MEMORANDUM FOR All U.S. Army Garrison (USAG) Italy Units and Supported Units SUBJECT: USAG Italy Hazardous Material Management Program (HMMP) Policy

## 1. References:

- 2. Purpose. USAG Italy's policy is to manage hazardous materials (HM) and/or hazardous Waste (HW) in an environmentally acceptable manner to enhance mission readiness, reduce and prevent pollution by controlling and reducing the acquisition, use, handling, and disposition of HM and generation of HW. The USAG Italy HMMP supports supply chain integration concepts and Army sustainability objectives. Integration of mission and environmental practices and requirements will result in a sound HMMP.
- 3. USAG Italy envisions continual improvement of its ability to sustain the mission and protect the environment. This will be accomplished by:
- a. Identifying, integrating and documenting garrison operations, processes and products that have environmental impacts.
  - b. Establishing centralized management and visibility of HM and HW.
- c. Establishing a HMMP committee to plan for, oversee the HMMP, and recommend policy and procedural changes.
- d. Establishing an authorized HM user List (AUL) to document the identification, and procurement of HM used on the garrison.
- e. Using Enterprise Environmental Safety and Occupational Health Management Information System (EESOH-MIS) to manage and track HMMP operations.
  - f. Tracking of HM and chemical constituents from acquisition to final disposition.
- g. Conducting periodic audits to assess compliance and identify opportunities to enhance the mission.

SUBJECT: USAG Italy Hazardous Material Management Program (HMMP) Policy

- 4. USAG Italy activities, tenants, and personnel are required to comply with this policy and associated HM/HW laws and regulations. Failure to do so can lead to civil and criminal penalties not only against the US Government but also against individuals stationed at USAG Italy.
