What are Household Hazardous Wastes?

A typical home contains dozens of products that can harm human health or the environment during their use and disposal. They are products used in cleaning, home improvement, automobile maintenance, lawn and garden care, hobbies, and many other tasks. Each year, thousands of people are injured by exposure or accidents involving hazardous household materials.

- Hazardous materials are any product that are considered toxic, ignitable, reactive, or corrosive. Product labels may include these terms: caustic, danger, poison, volatile, flammable, warning and caution.

Household chemicals enter our land, water and air during use or improper disposal.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS INCLUDE:

- Pesticides, Herbicides, Propane, Aerosols, Fertilizers, Paints, Thinners, Solvents, Motor Oil, Antifreeze, Gasoline, Batteries (all types), Light Bulbs and most common Household Cleaners

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

- Unlabeled products
- Leaking containers
- Medication & Sharps
- Ammunition
- Explosives or Radioactive Materials
- Items with Military markings or NSN¹

Important things to keep in mind for your safety and ours:

Try to keep products in their original containers, bring liquids such as motor oil in a sealed plastic container, transport products in a cardboard box or thick plastic bag & ensure products will not spill during transportation.

If you do not currently reside on Joint Base Lewis-McChord, below are other options of disposing your Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) properly in your local area.

Most city/county household hazardous waste services are free for residents of their County.
