

# **QUARTERLY AWARDS 2.24**

As the Natural Resources Branch chief, Brandenburg has fostered an average retention length of 11 years in his office. #### MONTHLY SPOTLIGHT

The Fort Knox Security office manages security for installation personnel, information and industrial programs and support to the command and staff. Three personnel oversee OpSec, CAC applications for contractors, and official foreign visits to Garrison as well as assisting mission partners. The team facilitates background investigations for assigned personnel and security screenings for new employees; they also provide fingerprinting services to Garrison and select installation partners. The team's efforts ensure eligibility standards are established, validated and maintained to safeguard sensitive and classified information, systems and equipment. During a recent higher headquarters inspection, the office received a 100% rating in all areas.



FEBRUARY



Nine personnel make up the Fort Knox Staff Judge Advocate's Claims and Administrative Law offices, which include two from U.S. Army Cadet Command. Five personnel from Claims adjudicate tort claims filed against the Army from accidents in Michigan, Indiana, Ohio and most of Kentucky. The team also asserts affirmative medical claims whenever an Army Tricare beneficiary in its jurisdiction is injured from negligence. The Affirmative Claims Program routinely recovers over \$1 million each year for medical treatment facilities and the U.S. Treasury. Four Administrative and Civil Law attorneys provide general counsel or city attorney support for employment, contract, environmental, business, municipal and many other ethics issues.

The eight-member ID Card/DEERS Branch enrolls eligible customers and provides Common Access Cards to Soldiers, retirees, civilian and contract employees and families: world-class service to over 2,000 customers each month. The team performs all functions and related tasks required to issue and maintain government ID cards, including PIN resets and certificate and email updates. The team also reviews, researches and verifies source documentation to ensure 100% eligibility of benefits prior to the issuance of any government ID. They also prepare personal agent authorization letters for eligible customers to receive services at the Exchange and Commissary.
