## SEPARATION DUE TO PERSONALITY DISORDER CHAPTER 5-13, AR 635-200

# *Note:* This handout only provides basic information and is not intended to serve as a substitute for personal consultation with an attorney.

#### **BASIS FOR THIS CHAPTER.**

Under the guidance of Chapter I, Section II, you can be separated for a personality disorder (which does not amount to disability) that interferes with assignment or your duty performance. A description of conditions can be found in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual (DSM-IV) of Mental Disorders, 4th Edition. The provisions of this chapter are that:

- 1. The condition shows a deeply ingrained maladaptive pattern of behavior of long duration;
- 2. The maladaptive behavior interferes with your ability to perform duty;
- 3. A diagnosis was made by a psychiatrist or doctoral-level clinical psychologist with necessary and appropriate professional credentials who is permitted to conduct mental health evaluations for Department of Defense (DOD) components.
- 4. The diagnosis concludes that the disorder is so severe that your ability to function effectively in the military environment is significantly impaired.
- 5. You have been formally counseled concerning deficiencies and have been afforded ample opportunity to overcome those deficiencies as reflected in appropriate counseling or personnel records.

#### WHAT MUST THE COMMAND DO?

Once it is determined that separation under this paragraph is warranted, the Commander will take actions specified in the Notification Procedures, Chapter 2, AR 635-200. Commanders may not use this chapter solely to spare a soldier who may have committed serious acts of misconduct for which harsher penalties may be imposed under the UCMJ.

#### TYPE OF DISCHARGE.

Honorable. If you are in an entry-level status, your service will be listed as 'uncharacterized'.
