U.S. Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll honored veterans of the U.S. armed forces in a community ceremony Nov. 11, at the Island Memorial Chapel.

Special guests in attendance included Gold Star Family Member Mike Sam; keynote speaker and U.S. Ambassador to the Republic of the Marshall Islands Roxanne Cabral; U.S. Embassy Majuro Deputy Chief of Mission Jeremiah Knight; RMI Liaison to USAG-KA Lanny Kabua, distinguished visitors and members of U.S. Naval Mobile Construction Battalion 5, Detail Marshall Islands.

In her address to the garrison community, Cabral recounted the history of Veterans Day and its significance as an occasion to honor the ultimate sacrifice of members of the armed services.

Veterans and active-duty personnel were invited to stand as the Kwajalein Jr./Sr. High School Band played the service song for each branch of service.



U.S. ENTRY REQUIREMENT FOR UNVACCINATED TRAVELERS

Attention unvaccinated residents and TDY personnel departing Kwajalein via United Airlines. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention now require unvaccinated passengers to have a negative Covid-19 test one day prior to departure.

If you are traveling to the U.S., you must visit the Kwajalein Hospital during regular business hours the week before your departure to pay for your Covid-19 test and to schedule your weekend swab. The hospital is open 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

E-FORMS FOR GUAM

The Guam Customs and Quarantine Agency form has transitioned to an Electronic Declaration Form. All passengers and crew arriving and processing into the Guam International Airport Main Terminal will fill out the EDF on their mobile devices or desktop computers, 72 hours prior to their arrival into Guam.

United encourages everyone to take advantage of the 3-day eligibility window prior to boarding for a completely touchless entry process with Guam Customs accessible online at <https://traveller.guamedf.landing.cards> (mobile) and <https://guamedf.landing.cards> (PC).

The EDF kiosks are accessible in Guam airport baggage claim area for convenience.

Flight Requirements

- No COVID-19 test is required if flying on the ATI or United Airlines if you are flying on official government orders. All other UA passengers must have a negative COVID-19 test one to three days before traveling. This is a requirement of the Centers for Disease Control to enter the United States.
- Call the Kwajalein Hospital to schedule your test at 5-2223. The cost for the test is \$125. Passengers must bring a copy of their UA flight itinerary at the time of appointment as proof of flight.
- All passengers tested are required to pick up results at 4 p.m. on the day of testing.







MAILING RESTRICTIONS ON E-CIGARETTES, SIMILAR DEVICES

The United States Postal Service has posted its final ruling on part 47 of Publication 52, Hazardous, Restricted and Perishable Mail. The rule implements new restrictions on mailing Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems, or ENDS, including their liquids, parts, components and accessories.

ENDS devices include any device that delivers a substance—not just nicotine—via an aerosolized solution to users inhaling from the device. These include electronic cigarettes, e-hookahs or vape pens.

All such items are prohibited in inbound and outbound international mail effective immediately. This includes mail to and from overseas military and diplomatic addresses. For more information, visit the USPS Postal Pro online at <https://postalpro.usps.com/node/10267>

RUSSIAN MISSILE TEST CREATES SIGNIFICANT SPACE DEBRIS

PETERSON SPACE FORCE BASE, Colo.— Russia tested a direct-ascent anti-satellite (DA-ASAT) missile on Nov. 15, 2021, Moscow Standard Time, that struck a Russian satellite [COSMOS 1408] and created a debris field in low-Earth orbit. The test so far has generated more than 1,500 pieces of trackable orbital debris and will likely generate hundreds of thousands of pieces of smaller orbital debris.

"Russia has demonstrated a deliberate disregard for the security, safety, stability, and long-term sustainability of the space domain for all nations," said U.S. Army Gen. James Dickinson, U.S. Space Command commander. "The debris created by Russia's DA-ASAT will continue to pose a threat to activities in outer space for years to come, putting satellites and space missions at risk, as well as forcing more collision avoidance maneuvers. Space activities underpin our way of life and this kind of behavior is simply irresponsible."

USSPACECOM's initial assessment is that the debris will remain in orbit for years and potentially for decades, posing a significant risk to the crew on the International Space Station and other human space-flight activities, as well as multiple countries' satellites.

USSPACECOM continues to monitor the trajectory of the debris and will work to ensure all space-faring nations have the information necessary to safeguard their on-orbit activities if impacted by the debris cloud, a service the United States provides to the world, to include Russia and China.

"Russia is developing and deploying capabilities to actively deny access to and use of space by the United States and its allies and partners," Dickinson added. "Russia's tests of direct-ascent anti-satellite weapons clearly demonstrate that Russia continues to pursue counterspace weapon systems that undermine strategic stability and pose a threat to all nations."

THE THREE R'S OF UXO

PUBLIC SAFETY ANNOUNCEMENT

Unexploded ordnance should be treated like dangerous sea creatures: Look, but do not touch. You can play an important role in keeping Kwajalein safe by knowing what to do when you spot unexploded ordnance.

Remember the three R's of UXO:

- **Recognize** an item as possible unexploded ordnance;
- **Retreat** from the area of the UXO; and
- **Report** suspected UXO immediately.

If you discover an object that could be UXO, notify Kwajalein Explosive Ordnance Disposal immediately by calling 5-1433. You can also call CPS at 5-4445. Provide the following information about what you found:

- **Location.** Note helpful details like the building number, GPS coordinates and any prominent landmarks
- **Size of the UXO** as compared to common items like a football or scuba air cylinder

For a detailed refresher on UXO safety, attend the new island orientation or call Kwajalein EOD at 5-1433.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The subtropical high to the north remains the dominant weather feature Friday across Kwajalein Atoll.

The subtropical high will weaken tomorrow allowing for the Intertropical Convergence Zone to be back in our area. This will lead to widespread rain and potential thunderstorm development into early next week. Gale force wind gusts are possible in the vicinity of heavier showers.

The subtropical high further west will strengthen some as it pushes westward and that will lead the ITCZ to push further south by the middle of next week. A return to trade wind showers will continue through the end of next week under the influence of the subtropical ridge.

Winds will drop from the upper teens today to the low-

mid teens Saturday and Sunday with upper teens later in the week.


SATURDAY AND SUNDAY:

Mostly cloudy with scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms possible. Winds ENE-E at 11-16 knots with occasional higher gusts.

MONDAY: Partly sunny with isolated showers. Winds E-ESE at 8-13 knots with higher gusts near showers.

TUESDAY: Mostly to partly sunny with isolated showers and winds ENE-E at 12-17 knots with higher gusts near showers. Some showers may contain blustery conditions.

NEXT WEEK: ITCZ activity will remain south of Kwajalein Atoll while trade wind showers is expected to impact the Kwajalein Atoll. East-Northeasterly-Easterly trade winds will remain elevated for the remainder of the workweek especially from mid-week into the end of the upcoming week.

The shoulder sleeve insignia of the 7th Infantry Division consists of two black, equilateral triangles placed vertically on a red circular disc giving it an hourglass shape. The hourglass of the insignia was consequently used in the title of the island newspaper, The Kwajalein Hourglass.
