Shipments to Korea and Italy

Permanent Change of Stationing Soldiers and Families on orders to or from a country with a Centers for Disease Control warning level category 3 for COVID-19 (Korea and Italy) will stop movement and delay travel until May 6 or further notice, according to an Army message. Department of Defense customers who are or were expected to make PCS to Korea or Italy and previously arranged to have their household goods, unaccompanied baggage and privately owned vehicle shipments and official travel tickets issued by JBM-HH are requested to contact the JBM-HH Transportation Office.

Fort McNair clinic closed, Rader Clinic access guidance

Due to the expansion of precautions across our community surrounding the COVID-19 development, Andrew Rader U.S. Army Health Clinic will begin to limit visitor access and increase screening protocols. Fort McNair Clinic is closed temporarily and will be centralizing all patient care at Rader Clinic for the JBM-HH and McNair beneficiaries

We ask that visitors without an appointment or need for other medical services, such as lab/pharmacy/radiology/immunizations, avoid entering Andrew Rader and Fort McNair clinics.

Additionally, we will be enhancing our screening protocols before patients enter the building. This could cause a slight delay as you arrive. Though the screening process for most will take less than a minute, we encourage patients to arrive 10 minutes earlier than normal

Old Post Chapel Gate closed for construction

The Old Post Chapel Gate on the Fort Myer side of JBM-HH is closed until spring. During this time all funerals are moved to Memorial Chapel and will use Memorial Gate to access Arlington National Cemetery. There is no access, including pedestrian or personnel, to the cemetery via JBM-HH. All visitors to the cemetery must enter through the ANC Visitor's Center.

McNair road extension roving lane closure

There will be a roving temporary lane closure on the McNair road extension from Marshall Drive to Biddle Lane to complete the ANC fence project on the Fort Myer portion of the joint base. Temporary lane closures will occur Mondays through Friday up to March 27, from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Travel lanes will be open and unobstructed on nights and weekends. The pedestrian path will remain open. Temporary lane closures will be approximately 400 feet long or less to ensure traffic control visibility and vehicular safety. Temporary lane closures will begin near Marshall Drive and move toward Biddle Lane and the Old Post Chapel.

Metro announces reduced service

Metro and its Pandemic Task Force has further escalated its response to Phase 3 of its Pandemic Flu Plan. Phase 3 is the highest level of response and will include all subsequent mitigation steps required during the public health emergency. Metro expects to be at Phase 3 until further notice. Phase 4 is the “recovery phase” of the plan that involves Metro’s return to normal operations after the situation is under control.

To help protect employees and customers, and recognizing that many of Metro’s frontline employees are faced with tough choices as they balance work with their family priorities, including caring for children who are home from area schools, Metro has reduced service beginning Monday, March 16, as follows:

METRORAIL

- Monday-Friday: Trains will operate every 12 minutes on each line throughout the day
- The rail system will maintain normal hours, opening at 5 a.m. and closing at 11:30 p.m.
- Saturday: Trains will operate every 12 minutes on each line, with service from 7 a.m. until 1 a.m. (normal Saturday service).
- Sunday: Trains will operate every 15 minutes on each line, with service from 8 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. (normal Sunday service).

METROBUS

- On weekdays, bus service will operate on a Saturday schedule. Weekend bus schedules are unchanged.

IF YOU ARE NOT FEELING WELL, DO NOT TAKE PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION. Call your healthcare provider before you leave your home and follow their guidance.

The service reduction also allows for additional disinfecting of railcars and buses, including the use of electrostatic fogging on a weekly basis across Metro’s fleet of 1,200 railcars and 1,500 buses. The electrostatic process addresses inaccessible surfaces in the vehicle, such as air ducts and compartments.

Due to the service adjustment, please note that Metro’s Rush Hour Promise has been suspended until further notice (i.e. until regular service levels are restored).

MetroAccess service will continue to operate during the same hours as rail and bus services. Metro continues to emphasize that customers must not use MetroAccess to travel to health care appointments if they are showing signs of illness for the safety of our employees and other passengers. If you are ill, call your health care provider and make transportation arrangements that do not involve public transportation. In addition, the MetroAccess Eligibility Center is closed until further notice.

Metro will continue to be guided by the advice of public health authorities and its Pandemic Flu Plan, which was activated 44 days ago at the first signs of a potential pandemic. The early activation allowed Metro to convene its Pandemic Task Force and take immediate action to stockpile critical items, such as hand sanitizer, masks, gloves, and hospital-grade disinfectant. The task force is led by Metro’s chief safety officer, with support from Metro’s chief medical officer and key senior officials from across the authority.

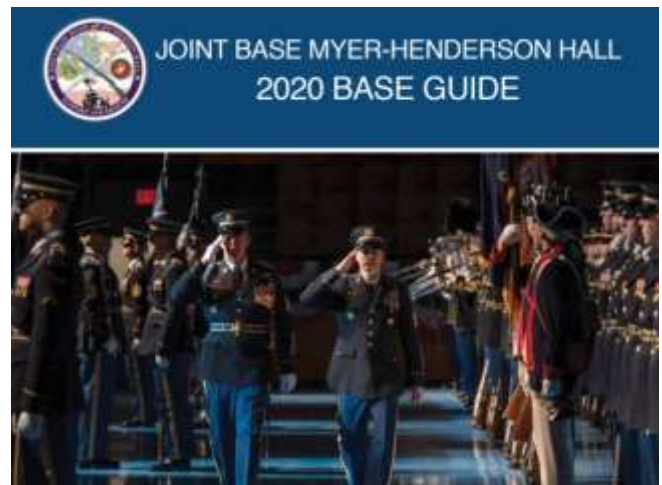
Tax Center Voicemail/Facebook
