Memorandum will identify persons by name and weapon system(s) qualified to perform OIC/RSO duties. The memorandum must be signed by Commander O-5 or above. Certification expire after on year from date of the memorandum. NTC Regulation 385-63 dictates OIC/RSO requirements for appointment.

Nonstandard Range Requests

Unit wanting to modify a standard range's set up or change the conduct of fire rules must submit a "Nonstandard Range Packet" to Range Operations for approval. Unit needs to contact the Range Safety Officer as early as possible to start the scheduling and range plan approval process. Unit wanting to design a temporary range in the training areas or in the rotation LFX Area must submit a "Non-standard Range Packet" to Range Operations for approval. Unit needs to contact the Range Safety Officer as early as possible to start the scheduling and range plan approval process. All final plans for Nonstandard Range Requests must be submitted to the Fort Irwin Range Support Safety Officer at least 14 working days before the event.

Nonstandard Range Packet consists of:

1. Concept of the Operation and Range Safety Plan (IAW with D.A. Pam 385-63 requirements) (What the event will look like and the timeline)
2. All individual SDZ's (Computed from grid plots of all target locations, firing points and maneuver lanes.)
3. Live fire scenario engagements
4. Composite Risk Assessment

\*\*\*Nonstandard Events will not be confirmed in RFMSS until Range Operations has reviewed and approved the Nonstandard Range Packet information.

\*\*\*Final approval authority is NTC G3 for all Nonstandard Ranges

#### Water Point and Water Buffalo Certification

The POC for certifying water buffalo can be reached at 760.380.3026, preventative medicine is located in Bldg. 172, across from Shuttleworth Dental Clinic and the Weed Army Community Hospital. Certification must be accomplished during the week because preventive medicine does not work weekends. The water point is located in the RUBA motor pool, directly across the street from the back entrance to the Burger King.

Food support from TISA requires the unit to provide letter of intent, planned feeding cycle and headcount to FPM at 760.380.3998/6731 NLT D-90. Unit will verify headcount and fax to TISA at 760.380.6394 at D-30 along with Commander's assumption of command signature cards identifying Class I requestors/receivers.

Garrison dining facility support requires a letter of intent, headcount and requirements, contact COR at 760.380.4124.

Bulk Fuel: Unit needs to forecast anticipated use and supply DA 1687, Assumption of Command Memo and a letter of intent. Ensure all fuel handlers and fuel trucks meet NTC standards prior to arrival. NTC will give a free issue of any opened products they have on hand. An Assumption of Command Memo, DA 1687, and letter of intent is required if the unit does not ship their own. Fuel keys can be requested through the POC at 760.380.3626.

All ammunition must be submitted through TAMIS-R with NTC as the forecast location. Assumption of command, DA 1687 and DA 581 are required. For specific inquiries to ammunition contact the installation ammunition manager at 760.380.3888/4000. Ensure driver and assistant driver are hazardous qualified IAW Ft. Irwin ASP standard operating procedures.

RC-OPT does not provide support for Class II, IV, VI, VII, VIII or IX.

#### Medical Support/Supplies

Fort Irwin doesn't offer sick call procedures for non-rotational training units. All units will have to utilize their own medics for medical support. Units with more than 200 Soldiers or more are required by Fort Irwin to be self-sustaining with their own PA. For Emergency (life or death) Soldiers must have a copy of their orders in possession IOT to receive medical support. Please coordinate with units in your area or use your CLS certified personnel within the limits of Army/post policy.

Unit needs to have all CLS / Medic bags filled at home station prior to movement. RC-OPT does not have access to medics or medical supplies, however Fort Irwin can provide a small amount of refills. The POC for this is Kathy Kuckenbecker (760-380-3031/760-964-1626).
