SUBJECT: NTC Policy #12, Prohibited Activities and Items

1. REFERENCE:

California Business & Professions Code 256558.2

2. PRUPOSE: This policy lists specific activities and items prohibited by military personnel assigned or attached to the National Training Center and Fort Irwin. This policy may be further supplemented as needed by subordinate commanders. All commanders are expected to enforce the provisions of this policy.

3. APPLICABILITY: This policy supersedes all previous NTC policies with the above subject, remains in effect until specifically rescinded or superseded, and except where specifically stated, this policy applies to all United States military personnel under the administrative, operational, or tactical control of the National Training Center and Fort Irwin.

4. PUNITIVE POLICY: Violations of this policy may result in punishment of Service Members under the Uniformed Code of Military Justice and adverse administrative action against DoD civilian employees and contractors. Matters which also violate other Federal or California law may be addressed by civilian and/or military personnel from specific locations, facilities, or the installation.

5. POLICY: The following acts and items are prohibited:

a. Selling, transferring, distributing, introducing, or offering alcoholic beverages to any person(s) under the age of 21 regardless of the location. Soldiers under the age of 21 will not buy, or consume beverages containing alcohol regardless of the location. This policy does not preclude parents or legal guardians from providing alcohol to their children within their home. (Children includes those by marriage, adoption, or official guardianship). Parents will be responsible for actions of their children IAW California law.

b. All military personnel have an affirmative duty to intervene and report Soldiers who they witness violating paragraph 4(a) above, if they know or suspect one of the Soldiers involved in the violation is under the age of 21.

c. Additionally, all military personnel have the affirmative duty to intervene and report Soldiers who they witness using or possession illegal drugs.

d. In both the case of 4(b) and 4(c), there is no duty to intervene if doing so would put the reporting personnel in danger. The duty to report, however, remains. Report violations to the violating Soldier's chain of command as well as to the chain of command of the reporting personnel witnessing the activity.

e. Soldiers residing in barracks will ensure all civilian visitors sign in and out at the Charge of Quarters (CQ) desk. Soldiers are prohibited from having civilian visitors under the age of 18 in any barracks room, unless the visitor is a member of the Soldier's immediate family. Under no circumstances may Soldiers have civilian visitors in the barracks between the hours of midnight through 0800. This policy may be further supplemented by the Garrison Commander.

f. Alcohol.

(1) The following definitions are established for the purpose of this paragraph.

(a) Beer – a 6 pack of cans or bottles containing 12 ounces per can/bottle.

(b) Malt Liquor or Beer – 1 can or bottle containing 40 ounces per can/bottle.

(c) Liquor or Wine – 1 bottle or carton containing 750ml per bottle/carton.

(2) Each Soldier 21 years of age and older living in the barracks may possess no more than 3 of the items as defined in paragraph 8b(1) (e.g., 3 x 6 packs of beer; 3 bottles of wine; or 2 x 6 packs of beer and 1 x 750 ml bottle of liquor).

(3) Commanders may further restrict the possession limits as mission requirements dictate.

(4) Soldiers under 21 years of age will not possess or consume alcoholic beverages.

(5) Soldiers will comply with all local and federal laws on the purchase, transportation, storage, and consumption of alcohol.

(6) Soldiers authorized to possess alcohol will not buy, dispense, or serve alcohol to persons under 21 years of age. Possession or use of alcohol by persons under 21 years of age will be reported to CQs/SDs.

(7) Kegs of any size, containing alcohol are prohibited.

g. Soldiers are prohibited from traveling outside a 250 mile radius of the Soldier's place of duty without an approved mileage pass.


h. Soldiers will not knowingly breathe or inhale any chemical, product, or substance with the intent to induce a condition of intoxication, and altered state of mind, or an unnatural feeling of euphoria, including designer drugs. Additionally, Soldiers will not possess, sell, deliver, transfer, or give to another, any compounds, liquids, chemicals, or substance if the purpose for which they are possessed, sold, delivered, transferred, or given away, is to inhale or ingest with the intent to induce a condition of intoxication. Examples of products containing these chemicals substances include, but are not limited to, hair spray, compressed air cans, other aerosol spray products, white-out correction fluid, model glue, "Superglue," and "Break-Free" (CLP). When used for their intended purpose these products are not prohibited by this policy. This section does not apply to any person using an inhalant or any chemical substance pursuant to the prescribed medical treatment.

i. Soldiers will not possess or have under their control military ammunition, including blank ammunition, pyrotechnics, grenades (including smoke), percussion type weapons, or other explosives of any type except of any type when authorized by the unit commander to perform military duties.

j. No personnel on the installation may use profane, obscene, or otherwise offensive language in public areas that family members patronize. Use of such language includes written language on vehicles, signs, tattoos, and clothing. For the purposes of this provision public areas includes, but is not limited to, areas identified as "No Profanity Zones".

k. No Personnel on the installation may wear inappropriate clothing while in public areas. Inappropriate clothing includes dress that contributes to a disruptive environment to include clothing with offensive language or images, clothing that is unsafe or unhealthy, or immodest clothing that excessively reveals body parts. For purposes of this provision, public areas include all areas outside of private residences and yards, barracks rooms, and locker rooms. Noting in this policy letter effects the dress standards established by the Collective Bargaining Agreements currently in existence.
