviewed under the MRSPP. This protocol is used to prioritize former Munitions Response Sites with a potential for unexploded ordnance, discarded military munitions or munitions constituents with regard to future clean-up actions. The MRSPP documents for National Training Center and Fort Irwin are available for public review at Department of Public Works Environmental office Building 602 5th Street, Fort Irwin, Ca. for 30 days.
