

Commissary Shopping Eligibility



The Department of Defense expanded commissary shopping privileges in the U.S. effective 1 January 2020 as part of the Purple Heart and Disabled Veterans Equal Access Act of 2018, included in the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019. This expansion adds to the existing authorized shopper list here.

Access was expanded to include:

- · Veterans with any service-connected disability
- · Purple Heart recipients
- · Former Prisoners of war, and
- Individuals approved and designated as the primary family caregivers of eligible Veterans under the Department of Veterans Affairs
 Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers

Richland One to Provide Free Meals to Children June 3-July 18

Again this summer, Richland One will provide free meals to any child age 18 or younger, regardless of their school district attendance zone, through the federally-funded Seamless Summer Option.

From June 3 - July 18, meals will be available for children Monday through Thursday at 29 school sites throughout the district. Breakfast will be served from 7:45-9 a.m., and lunch will be available from 11 a.m. -12:30 p.m. All meals must be eaten on site.

Five days' worth of meals for students will be available for parents/guardians to pick up on June 10, June 17 and July 29. Ten days' worth of meals will be available for pick-up on June 24, June 27 and July 11. All meal pick-ups will take place from 9 a.m. – 11 a.m. in the bus loops at the following locations:

- •four years old by September 1 to attend pre-kindergarten or Sure Start
- •five years old by September 1 to enroll in kindergarten
















New Driving Under the Influence (DUI) Law in **South Carolina**

Effective 19 May 2024 – First time offenders convicted of a DUI will be required to participate in the Ignition Interlock Device (I.I.D.) Program regardless of Blood Alcohol Content (BAC). Previously, it was optional for first offenders convicted of a DUI below a BAC of .15.



Motorcycle Safety - Statistics

- Southern states have four times the number of motorcycle fatalities as northern states
- ❖ Highest fatality rates occur during summer months, on weekends between the hours of 1800-2100 hours
- ❖ In 2021, there were 167 motorcycle fatalities in South Carolina, 112 of them were not wearing a helmet
- ❖ Alcohol was involved in 36% of those motorcycle fatalities

- Wear DOT approved helmet and proper PPE
- ❖Be alcohol and drug free
- ❖ Ride Checks
- Motorist awareness







Summer Safety - Tips



- Swimming
 - Never swim alone
 - Keep watchful eye of children
 - Children and inexperienced swimmers should wear a life jacket



- Check the weather prior to going out
- Wear US Coast Guard approved life jackets
- Do not drink alcohol while operating a boat





- Only use grills outdoors
- Keep grills at least 10ft away from your home
- Keep children and pets at least 3 ft away from grill area

Fireworks

- Only use fireworks outdoors
- Never ignite a firework while holding it
