If your Hazardous Material (HM) container is empty (as defined above) you may either recycle or dispose of the container at your location depending on the material of the container. Metal containers that are empty may be collected and taken to the QRP on Frazier Road. Plastics and paint cans that are empty may be disposed of in the brown dumpster. The only items that should be coming to the free issue/turn in connex are items that are more than ¼ full of usable product that are within 2 years of their expiration date, latex paints that may be poured into our collection drum and \*all\* aerosol products. Please use your HM's for their intended purposes until they are empty. A container that is not empty, less than ¼ full and cannot be used by another activity on post may be deemed a waste and your activity could be charged for disposal fees as a result.

## Single Use Face Mask Disposal

- NEVER throw masks on the ground, throw them away in the closest garbage can.
- When disposing your single use face mask, please cut the ear loops like you would cut up the plastic can holders for your beverages. (Please do that as well)
- If you are not near scissors, simply pull the ear loops free before properly disposing of them.
- And always, sanitize your hands after touching your mask!
