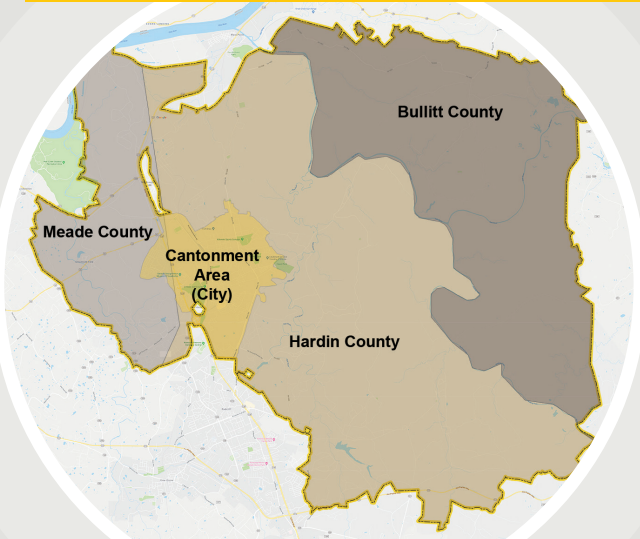

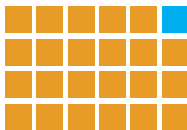
FORT KNOX AT A GLANCE

Fort Knox, named after **General Henry Knox**, was established in 1918 and was originally known as “Camp Knox.”



The **United States Bullion Depository**, built in 1936, is located adjacent to Fort Knox.



Fort Knox welcomes upwards of **25,000 people** through its gates daily.

Fort Knox annually hosts **8,900 Army ROTC Cadets** and **5,500 supporting cadre** during Cadet Summer Training, the Army’s single-largest training event.

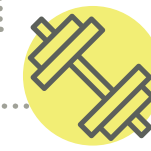


U.S. Army Dining Facilities on Fort Knox serve more than **600,000 meals** to Soldiers every year.
