Welcome to the "Reaper" Detachment

It is our sincere pleasure to welcome you and your family to the 34th and 905th Military Police Detachments. The 34th Military Police Detachment has a proud history of service to this Nation. It received the Philippine Presidential Unit Citation and later was awarded the Luzon Campaign Streamer for its heroic efforts during 1944 thru 1945 in the Asiatic Pacific Theater, World War II. The unit was officially designed in August of 1944 as the 34th Military Police Criminal Investigation Section and was activated at Fort Custer, Michigan. The Section served with the Luzon Campaign in the Philippines during World War II and remained in the Philippines until it was inactivated in May of 1947. In April 1948 the unit was reactivated at Fort Knox, Kentucky and in 1951 it was officially allotted into the Regular Army. In 1954 the unit went through a reorganization and was re-designated again as the 34th Military Police Detachment and remained in service on Fort Knox until 1965 when it was inactivated. The Detachment was reconstituted and reactivated on Fort Knox in 2001 and belonged to 1st Old Ironsides Armor Division until 2010 and now falls under United States Army Cadet Command and has been serving the community diligently for the last 19 years.

The 905th Military Working Dog Detachment (MWD) was constituted in 2014 at Fort Knox. In the brief few years of it existence the Detachment has distinguished itself through a continuous rotation of professional MWD handlers into the CENTCOM area of operation to include Syria, Iraq, Afghanistan, Kuwait and others.

When our Soldiers are not performing law enforcement operations we expect them to be outstanding members of the community. As Military Police we are the definition of professionalism and the Fort Knox community depends on us to not only assist, protect and defend but also to be role models for the thousands of children on this installation. It is imperative that you arrive here in top physical condition so you are prepared for the challenging demands of our unique role. Due to the nature of our mission paramount that we train and exercise in order to ensure our readiness and ability to meet a variety of challenges.

At Fort Knox, the 34th and the 905th Military Police Detachments provide Garrison Law Enforcement and Force Protection to the Fort Knox community. The 34th and 905th Military Police Detachments stand to support the Fort Knox community and will respond utilizing all assets including our Military Police Investigation's Section, Traffic Section and the 905th Military Working Dogs.
