JBLM has reclaimed 100 tons of illegally dumped junk annually since 2020

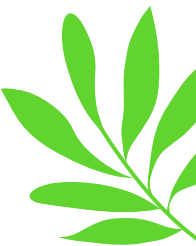

RECYCLING



Your bottles, jugs, tubs, and buckets are all recyclable, but the caps are not. **Remove these first!**

Clean paper, boxes, bags, and cardboard should be recycled



Aluminum and metal cans are recyclable, and create funds for JBLM to stay green



GARBAGE



Styrofoam, aluminum foil/plates, all cartons and plastic packaging belong in the garbage

Single use items like paper plates, napkins, and cups must be put in the garbage



Greasy pizza boxes, all lids, and prescription bottles must go in the garbage

DROP-OFF

ONLY AUTHORIZED USERS CAN DROP OFF ON JBLM



Plastic bags and wraps can be dropped off at select locations

Glass cannot be recycled, only dropped off for pickup



Household hazards (batteries, cleaning solutions, aerosol cans, lightbulbs, etc.,) can be dropped off
