



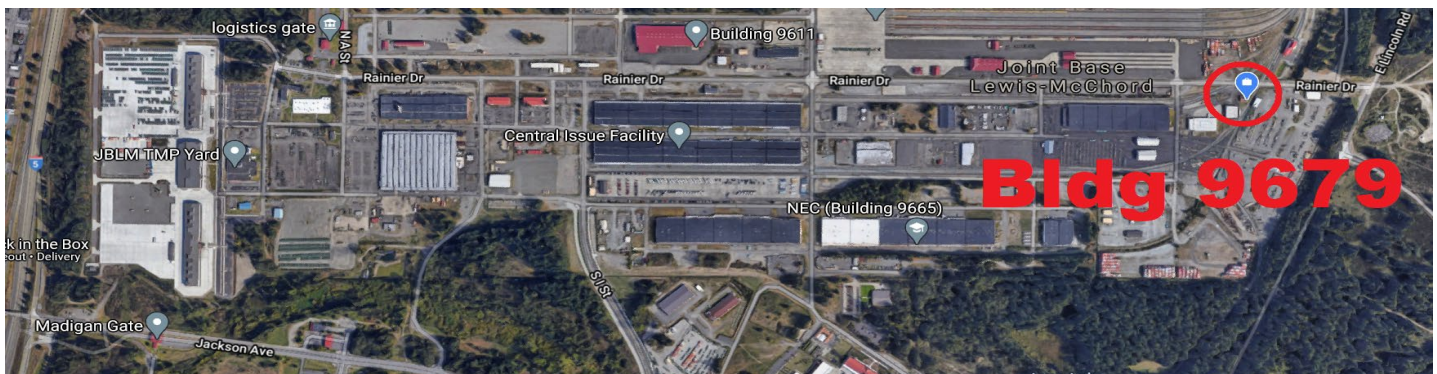

What are Household Hazardous Wastes?

A typical home contains dozens of products that can harm human health or the environment during their use and disposal. They are products used in cleaning, home improvement, automobile maintenance, lawn and garden care, hobbies, and many other tasks. Each year, thousands of people are injured by exposure or accidents involving household hazardous materials. Household chemicals enter our land, water, and air during use or improper disposal.

Hazardous materials are any product that are considered toxic, ignitable, reactive, or corrosive. Product labels may include these terms: caustic, danger, poison, volatile, flammable, warning and caution.

EXAMPLES OF ACCEPTABLE ITEMS ARE:

Pesticides, Herbicides, Propane, Aerosols, Fertilizers, Paints, Thinners, Solvents, Motor Oil, Antifreeze, Gasoline, Batteries (all types), Light Bulbs and most common Household Cleaners.






ITEMS THAT ARE UNACCEPTABLE:

- Unlabeled products
- Leaking containers
- Medication
- Ammunition
- Explosives or Radioactive Materials
- Items with Military markings or NSN

Important things to keep in mind for your safety and ours:

Try to keep products in their original containers, bring liquids such as motor oil in a sealed plastic container, transport products in a cardboard box or thick plastic bag & ensure products will not spill during transportation

If you do not currently reside on JBLM, below are other options to dispose your Household Hazardous Waste (HHW).

<p>WHERE: Hidden Valley, 17925 Meridian Street East Puyallup, Wash 98375</p> <p>WHEN: Tuesday and Thursday: 8 a.m. – 12 p.m.; and 1 p.m. – 5 p.m.</p> <p>DIRECTIONS: <u>From I-5</u> Take the Puyallup exit, Highway 512. Follow 512 to the Canyon Road exit. Turn right south from the off-ramp onto Canyon Road. Follow south to 176th Street (approximately 3 miles). Turn left (east) onto 176th. Follow to Meridian (SR 161) and turn right (Fred Meyer will be on your left). <p>WHERE: Tacoma Landfill, 3510 S. Mullen St., Tacoma, Wash 98409</p> <p>WHEN: Open daily from 8 a.m - 6 p.m.</p> <p>DIRECTIONS: <u>From I-5</u> Take exit 132 and merge onto SR-16. Take exit 1C (Fircrest/Center Street). At the traffic light, go straight onto South Mullen Street and follow the road until you reach the landfill.</p> <p><u>From Orchard Street</u> Turn onto South Center Street going east.
