## Message from the Garrison Commander

Hello, retirees and Family members!

We have had a dynamic year thus far at Fort Knox. From the onset, we have been engaged in supporting Fort Knoxbased U.S. Army Recruiting Command as the entire recruiting enterprise undergoes transformational change. There are still some decision points in terms of overall structure, but USAREC is being elevated to a three-star command and

its footprint on the installation stands to expand as a result. We anticipate this work will continue in earnest for at least the next two years.

In May, we officially reopened our largest range – Yano Range – after it underwent 5-year overhaul to become one of just three Digital Air-Ground Integration Ranges in the continental United States. Formerly



## Message from Ireland Army Health Clinic Commander

Dear Heroes,

I have enjoyed a busy and rewarding first year of command at Ireland Army Health Clinic. The opportunity for our entire team to serve the community and provide outstanding healthcare services is a great privilege. Much has changed in the last year, and I'd like to start by welcoming our newest members of the Ireland Army Health Clinic command team. CSM Bradford Webster joined our team from Public Health Command, Pacific and replaced CSM Manuel Cruz as our new Command Sergeant Major. LTC Holly Archer arrived from SHAPE/ NATO in Belgium and is now on board as our new Deputy Commander for Nursing Services, replacing LTC Alex Martinez Suarez. We look forward to the wealth of knowledge and experience our new leadership brings to the team.



Since our transition to the new Electronic Health Record, MHS GENESIS in the summer of 2023, we have continued to refine our processes to improve and simplify your healthcare experience. For pharmacy services, we continue to encourage use of electronic prescriptions for all medications, including DEA Schedule II-V controlled substances. Handwritten prescriptions are no longer needed from off-post prescribers, and electronically transmitted prescriptions are the preferred method of delivery to help our pharmacy maximize both the safety and efficiency of our services. As a reminder, transferring prescriptions between military pharmacies using MHS GENESIS is no longer necessary. If you are traveling or move to a location close to another military installation, active prescriptions with remaining refills can be processed at any military pharmacy using MHS GENESIS.

While our team continues to gain familiarity and proficiency with the new system, we have also incorporated a few changes to allow greater flexibility and reduce your time spent waiting in the pharmacy lobby. Remote check-in is now available for new or renewed prescriptions sent to us electronically. You can activate new or renewed prescriptions with a simple text message from your phone. Just scan the QR Code included below or text "Get in line" to (833) 488-1684 to get started. If you prefer to speak to a pharmacy staff member, renewed or new prescriptions may also be activated by calling the Binter Street Pharmacy at (502) 624-9222.

For prescription refill requests, we have also added a new feature for online requests using the MHS GENESIS Patient Portal (<u>https://my.mhsgenesis.health.mil</u>). For active prescriptions with remaining refills, you can take advantage of this much simpler process by logging on to the Patient Portal and selecting the prescriptions you want refilled at our pharmacy. We continue to offer text message notifications when prescriptions are ready for pickup; if you are not receiving notifications and would like to, please ask one of our pharmacy team members for assistance. Prescription refills may still be requested using the automated AudioCare call-in system, which can be found on our prescription labels.

Rest assured; our free services are still available. Retirees can access lab and radiology services at Ireland Army Health Clinic on a space-available basis. Binter Street Pharmacy also remains open for retirees. Lastly, we are in the final stages of funding and approval for a new MRI service that we expect to arrive at Fort Knox in the near future. We are excited for this upcoming change and look forward to communicating with you as we begin the journey of establishing this new service for our beneficiaries.

As usual, vendors from the local area will have tables. If you have been to a RAD before, this year should look the same.



We are here to assist you with DFAS issues/concerns, such as allotments or beneficiary information. We can assist with understanding the difference between Combat Related Special Compensation and Concurrent Receipt. We are here to assist your Family members apply for their Survivor Benefits. In other words, your Retirement Services Office is here to assist you in all phases of retirement
