





SUBJECT: Historical Tuition Assistance Requests (TARs) for IPPS-A Interface Issues No Longer Valid

1. Purpose. The purpose of this message is to update guidance to the field on HTAR criteria.

2. Change. IPPS-A Interface will no longer be a valid HTAR category for courses with 01 FEB 25 start dates and beyond. During the implementation phase of IPPS-A interface with ArmylgnitED, there was a special population of Soldiers whose data sets failed to integrate correctly. This resulted in an inability to view Soldier personnel data. This issue prevented Soldiers from requesting funding and HTARs were permitted for this population. The interface issue was resolved in July 2024, and ArmylgnitED now interfaces properly with all IPPS-A records.

3. Context. ACCESS must have an authoritative data source to verify eligibility, lines of accounting, and ADSO/RDSO. This data source is IPPS-A. If a Soldier's IPPS-A record is not up to date, it may create a blocker to eligibility in ArmylanitED. This is not an interface issue, but rather a data accuracy issue. It is the Soldier's responsibility to ensure their IPPS-A records are current and accurate prior to requesting funding. If a Soldier's record is not correct and has a blocker in ArmylanitED due to incorrect IPPS-A records, they will be unable to request funding until the corrections have been made to IPPS-A.

4. Actions and Facts. Instructions were provided to Soldiers on how to update their IPPS-A records to resolve blockers in August 2024 and this information has been socialized across all components. The enrollment period for classes is 60-7 days prior to the term start date, allowing sufficient time for Soldiers to update their IPPS-A records and still request funding for courses.

5. What to tell Soldiers. HTARs will still be considered in situations where errors are committed by Academic Institutions, the ArmylgnitED system or Army Education Counselors. Army Education Counselors should continue to provide guidance to Soldiers on the importance of updating their IPPS-A records to remove blockers in ArmylgnitED related to personnel data.

6. Next Steps. ACCESS will reject HTARs received with course start dates on or after 01 FEB 25, that do not meet one of the following criteria: ArmylgnitED system error, Academic Institution errors not related to Soldier errors and Army Education Counselor errors.

Keep Your Cool While Riding

- With all the possible mishap causes when riding, it is easy to overlook the danger of becoming dehydrated. Here are some tips to help you ride safely.
- Drink plenty of water before and during your ride
- Consider wearing a hydration system that will allow you to sip water as you ride.
- Instead, wear riding clothing designed to both cover and keep you cool.
- Schedule rest stops so you can get out of the heat and into air-conditioning.
- Ride during the cooler parts of the day, such as the early morning or late afternoon.







Distracted Driving

- At any given daylight moment, there are 660,000 drivers in the United States using their cellphones or manipulating electronic devices while driving
- Here are a few suggestions to help with this:
 - Have someone else answer the phone.
 - Enable the do not disturb function on your GPS.
 - Pull over to a safe zone if you must take the call.
- There are so many factors already working against you when you drive, such as road conditions, weather and other drivers.







Pedestrians' vs Crosswalks

- Since FY19, at least 27 personnel died in pedestrian mishaps, averaging five fatalities per year.
- Here are some safety tips for when you're traveling on foot:
 - Always walk on the sidewalk.
 - Dress to be noticed by motorists.
 - Reflective clothing is best but never assume drivers can or have seen you.
 - Cross streets only at marked crosswalks or intersections.
 - Look both ways.
 - Give drivers ample time to stop before entering the crosswalk.








Water Safety

- Drowning is one of the leading causes of unintentional deaths in the United States. It's estimated that 10 people die each day as a result of drowning. Sadly, a large portion of those victims are would-be rescuers.
- There are a few rules everyone should remember when swimming or boating.
- First, never swim alone.
 - Nobody plans to drown, and it only takes seconds.
 - A drowning person doesn't make a lot of noise.
- Second, know your limits.
 - It only takes enough water to cover a person's nose and mouth for them to drown. Many times, we try to be cool and exceed our capabilities.
- The most important thing any of us can remember is to wear a personal flotation device (PFD).
- Choosing not to wear one should never be an option.







Water Safety

Before attempting to rescue someone, always keep in mind Reach, Throw, Row and Don't Go.

Reach. If someone near you is drowning, first try reaching out to him or her with something near you such as a pool toy, branch, fishing pole or anything sturdy.

Throw. If the person is too far out to reach, throw something to them. Make sure you throw something that floats (e.g., an ice chest, life preserver, throw cushion, ring buoy, etc.).

Row. If reaching and throwing are not feasible and you have access to a boat, you can row to the victim.

Don't Go. Unless you are a trained professional in water rescue (e.g., a trained lifeguard), never go in after a victim.

McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019. This expansion adds to the existing authorized shopper list here.

Follow these easy steps to verify Commissary eligibility before you shop:

1. Examine your Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC), it must show either:

- Service connected
- Medal of Honor
- · Purple Heart recipient status
- Former prisoner of war (POW)

NOTE: Ensure that the expiration date is current

2. Update if Necessary: If any condition is not met, contact VA Healthcare at 877-222-8387 to request an updated card.

3. Check Local Requirements: Verify entry requirements with your local installation.
