MEMORANDUM FOR Residents of Fort Jackson Family Homes Privatized Housing

SUBJECT: United States Army Garrison Policy Memorandum #33 - Flag Display

- 1. Purpose: To provide greater clarity to the community on the Fort Jackson Garrison policy regarding flying flags at individual family housing residences.
- 2. Applicability: Fort Jackson Family Homes (FJFH) residents.
- 3. Policy:
 - a. The display of flags and/or pennants is restricted to the following criteria:
- (1) Flags displayed will reflect the Army Values, patriotism, camaraderie, and unity. Authorized flags for display include the United States (U.S.) flag; flags of U.S. Sates, Territories, and the District of Columbia; Military Service flags; General Officer flags; the Prisoners of War/Missing in Action (POW/MIA) flag; flags of allied or partner nations displayed for official protocol or ceremonial purposes; flags of organizations in which the U.S. is a member (e.g., NATO); and ceremonial, command, unit, branch, or guidon flags. Flags bearing official symbols of professional or collegiate sports teams are also authorized for display when appropriate.
- (2) Political or socially divisive flags are not allowed to be displayed on Fort Jackson or anywhere within the Fort Jackson Family Homes community.
 - (3) Proper flag etiquette must be observed.
 - (4) Limit of two (2) flags displayed on the premises.
 - (5) Flag size cannot exceed three feet by five feet (3' x 5').
- (6) Flagpole holders may be mounted on front entry wood trim or columns, NOT on any exterior siding or building fascia. FJFH maintenance may consult with family housing residents on the proper installation of flagpole holders.
- b. Any deviation from the above may require the resident to move the flag(s) or flag holder equipment. Residents should consult with the FJFH community management office or the Army Housing Office if they are unsure whether a flag or flag equipment meet the above criteria.
